## FINAL ORDER

By Decision No. 86727 dated December 7, 1976, Flo-Del, Inc. was authorized to deviate from the minimum rates in connection with the transportation of packages and parcels weighing 100 pounds or less between points within a radius of 100 miles of San Francisco. Ordering Paragraph 3 of the decision stated that the matter would be set for public hearing. Because final determination could not be accomplished before the authority would expire, Decision No. 88284, dated December 20, 1978 extended the authority. Applicant now requests that the authority be further extended to February 29, 1980. There have been no protests to this request. Our Transportation Division has no objection to the extension. It is noted that the temporary authority has now expired. The order which follows will, therefore, be made effective on the date it is issued, and the authority will be reinstated and extended to February 29, 1980.

We find that the requested reinstatement and extension of the rate deviation is justified and conclude that it should be granted.

1. The authority granted to Flo-Del, Inc., by Decision No.86727 and extended by Decision No. 88284, is reinstated and shall expire February 29, 1980, unless sooner canceled, modified, or extended by order of the Commission.

3. In all other respects Decision No. 86727, as modified by Decision No. 88284, shall remain in full force and effect.
