ORDER OF DISMISSAL

In this petition, California Dump Truck Owners Association (petitioner) seeks amendment of the zone rates for the movement of asphalt in dump trucks set forth in Minimum Rate Tariff 17-A.

Public hearings were held in Los Angeles on November 14 and 15, 1980, at which evidence was presented by petitioner, the C.9819 Pet. 44 ALJ/1q

Commission staff, Huntmix, Inc., and California Asphalt Pavement Association. The hearing, adjourned to February 18, 1981, was temporarily removed from the Calendar at petitioner's request.

On May 7, 1981 the Commission received a letter from petitioner's general manager, stating as follows:

"On April 25, 1981 the California Dump Truck Owners Association held its Board of Directors meeting in Fresno. It was the decision of the Association at that meeting to request the Commission to dismiss the above-captioned Petition 44 without prejudice at this time.

"CDTOA will in the future file a new Petition addressing itself to this issue."

In the circumstances, the petition will be dismissed without prejudice.

IT IS ORDERED that Petition for Modification 44 in Case 9819 is dismissed without prejudice.
