O P I N I O N

The applicant proposes to provide home-to-work service between San Bernardino, ~~on the one hand~~ and the Marine Corps Base at Barstow, ~~on the other hand~~. SS

The applicant proposes to charge a fare of \$3.50 per round trip for the proposed service.

The need for home-to-work commute buses is both self-evident and increasing. The public convenience and necessity requires encouragement to and the expeditious certification of persons offering that service. In accord therewith, public convenience and necessity requires expeditious authorization in this matter. SS

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A Certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to Earnest Chapman, an individual, authorizing him to operate as a passenger stage corporation as defined in Section 226 of the Public Utilities Code, between the points and over the routes set forth in Appendix A of this decision. SS

2. In providing service pursuant to the authority granted by this order, applicant shall comply with the following service regulations. Failure to do so may result in a cancellation of the authority.

- (a) Within thirty days after the effective date of this order, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate granted. Applicant is placed on notice that if it accepts the certificate it will be required, among other things, to comply with the safety rules administered by the California Highway Patrol, the rules and other regulations of the Commission's General Order No. 98-Series and the insurance requirements of the Commission's General Order No. 101-Series.
- (b) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date of this order, applicant shall establish the authorized service and file tariffs and timetables, in triplicate, in the Commission's office.
- (c) The tariff and timetable filings shall be made effective not earlier than ten days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff and timetable filing shall be concurrent with the establishment of the authorized service.
- (d) The tariff and timetable filings made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs and timetables set forth in the Commission's General Orders Nos. 79-Series and 98-Series.
- (e) Applicant shall maintain his accounting records on a calendar year basis in conformance with the applicable Uniform Systems of Accounts or Chart of Accounts as prescribed or adopted by this Commission and shall file with the Commission, on or before March 31 of each year, an annual report of his operations in such form, content, and number of copies as the Commission, from time to time, shall prescribe.

(f) Applicant shall deposit with the Commission a \$500.00 performance bond within thirty days after the effective date of this order. The disposition of the bond will be determined by further order of the Commission.

3. The authority granted by this order shall remain in effect for a period of one year from the effective date of this order or until modified by further order of this Commission.

4. Applicant is placed on notice that if he accepts this expedited interim authorization that he waives his rights to invoke the protective provisions of Section 1032 of the Public Utilities Code as related to applications of other parties for similar authority for the period this authorization is in effect.

5. The fares in this application are authorized.
The effective date of this order is the date hereof.

AS A PASSENGER STAGE CORPORATION

Issued by expedited application procedure under authority of Decision No. APR 15 1980, dated 91597 of the Public Utilities Commission of State of California, in Application No. 59521.

SECTION 1. GENERAL AUTHORIZATIONS, RESTRICTIONS, LIMITATIONS,
AND SPECIFICATIONS.

Earnest Chapman, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to operate as a passenger stage corporation between the City of San Bernardino, on the one hand, and the Marine Corps Base located in Barstow, on the other hand, over and along the most direct or reasonable route or routes subject, however, to the authority of this Commission to change or modify such routes at any time and subject to the following provisions:

- (a) Motor vehicles may be turned at termini and intermediate points, in either direction, at intersections of streets or by operating around a block contiguous to such intersections, in accordance with local traffic regulations.
- (b) All service herein authorized shall be limited to the transportation of (1) military personnel and/or their dependents, and (2) civilian employees assigned to the Marine Corps Base at Barstow. SS
- (c) Passengers shall be picked up and discharged only at four pickup points to be named in applicant's tariffs and timetables filed with the Commission.
- (d) Carrier shall identify all terminals served in timetables on file with the Commission.
- (e) This authority expires one year from the effective date of this decision.
