OPINION

Michael C. Brooks, doing business as California Leisure Charters, requests a Class B certificate to operate as a charter-party carrier of passengers from a service area encompassing a radius of 40 air miles from his home terminal at 4600 Commerce Street, Riverside, CA 92502.

Applicant proposes to operate a 38-passenger bus. As of May 1, 1981, applicant indicated a net worth of \$73,710.

Notice of the filing of the application appeared in the Commission's Daily Calendar of June 5, 1981, and copies of the application were served upon Roesch Lines, Able Charter Bus Co., Greyhound Lines, Inc., American Holiday Lines, and Yucaipa Bus Service. No protests have been received. Findings of Fact

- 1. Applicant has the ability, experience, equipment, and financial resources to perform the proposed service.
- 2. Public convenience and necessity require the service proposed by applicant.
- 3. Applicant should be authorized to pick up passengers within a radius of 40 air miles from his home terminal at 4600 Commerce Street, Riverside, CA 92502.

4. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment.

Conclusion of Law

Public convenience and necessity have been demonstrated and a certificate should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity, to be renewed each year, is granted to Michael C. Brooks authorizing him to operate as a Class B charter-party carrier of passengers, as defined in PU Code Section 5383, from a service area within a radius of 40 air miles from applicant's home terminal at 4600 Commerce Street, Riverside, CA 92502.
- 2. The Passenger Operations Branch will issue the annual renewable certificate on Form PE-695 as authorized by Resolution PE-303, when it receives California Highway Patrol clearances and evidence of liability protection in compliance with General Order Series 115.

3. In providing service under the certificate, applicant shall comply with General Orders Series 98 and 115, and the California Highway Patrol safety rules.

This order becomes effective 30 days from today.
