ORDER OF DISMISSAL

Applicant, Monte Vista Christian School, Incorporated, doing business as Monte Vista Christian School, seeks authority to operate as a Class "B" charter-party carrier of passengers from its headquarters in Watsonville, California 95076. It has 30 years of experience in transporting students by motor vehicle over the public highways. It proposes to provide such service with a 12-passenger 1968 Checker station wagon. In the future it contemplates purchasing additional equipment. Applicant's home terminal is located at 2 School Way, Watsonville, California 95076.

Notice of filing of the application appeared in the Commission's Daily Calendar dated June 25, 1980.

Applicant is requesting this authority so that it can transport students, staff, and Board of Regents members of Monte Vista Christian School to school-related activities throughout the State of California. It states that it will not be offering its services to the general public.

The Articles of Incorporation dated June 17, 1937 filed with the application states that applicant is a nonprofit organization.

Findings of Fact

1. Applicant will not serve the general public.
2. Applicant will transport only students, staff and members of the Board of Regents of the school.
3. Applicant is a nonprofit organization.

Conclusions of Law

1. Applicant's proposed service is proprietary in nature.
2. Applicant will carry passengers only on a noncommercial enterprise basis.
3. Applicant does not require our authority for its proposed operations.
4. Application No. 59755 should be dismissed.

IT IS ORDERED that Application No. 59755 is dismissed.
The effective date of this order shall be thirty days
after the date hereof.
