ORDER OF REVOCATION

Commission Decision (D.) 91575, dated April 15, 1980, granted a certificate of Public Convenience and necessity to Yosemite Airlines, Inc., doing business as Yosemite Gold Country Stage, to operate as a passenger stage corporation, PSC-1042, as defined in Section 226 of the Public Utilities Code, transporting passengers between Yosemite/Pine Mountain Lake Airport and Yosemite National Park.

Ordering Paragraph 2 of the D.91575 required applicant to comply with the insurance requirements of the Commission's General Order No. 101 Series, and file tariffs and timetables by October 20, 1980. Ordering Paragraph 2 also cautioned applicant that failure to comply with the above requirements may result in a cancellation of the authority.

In a letter dated April 24, 1980, the Transportation Division staff reminded applicant of its obligations regarding compliance with the above requirements.

On December 17, 1980, the staff received a request for voluntary suspension of operating authority until May 1981, because of seasonality of operation and reorganization of business.

Resolution No. PE-392, dated February 18, 1981, authorized applicant to suspend operations until May 1, 1981, as requested.

Ordering Paragraphs 2, 3, and 4 of Resolution PE-392 required applicant to comply with certain regulations regarding tariff and timetable filings. Further, Ordering Paragraph 5 of that Resolution states that "Yosemite Gold Country Stage is placed on notice that commencement of operations under the certificate referred to herein prior to compliance with Ordering Paragraphs 3 and 4 may be cause for further suspension or revocation of operating authority".

By a letter, dated June 12, 1981, the staff reminded applicant that the required tariff and timetable were not filed and that its liability insurance was terminated on April 13, 1981. The letter specifically cautioned applicant that unless it complied with all the filing requirements by June 26, 1981, the staff will recommend to the Commission that its passenger stage authority be revoked.

The applicant has not responded to either letter nor has it filed its tariff, timetable, or insurance as of this date.

The Commission finds, that these matters constitute good cause for the revocation of this certificate and that such revocation would not be adverse to the public interest. The Commission therefore concludes that the certificate should be revoked.
