## OPINION

Interfreight Corporation (Interfreight), a corporation, and Mine Inuck Iines, Inc. (Mine), a corporation, request tinat a portion of Interfreight's highway comon carrier intrastate certificate be transferred to Milne. In Decision No. 90609 detec July 31, 1979, we authorized Mine to lease the subject portion of Interfreight's intrastate certificate on an interim basis pending the outcome of proceedings before the Interstate Comerce Comission (ICC) pursuant to Section 11343 (formerly section 5) of the Interstate Comerce Act in which Nilne seeks to acquire the interstate operating rights coextensive with the subject intrastate operating rights. Notice of the proposed transaction was published. in Caltrux (the official publication of the California Tracking Association) and in the Eederal Register. No protests to tine application have been received.

In Decision No. 90609 the Comission stated es follows:
"Decision in Application Nio. 58885 should be withhelo until such Eime as the Interstate Commerce Commission has finally acted on Interfreight's reauest for approval so pemanently Etansfer the subject operating authorities."

By supplemental filing under cover letter dated March 28, 1980 Milne and Interfreighe filed with the Comission a copy of the ICC decision dated February 21, 1980 in No. MC-F-14001 F (Mine Truck Lines, Inc.--Purchase (Portion) - Interfreight Corporation) and MC-4460S (Sub-No. 55 F) (Mine Truck Ines, Inc., Conversion of Cervificate of Registration) in which the ICC approved the conversion and transfer of the interstate operating authority concomitant to the intrastate operating authority sought herein to be transfexred. Ordering Paragraph 1 of the ICC decision provides, among other things, "that Milne Truck Lines, Inc., shall, prior to or concurrently with, consumation of the transaction, fumish the Comission a certified copy of the Califomia intrastate certificate..." The ICC decision lapses May 20, 1980.

The facts surrounding the transaction are zecited in Decision No. 90609 , and we adopt them in this opinion. Findinas of Face

1. The transfer of the portion of Interferight's incrastate motor comon carrier cerzificate to Miane as reouested in the application is not adverse to the public intercs.
2. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment.
Conclusions of Law
3. The application should be approved.
4. A public hearing, is not necessayy.
5. The effective date of the following order should be the date on which it is simed because of the deadine of vay 20 , 1980 for consumation of the transaction set by the ICC.

The order which follows will provide for, in the event the transfer is completed, the revocation of the certificate presently held by Interfreight and the issuance of certificates in appendix fom to Interfreizht and MiIne.

Milne is placed on notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate fixing for any amount of money in excess of that originaily paid to the State as the consideration for the grant of such rights. Aside from their purely permissive aspect, such rights extend to the holder a full or partial monopoly of a class of business. This monopoly feature may be modified or canceled at any time by the State, which is not in any respect limited as to the number of rights which may be given.
ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Interfreight Corpozation may sell and transfer the operative rights referred to in the application to Milne Truck Iines, Inc. This authorization shall expire if not exercised by September 5, 1980, or within such additional time as may be authorized by the Comission.
2. Within thirty days after the transfer applicants shall file with the Comission written acceptance of the certificates and the purchaser shall file with the Commission a true copy of the bill of sale or other instrument of transfer.
3. Applicants shall amend or reissue the taxiffs on file with the Comission, naming rates and rules governing the authority granted by this decision to show that they have adopted or established, as their own, the rates and riles. The tariff filings shall be made effective not earliex than five days after the effective date of this order on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public, and the effective date of the eariff filings shall be concurrent with the transfer. The tariff filings shall comply with the Comission's General Order No. 80 -Series. Failure to comply with the provisions of General Order No. 80-Series may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.
4. In the event the rransfer authorized in Paragraph 1 is completed, effective concurrently with the effective date of the tariff filings required by Paragraph 3 certificates of public convenience and necessity are granted to Interfreight Corporation as set out in Appendix A, and to Minne Truck Iines, Inc., as set out in Appendix E .
5. The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by Decision No. 90609 and Decision No. 90866 is revoked effective concurrently witi the effective aate of the tariff Eilings required by Paragraph 3.
6. Applicants are placed on notice that if they accept the certificates they will be required, among other things, to comply with the safety mies administered by the California Highway $P$ RErol anc the insurance zequirements of the Comission's Generai orcer do. 100-Series.
7. Appijisants shaii maintein their accounting =ccoras on a calendar ycar basis in confomance with the opplicahle Öifonir System of mecounts or Chaze of Accounts as peescrioeo or adopzec by this Comission anc shall filc riti tic tomission, on or before April 30 of each year, an annual report of their operations in such form, content, and numer of copies as the comission, from time to time, shall nrescrihe.
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8. Applicants shall comply with the requirements of the Compassion's General Order No. 84-Series for the transportation of collect on delivery shipments. If applicants elect not to transport collect on delivery shipments, they shall make the appropriate tariff filings as required by the General order. The effective date of this order is the date hereof. Dated $\qquad$ MAY . 61980


Interfxeight Corporation, by the certificate of pubic convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to conduct operations as a highway common carrier as defined in Section 213 of the public Utilities Code for the transportation of general commodities as follows:
