SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER


On March 4, 1980, Decision No. 91419 was issued in these proceedings. The decision granted the request of General Telephone Company of California (General) to stay Ordering Paragraph No. 7 of Decision No. 90919 pending General's appeal of that decision to the California Supreme Court. It has come to the Commission's attention that, through inadvertence, the stay ordered by Decision No. 91419 was not restricted to General. Decision No. 91419 should therefore be modified to include that limitation.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the ordering paragraph of Decision No. 91419 is hereby modified to read:


"Ordering Paragraph No. 7 of Decision No. 90919 is stayed as to General until further order of the Commission."

The effective date of this order is the date hereof.


