ORDER STAYING DECISION NO. 91548

On April 15, 1980, the Commission issued Decision No. 91548. Two timely petitions for rehearing were filed, which the Commission is in the process of reviewing. The petition filed by the Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) had the effect of automatically staying Decision No. 91548; however, by statute, that stay expired July 4, 1980. The Commission is still considering both PG&E's petition and one filed subsequently by General Motors Corporation, and expects to act on those petitions in the very near future. We will therefore with this order renew the stay of Decision No. 91548 pending the outcome of our review of the petitions for rehearing.

IT IS ORDERED that Decision No. 91548 is hereby stayed until further order of the Commission.
