In the matter of the application of Columbus S. Henry, Jr., doing business as CSH Trucking, for a dump truck carrier permit to operate in Los Angeles (File No. 372.70).

<u>OPINION</u>

Columbus S. Henry, Jr., an individual doing business as CSH Trucking, requests the issuance of a dump truck carrier permit. Heretofore, he operated as a subhauler for dump truck carriers. He holds highway contract carrier permit T-126605. Copies of the application were served upon known interested shipper and carrier organizations. Notice of the filing of the application appeared on the Commission's Daily Calendar of January 13, 1981. No protests to the application has been received.

Applicant's place of business is 1234 South Orange Grove, Los Angeles, California 90019. For the past four years he has operated a 10-wheel dump truck and a truck tractor and hopper bottom semitrailer. He proposes to haul property as a dump truck carrier in Los Angeles and Ventura counties. As of December 23, 1980 his balance sheet shows total assets of \$85,411 and net worth of \$15,031. A projected profit and loss statement for the 90-day period ending December 23, 1980 shows revenues of \$16,313 and net profit of \$9,031. The application is supported by the California Department of Transportation and by the Los Angeles County Flood Control District.

Findings of Fact

- 1. Applicant is a fit and proper person to receive a permit as a dump truck carrier and possesses sufficient operating knowledge and financial ability to perform the proposed operation.
- 2. Applicant's equipment will not endanger the safety of highways or impair the condition or maintenance of them either directly or indirectly.
- 3. Applicant's proposed operation will not unnecessarily burden the public highways, is necessary to serve the public, and will not impair the ability of presently permitted dump truck carriers to provide adequate service at the lowest possible reasonable rates.
- 4. Applicant has resided in the State of California for not less than 90 days immediately preceding the filing of this application.
- 5. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment.
- 6. The following order complies with the Commission's Energy Efficiency Plan.

Conclusion of Law

The Commission concludes that applicant should be granted a dump truck permit authorizing operation within and between all points in Los Angeles and Ventura counties. The effective date of this order should be the date of signature in order that applicant may provide needed services as a dump truck carrier as soon as possible.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that the Executive Director shall issue a dump truck carrier permit to Columbus S. Henry, Jr., doing business as CSH Trucking, authorizing operations within and between all points in Los Angeles and Ventura counties.

The effective date of this order is the date hereof.
