ORDER DENYING
STAY OF DECISION
No. 91495

Petitions for rehearing of Decision No. 91495 have been filed by a number of parties to these proceedings including the Cities of Los Angeles and San Diego and the City and County of San Francisco (Cities), Telephone Users' League (TUL), Part Locator, Inc. (PLI), Sonitrol Telephone Assistance (STA), Toward Utility Rate Normalization (TURN) and the Western Burglar and Fire Alarm Association (WBFAA). WBFAA also requests a stay of the authorized rate increases pertaining to the alarm industry pending a determination on the merits of its petition for rehearing. STA supports that request. The other named petitioners have requested a stay of the entire decision.

We shall consider the allegations of error in all the petitions filed and make our determination on the merits by a separate order. However we shall deal with the petitions for stay at this time.

We are of the opinion that good cause for granting a stay has not been shown.

Therefore:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that,

The petitions of the Cities, TUL, PLI, STA, TURN, and WBFAA for a stay or partial stay of Decision No. 91495 are denied.
