ORDER OF DISMISSAL

Educational and Recreational Services, Inc., doing business as Associated Bus Lines whose principal place of business is Encino, California, has requested passenger stage corporation authority to operate scheduled passenger service between various shopping centers in the San Fernando Valley and Dodger Stadium in Los Angeles whenever Dodger baseball games are scheduled to be played.

The proposed service consists of operations between five shopping centers in the San Fernando Valley on the one hand and Dodger Stadium on the other hand, and return. The points of service and the routes to Dodger Stadium lie within the city limits of the City of Los Angeles.

Section 226 of the <u>Public Utilities Code</u> states in <u>SS</u> part that a passenger stage corporation includes every corporation engaged as a common carrier "<u>environter those</u>, 98 percent or more of whose operations as measured by total route mileage operated, are exclusively within the limits of a single city...".

Therefore, the Commission finds that Application 59553 should be dismissed for lack of jurisdiction.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

Application 59553 of Educational and Recreational Services, Inc. be dismissed.
