ORDER OF DISMISSAL

By her filing, complainant Gloria J. Silvestre alleges that defendant Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) illegally terminated her gas and electric service as well as incorrectly billed her for such services. Pending resolution of the dispute, complainant deposited \$523.37 with the Commission.

By notice mailed March 13, 1981, a hearing was scheduled in the above-referenced proceeding for April 14, 1981, in Monterey. Service of the notice was not made upon complainant. Apparently, complainant was evicted from the premises which is the subject of the complaint and no longer resides at the address indicated in her complaint.

By ruling dated April 14, 1981, the presiding administrative law judge removed the matter from the calendar and indicated that he would recommend dismissal of Case (C.) 10929 if complainant failed to contact the Commission by May 14, 1981. Nothing has been heard from complainant.

Given our inability to locate complainant, it is appropriate to dismiss C.10929 without prejudice. We will also order the funds

on deposit with the Commission disbursed to PG&E. If complainant does indeed have legitimate grounds for filing an action against PG&E, she may, at her choice, file a new complaint with the Commission.

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. C.10929 is dismissed without prejudice.
- 2. The sum of \$523.37 on deposit with the Commission shall be disbursed to Pacific Gas and Electric Company.
