O P I N I O N

By this application, John T. Reed, Consultant, for and on behalf of Redco Delivery Service (Redco) seeks authority to add hourly charges for a truck, driver, and helper to its Special Delivery Tariff No. 1, Cal. P.U.C. No. 1.

Redco states its service is one of expedited delivery and its rate structure is designed in this premise. In some cases, however, because of special requirements of the shipper, delays or waiting time are desired. In such cases, it is anticipated that the shipper must request the hourly service. This is an optional service when neither the transitional tariffs for regular service nor the expedited service contemplated by Redco Special Delivery Tariff will meet the needs of the shipper.

Redco states that the proposal herein would not increase its intrastate gross revenue by as much as one percent.

The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of March 23, 1981. No objection to the application has been received.

Findings of Fact

1. Increases resulting from this proposal are justified because the new rates reflect costs for special service.
2. The following order has no reasonably foreseeable impact on the energy efficiency of highway carriers.
3. A public hearing is not necessary.

Conclusion of Law

The proposed rates are just and reasonable and the application should be granted as set forth in the ensuing order.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. John T. Reed, Consultant, for and on behalf of Redco Delivery Service is authorized to publish increases in Redco's Special Delivery Tariff No. 1, Cal. P.U.C. No. 1 as specifically proposed in the application.

2. Tariff publications authorized to be made as a result of the order herein shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than five days after the effective date of this order on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

This order becomes effective 30 days from today.
