OPINION

By this application, Doudell Trucking Company seeks authority to cancel its participation in Pacific Coast Tariff Bureau Local Freight Tariff No. 204, Cal. P.U.C. No. 2.

The above-mentioned tariff contains railhead commodity rates between points in California.

Applicant advises that it is not handling traffic covered by this tariff and that there is no reason to believe that there will be any traffic handled under this tariff in the foreseeable future.

Applicant declares that this proposal will not increase its California intrastate gross revenue by as much as 1%.

The proposal is not considered to be a major action significantly affecting energy efficiency within the meaning of Sections 3502.1 and 3502.2 of the Public Utilities Code.

The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of June 29, 1981. No objection to the granting of the application has been received. A public hearing is not necessary. Findings of Fact

- 1. Applicant has not transported in the recent past, nor does it believe that it will transport any in the foreseeable future, any shipments subject to the rates and charges of the tariff proposed to be canceled.
- 2. Increases resulting from the proposal are technical in nature and are justified.
- 3. The following order has no reasonably foreseeable impact on the energy efficiency of highway carriers.
- 4. A public hearing is not necessary. Conclusion of Law

The application should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Doudell Trucking Company is authorized to cancel its participation from Pacific Coast Tariff Bureau Local Freight Tariff 204, Cal. P.U.C. No. 2, as proposed in the application.
- 2. Tariff publications authorized to be made as a result of this order shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than 5 days after the effective date of this order on not less than 5 days' notice to the Commission and to the public.
- 3. The authority granted shall expire unless exercised within 90 days after the effective date of this order.

This order becomes effective 30 days from today.
