## QPINION

Gerald A. Sears (Sears), Cba Bakersfield Airport Express, requests a certificate of public convenience and mecessity to transport passengers between Bakersfield (Gilton Inn) and Los Angeles International Airport (IAX) with an intermediate stop at Saugus (Magic Mountain).

Artacked to the application as exibibits axe the proposed schedules, routes, fares, and proforma financial statement. Sears proposes to utilize 15 and 25 passenger vans and provide seven roumd trips per day on a six day per week basis. He proposes the following fares:

Sears states that be bas the financial ability to provide the proposed service. He provided the staff with a letter from Coumupity First Bank stating that the bank will financially support Sear's passenger stage operations.

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Sears alleges that the granting of the requested authority would have no significant adverse effect upon the enviroment of the areas to be served and that the availability of this service would be a benefit to the environment and to the public by a resultant reduction of private vehicles on the roads. Sears further alleges that pablic convenience and necessity require the granting of this application because the services offered are different and distinct from any public transportation system currently being offered to the public in the proposed areas. There is no comparable alternate method of traveling from the points listed to IAX with regularity iand convenience at the proposed fares.

The Transportation Division has reviewed the application and recommends that in the absence of protests the application be granted by ex parte order.

Copies of the application were served on Greyhound Iines, Inc., Antelope Valley Bus Line, Counties of Kern, Ventura and Los Angeles, Cities of BakersfieId and Los Angeles, and IAX among others. There are no protests and public hearing is not necessary. Since the public will benefit from imediate institution of the proposed service, the order should be effective the date of sfgnature. Finding of Fact

1. Sears has the ability to provide the proposed passenger stage service.
2. The proposed fares are justified.
3. There is a public need for this passenger stage service.
4. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment.
5. A public hearing is not necessary.

## Conclusion of Law

The application sborld be granted as set forth in ensuing order

Only the amount paid to the State for operative rights may be used in rate fixing. The State may grant any number of rights and may cancel or modify the monopoly feature of these rights at any time.

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IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenfence and necessity is granted to Gerald A. Sears, authorizing bim to operate as a passenger stage corporation, as defined in PU Code Section 226, between the points and over the routes set forth in Appendix $A$, to transport persons and baggage.
2. Applicant shall:
a. File a written acceptance of this certificate within 30 days after this order is effective.
b. Establish the anthorized service and file tariffs and timetables within 120 days after this ordex is effective.
c. State in bis tariffs and timetables when service will start; allow at least 10 days' notice to the Commission; and make timetables and tariffs effective 10 or more days after this order is effective.
d. Comply with Genexal Orders Series $79,98,101$, and 104 , and the Cailfornfa Highway Patrol safety rules.
e. Maintain accounting records in conformity with the Uniform System of Accounts.

SECIION 1. GENERAI AUIHORIZATIONS, RESTRICTIONS, LIMITATIONS, AND SPECIFICATIONS.

Gerald A. Sears, dba, Bakersfield Airport Express, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by the decision noted in the margin, is authorized as a passenger stage corporation to transport passengers, and their baggage only between Bakersfield, Saugus, and Los Angeles International Airport (IAX), with stops over and along the routes hereinafter described, subject, however to the authority of this Comaission to change or modify said routes at any time and subject to the following provisions:
(a) Motor vehicles may be twned at termininand intermediate points, in either direction.
(b) When route descriptions are given in one direction, they apply to operation in either direction anless otherwise indicated.
(c) Passengers should be boarded or disembarked at the authorized service points, only, as set forth in each route description below.
(d) For operating purposes, carrier may operate buses to skip certain stops on certain schedules, provided that all authorized service points receive adequate service.
(e) Service on Route I shall be Iimited to passengers originating at or destined to Saugus (Magic Mountain) or LAX.
