OPINION

Applicant proposes to provide home-to-work service between Fairfield and Mare Island Naval Shipyard in Vallejo.

Applicant proposes to charge fares of \$12.00 per week for the proposed service.

Home-to-work commuter buses play an important role in providing increased public transportation and helping to relieve the energy shortage. New services, such as proposed in this application, should be encouraged and one way to do so is by expediting their authorization. On the basis of the information furnished in the application, we find that public convenience and necessity require that the proposed service be authorized for a one-year term, subject to certain conditions as set forth in more detail in the following order.

The following order should be effective today since there is a demonstrated public need for applicant's proposed service.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to Raymond W. Morgan, authorizing him to operate as a passenger stage corporation, as defined in Public Utilities (PU) Code Section 226, between the points and over the routes set forth in Revision of Appendix A of Decision 93077 by incorporating Second Revised Page 3 Cancels First Revised Page 3, First Revised Page 5 Cancels Original Page 5 and Original Page 6 attached.
 - 2. Applicant shall:
 - a. File a written acceptance of this certificate within 30 days after this order is effective.
 - b. Establish the authorized service and file tariffs and timetables within 120 days after this order is effective.
 - c. State in his tariffs and timetables when service will start; allow at least 10 days' notice to the Commission; and make timetables and tariffs effective 10 or more days after this order is effective.
 - d. Comply with General Orders Series 79, 98, 101, and 104, and the California Highway Patrol safety rules.
 - e. Maintain accounting records in conformity with the Uniform System of Accounts.
- 3. The authority granted by this order shall remain in effect for a period of one year from the effective date of this order or until modified by further order of this Commission.

- 4. Applicant is placed on notice that if he accepts this expedited authorization he waives his rights to invoke the protective provisions of PU Code Section 1032 as related to applications of other parties for similar authority for the period this authorization is in effect.
 - 5. The fares proposed in this application are authorized.

SECTION 1. GENERAL AUTHORIZATIONS, RESTRICTIONS, LIMITATIONS, AND SPECIFICATIONS.

Raymond W. Morgan, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to transport passengers between *Fairfield, Napa and *Vallejo, on the one hand, and Mare Island Naval Shipyard, on the other hand, over and along the route described, subject, however, to the authority of this Commission to change or modify the routes at any time and subject to the following provisions:

- (a) Motor vehicles may be turned at termini and intermediate points, in either direction, at intersections of streets or by operating around a block contiguous to such intersections, in accordance with local traffic regulations.
- (b) When route descriptions are given in one direction, they apply to operation in either direction unless otherwise indicated.
- (c) All service authorized shall be limited to the transportation of round-trip passengers only.

Route 1: Beginning in the City of Napa at the intersection of First Street and Freeway Drive, thence along First Street to State Highway 29, thence along State Highway 29 to Trancas Street, thence along Trancas Street to State Highway 121 (Silverado Trail), thence along Silverado Trail to State Highway 29, thence along State Highway 29 to the intersection of State Highway 37 in the City of Vallejo, thence along State Highway 37 to North Entrance Drive, thence North Entrance Drive to Mare Island Shipyard.
