ORDER CORRECTING EFFECTIVE DATES

Decisions (D.) 93524 and 93525, dated September 1, 1981, in these proceedings, companion decision to each other and D.93523, ordered increases in dump truck rates named in Minimum Rate Tariffs 17-A and 20. The tariff supplements authorizing the increases are to become effective September 26, 1981. However, the decisions, as issued, would not become effective until 30 days after September 1, 1981. The effective date of these companion decisions should be changed to the date they were signed, consistent with the effective date of the main decision in D.93523, which ordered increases in the rates contained in Minimum Rate Tariff 7-A. The plain and obvious intent of the Commission was for all three decisions to become effective simultaneously.


