Application No. 59612 (Filed April 21, 1980)

OPINION

The applicant presently has authority from this Commission as a passenger stage corporation (PSC-918) to conduct sightseeing and special events-oriented passenger stage services between various points in Southern California as set forth in Appendix A of Decision No. 85561.

By this application, applicant requests authority to extend its passenger stage operations by conducting tours between Orange County and the San Jose and San Francisco areas and certain points within the State of California.

The applicant alleges that there is no existing sightseeing service between Orange County and the points in Northern California that it proposes to serve. The applicant further alleges that the proposed transportation services are different and distinct from any public transportation system currently being offered in the proposed areas. Applicant's service will be operated with a stewardess or steward escort on each bus who will provide the passengers with beverages, snacks, reading material, pillows end-

and blankets. The tours will be narrated as to sights and points of interest along the routes. These passenger stage service will be operated with new model MC-9 motorcoaches, equipped with reclining seats, air conditioning and a public address system. Applicant's financial statement reveals assets of \$1,600,000 and its equipment list includes several motorcoaches with additional units scheduled for delivery in June, 1980.

Notice of this application was listed in the Commission's Daily Calendar of April 24, 1980, and applicant served copies thereof on Greyhound Lines, Inc., California Parlor Car Tours, Inc., and Trailways, Inc. A letter of protest dated May 1, 1980 was filed by California Parlor Car Tours, Inc. ("Parlor Car"). Parlor Car operates as a passenger stage corporation pursuant to Commission Certificate PSC-520. Pursuant to this authority, Parlor Car offers several variations of individual fare sightseeing tours in California, including service between Los Angeles and San Francisco. However, Parlor Car does not hold authority to operate any Northern California service to or from Crange County. Orange County is a territory with well over one million inhabitants and these persons should not be deprived of a new and interesting transportation service as proposed by the applicant herein, nor should their receipt of said service be delayed by virtue of the Commission's hearing process when none is required (Fursuant to Section 1032 of the Public Utilities Code, the Commission must hold a hearing only when a protestant-carrier holds authority to serve the same territory as that proposed by the applicant). Finally, we note that Orange County includes several major tourist attractions (egg Disneyland, Knotts Berry Farm, and Lion Country Safari) and that these facilities attract many additional people to Orange County who may wish to patronize a high-quality passenger stage tour as proposed berein.

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The Commission's Transportation Division recommends that the application be granted as provided in the ensuing Order.

FINDINGS

Upon consideration of the evidence, the Commission finds as follows:

- 1. Applicant seeks authority to operate as a passenger stage corporation providing service between points in Orange County and points in the San Francisco-San Jose area.
- 2. There is no other transportation company presently offering this type of passenger service to and from points in the Orange County territory.
- 3. Applicant has expertise and financial resources to institute and maintain the proposed service.
 - 4. The proposed fares appear to be justified.
 - 5. The Commission staff supports the application.
- 6. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment.
 - 7. A public hearing is not necessary.
- 8. Applicant has demonstrated that public convenience and necessity require granting of the application.

<u>CONCLUSIONS</u>

It is concluded that the sought authority should be granted. Since the summer travel season has already begun and the public will benefit from immediate institution of the service, the following order should be effective the date of signature.

Applicant is placed on notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate-fixing for any amount of money in excess of that originally paid to the State as the consideration for the granting of such rights. Aside from their purely permissive aspect, such rights extend to the holder a full or partial monopoly of a class of business. This monopoly feature may be modified or canceled at any time by the State, which is not in any respect limited as to the number of rights which may be given.

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ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. A Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity is granted to The Town Tour FunBus Company, Inc., a corporation, authorizing it to extend operations as a passenger stage corporation, as defined in Section 226 of the Public Utilities Code, between certain points as named in the amended Appendix A, as attached.
- 2. Appendix A of Decision 85561, is amended by incorporating Second Revised Pages 1 and 2 attached hereto, in revision of First Revised Pages 1 and 2, respectively, and Original Pages 2-A, 2-B, 2-C, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10.
- 3. In providing service pursuant to the authority granted by this order, applicant shall comply with the following service regulations. Failure to do so may result in a cancellation of the authority.

- (a) Within thirty days after the effective date of this order, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate granted. Applicant is placed on notice that if it accepts the certificate it will be required, among other things, to comply with the safety rules administered by the California Highway Patrol, the rules and other regulations of the Commission's General Order 98-Series, and the insurance requirements of the Commission's General Order 101-Series.
- (b) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date of this order, applicant shall establish the authorized service and file tariffs and timetables, triplicate, in the Commission's office.

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- (c) The tariff and timetable filings shall be made effective not earlier than ten days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff and timetable filings shall be concurrent with the establishment of the authorized service.
 - (d) The tariff and timetable filings made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs and timetables set forth in the Commission's General Orders 79-Series and 98-Series.
 - (e) Applicant shall maintain its accounting records on a calendar-year basis in conformance with the applicable Uniform System of Accounts or Chart of Accounts as prescribed or adopted by this Commission and shall file with the Commission, on or before March 31, of each year, an annual report of his operation in such, form, content, and number of copies as the Commission, from time to time, shall prescribe.

The effective date of this order is the date hereof.

SECTION 1. GENERAL AUTHORIZATIONS, RESTRICTIONS, LIMITATIONS AND SPECIFICATIONS.

The Town Tour Funbus Company, Inc., by the certificate of
Public Convenience and Necessity granted by the decision noted in the margin,
is authorized to transport passengers between points within the County of Orange,
and certain territories intermediate and adjacent thereto, and between points in
Orange County, on the one hand, *and the points hereinafter described on the
other hand, over and along the routes hereinafter described, subject, however, to
the authority of this Commission to change or modify said routes at any time
and subject to the following provisions:

- (a) Motor vehicles may be turned at termini and intermediate points, in either direction, at intersections of streets or by operating around a block contiguous to such intersections, in accordance with local traffic regulations.
- (b) When route descriptions are given in one direction, they apply to operation in either direction, unless otherwise indicated.
- (c) Service on Routes Nos. I and 2 shall be available in coordination with events at the Los Alamitos Race Track, Hollywood Park Race Track, The Forum, Los Angeles Coliseum and Sports Arena, and Los Angeles Dodger Stadium.
- (d) Service on Route No. 2, shall be available in coordination with events at the Convention Center.
- (e) Service on Route No. 3, Stadium-East Katella Avenue, is available for regularly scheduled night, day, or special event baseball games of the California Angels at the Anaheim Stadium.
- (1) Service on Route No. 4, Anaheim-Buena Park, shall be operated seven days per week except Christmas.
