O P I N I O N

By this application, Trans-Valley Transport (Trans-Valley) seeks authority to transfer its participation from tariffs issued by Golden State Tariff Bureau, Agent (GSTB), to tariffs published by Pacific Coast Tariff Bureau (PCTB).

Due to inherent differences between tariffs issued by GSTB and tariffs issued by PCTB, increases would result from the transfer. Applicant has determined that it would be in its best interest to transfer from tariffs of GSTB to those of PCTB.

In no event would the increases in gross revenue derived from California intrastate traffic be as much as 1%.

The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of July 6, 1981. No objection to the granting of the application has been received.

Findings of Fact

1. Increases resulting from this proposal are justified.
2. The following order has no reasonably foreseeable impact upon the energy efficiency of highway carriers.
3. A public hearing is not necessary.

Conclusion of Law

The proposed transfer of tariffs governing applicant's rates is just and reasonable and the application should be granted as set forth in the ensuing order.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Trans-Valley Transport is authorized to have its participation canceled from tariffs issued by Golden State Tariff Bureau, Agent, and have its participation added to certain tariffs published by Pacific Coast Tariff Bureau as specifically proposed in the application.
2. Tariff publications authorized to be made as a result of this order shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be effective not earlier than five days after the effective date of this order on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public.
3. The authorized cancellation of applicant's participation in Golden State Tariff Bureau tariff publications shall be concurrent

with the effective date of the authorized adoption of Pacific Coast
Tariff Bureau's tariff publications.

4. The authority granted shall expire unless exercised within
90 days after the effective date of this order.

This order becomes effective 30 days from today.
