BEFORE THE FUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Application of the CITY OF MOUNTAIN VIEW, a body corporate and politic, for authority to construct a pedestrian/bicycle overcrossing of the Southern Pacific railroad tracks (including a column within the railroad right-of-way) approximately 100 feet east of Mayfield Avenue. The crossing will connect the Mayfield Mall Shopping Center and Old Mill Specialty Center, located in the City of Mountain View.

Application No. 60016 (Filed October 21, 1980)

The City of Mountain Veiw requests authority to construct the San Antonio Pedéstrian/Bicycle Overcrossing at separated grades over the tracks of Southern Pacific Transportation Company's Coast Route Main Line in the City of Mountain View, Santa Clara County, as part of the project to provide pedestrians and bicyclists with a safer means of travel between three major shopping areas.

The City of Mountain View is the lead agency for this project pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act of 1970 (CEQA), as amended, Public Resources Code, Section 21000 et seq. After preparation and review of an Initial Study, the City of Mountain View issued a Negative Declaration and approved the project. On October 28, 1980, a Notice of Determination was filed with the Santa Clara County Clerk which found that "the project will not have a significant effect on the environment."

The Commission is a responsible agency for this project under CEQA and has independently evaluated and assessed the lead agency's Initial Study and Negative Declaration. The site of the proposed project has been inspected by the Commission staff.

The San Antonio Pedestrian/Bicycle Overcrossing project is located approximately 100 feet east of Mayfield Avenue in the City of Mountain View. The project involves construction of a reinforced concrete overcrossing of the Central Expressway, Showers Drive, and Southern Pacific's tracks between the Mayfield Mall Shopping Center and the Old Mill Specialty Center. The project area is a mixed use area consisting of a fully developed commercial shopping center surrounded by residential tracts.

Notice of the application was published in the Commission's Daily Calendar of October 28, 1980. No protests have been received. A public hearing is not necessary.

Findings of Fact

1. Applicant requests authority pursuant to Sections 1201-1205 of the Public Utilities Code to construct the San Antonio Pedestrian/Bicycle Overcrossing at separated grades over the tracks of Southern Pacific Transportation Company's Coast Route Main Line in the City of Mountain View, Santa Clara County.

2. The proposed overcrossing is required to improve the safety of bicycle and pedestrian traffic by removing it from the surface traffic pattern.

3. Public convenience and necessity require construction of the proposed overcrossing.

4. Applicant is the lead agency for this project pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act of 1970, as amended.

5. The Commission is a responsible agency for this project and has independently evaluated and assessed the lead agency's Initial Study and Negative Declaration.

6. The project will have no significant impact on the environment.

Conclusion of Law

The application should be granted as set forth in the following order.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The City of Mountain View is authorized to construct the San Antonio Pedestrian/Bicycle Overcrossing at separated grades over the tracks of Southern Pacific Transportation Company's Coast Route Main Line in the City of Mountain View, Santa Clara County, at the location and substantially as shown by the plans attached to the application, to be identified as Crossing No. E-34.2-AD.

2. Clearances shall be in accordance with General Order 26-D. Walkways shall conform to General Order 118.

3. Construction and maintenance costs shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties relative thereto, and a copy of the agreement, together with plans of the crossing approved by Southern Pacific Transportation Company, shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencing construction. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the costs of construction and maintenance by further order.

4. Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing.

This authorization shall expire if not exercised within three years unless time be extended or if the above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be thirty days after the date hereof.
