ORDER EXTENDING TIME

Russian River Water Company, Inc., as successor to James J. Downey, doing business as Rio Dell Water Company and Russian River Terrace Water Company, requests an order of the Commission extending the time within which to comply with the provisions of Ordering Paragraph 3 of Decision No. 87611, dated July 19, 1977, which reads as follows:

"On or before November 30, 1980, James J. Downey, doing business as Rio Dell Water Company (1) shall replace the $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch and $1\frac{1}{4}$ -inch distribution mains serving the twenty-four residences in Rio Dell Court with a 6-inch dead end or a 4-inch looping distribution main in accordance with the requirements of General Order No. 103 and under the provisions of Rule No. 15, Main Extensions of the Tariff Schedules of Rio Dell Water Company on file with this Commission, and (2) shall install fire hydrants at such locations along such newly constructed distribution mains as may be ordered by and paid for by the Forestville Fire Protection District or others than Rio Dell Water Company."

Petitioner alleges that: (1) it intended to install a new main in Rio Dell Court in accordance with Decision No. 87611 with funds obtained from a proposed loan under the California Safe Drinking Water Bond Act, that being the only source of money available to petitioners; (2) it has been unable to borrow funds from conventional financial institutions and sources because of its relatively small size and capital, and inadequate earnings; (3) it does not generate sufficient funds internally to finance such main; (4) petitioner's Application No. 59322 is now pending before the Commission for approval of such California Safe Drinking Water Bond Act loan; (5) petitioner has been endeavoring to obtain, upon reasonable terms, a long-term lease or title to a small parcel of

real property adjacent to Rio Dell Court upon which it currently has a producing well and proposes to install a new well; and (6) unless petitioner obtains this small parcel of real property, petitioner has been advised it will not qualify for a California Safe Drinking Water Bond Act loan.

Petitioner requests that the time within which to comply with the provisions of Ordering Paragraph 3 of Decision No. 87611 be extended to November 30, 1983.

The petition for extension of time was served by mail upon all parties to the consolidated proceedings. No protests have been received.

The Commission concludes, based upon the foregoing facts, that an extension of time should be granted; therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that the time within which to comply with the provisions of Ordering Paragraph 3 of Decision No. 87611 is hereby extended to November 30, 1983.

The effective date of this order shall be thirty days after the date hereof.
