ORDER OF DISMISSAL

By this application Greyhound Lines, Inc. (Greyhound) sought authority to reduce the frequency of service between Calistoga and Napa. A public hearing was held before Administrative Law Judge Frank J. O'Leary in Napa on November 4, 1979. At the commencement of the hearing, the Greyhound representative explained that the primary reason for filing the application was the competitive service proposed by Napa County. The Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) and Napa County advised the Administrative Law Judge that the presently proposed Napa County transit plan is not feasible because of funding problems and will have to be modified prior to implementation. As a result of this

advice, no evidence was received and the matter was continued to a date to be set pending notification to the Commission by MTC and/or Napa County of a modified plan.

The Commission staff advises that Greyhound and the local public officials have now reached an agreement which will assure the continuation of the Greyhound service, at least for the foreseeable future. Further, Greyhound has advised that it would not object to dismissal of the application without prejudice.

IT IS ORDERED that Application No. 59047 is dismissed without prejudice.
