O P I N I O N

Flamingo Tours, Inc. (applicant), a California corporation, seeks a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a passenger stage corporation providing sightseeing service between various points in the County of Los Angeles.

Applicant proposes to offer seven tours originating at major hotels in Downtown Los Angeles, Santa Monica, Westwood, Beverly Hills, Marina del Rey, and Los Angeles International Airport. A description of the proposed tours as contained in the application follows:

Tour No. 1 - Deluxe French Night & Disco Fever

Commencing from designated hotels/motels in the Los Angeles International Airport and major hotels/motels in the Los Angeles areas; then along the most appropriate routes and highways to Marina del Rey to view the Marina; then along the most convenient streets to Ocean Blvd., north to San Vicente Blvd., east to Wilshire Blvd., east to Beverly Drive, north to Sunset Blvd., east to Le Dome French Restaurant or l'Ermitage French Restaurant on La Cienega; then to Carlos and Charlie's Discotheque; then returning to the point of origin by the most appropriate routes and highways.

Applicant presently owns one 15-passenger Dodge Maxi Van and plans to purchase additional equipment as needed. Applicant initially plans to supplement its need for additional equipment by contracting with other certificated carriers.

The financial statement attached to the application shows total assets of \$52,788.59, liabilities of \$16,800.68 and stockholders equity of \$35,987.91

The application states that applicant's principal officer, Nelly Toomaru, has experience as a travel agent, airlines sales agent, and special airport representative for two major international airlines. Toomaru was also active in public relations work while doing costume design and choreography for a Tahitian revue.

In support of its request, applicant states the proposed service is distinct and different from any service currently offered in the area, the tours being deluxe and uniquely specialized for specific customers; and the nature and costs are very different from available service, duplicating available service only in a minor degree. Applicant alleges that the proposed service would have no adverse effect on the environment.

The application was noticed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of July 13, 1981. Copies of the application were served upon interested or affected parties. No protests have been received.

Based on the foregoing, the Commission concludes that the certificate of public convenience and necessity sought by Flamingo Tours, Inc. is in the public interest.

Findings of Fact

1. Applicant seeks a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a passenger stage corporation for the seven tours set forth in Appendix A.
2. Applicant proposes to originate tours from hotels in Downtown Los Angeles, Santa Monica, Westwood, Beverly Hills, Marina del Rey, and the Los Angeles International Airport.
3. Applicant has the financial fitness and equipment to perform the proposed service.
4. Applicant's principal, Nelly Toomaru, has the necessary experience to perform the proposed service.



5. Public convenience and necessity require that applicant be certificated for the service proposed.

6. There is no known opposition to the proposed service.

7. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment.

Conclusion of Law

The application should be granted as set forth in the ensuing order, which, since a need exists for the proposed service, should be effective today.

Only the amount paid to the State for operative rights may be used in rate fixing. The State may grant any number of rights and may cancel or modify the monopoly feature of these rights at any time.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to Flamingo Tours, Inc., a corporation, authorizing it to operate as a passenger stage corporation, as defined in PU Code Section 226, between the points and over the routes set forth in Appendix A to transport persons and their baggage.

2. Applicant shall:

- a. File a written acceptance of this certificate within 30 days after this order is effective.
- b. Establish the authorized service and file tariffs and timetables within 120 days after this order is effective.

- c. State in its tariffs and timetables when service will start; allow at least 10 days' notice to the Commission; and make timetables and tariffs effective 10 or more days after this order is effective.
- d. Comply with General Orders Series 79, 98, 101, and 104, and the California Highway Patrol safety rules.
- e. Maintain accounting records in conformity with the Uniform System of Accounts.

This order is effective today.

SECTION 1. GENERAL AUTHORIZATIONS, RESTRICTIONS, LIMITATIONS,  
AND SPECIFICATIONS.

Flamingo Tours, Inc., a California Corporation, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to operate as a passenger stage corporation to transport passengers on sightseeing tours between various points in the County of Los Angeles as described, over and along the most direct or reasonable route or routes subject, however, to the authority of this Commission to change or modify said points or tour routes at any time and subject to the following provisions:

- (a) Motor vehicles may be turned at termini and intermediate points, in either direction at intersections of streets or by operating around a block contiguous to such intersections, in accordance with local traffic regulations.
- (b) When route descriptions are given in one direction, they apply to operation in either direction unless otherwise indicated.
- (c) Carrier shall not pick up or discharge passengers except at the specified service points of origin/destination as hereinafter set forth.
- (d) All service herein authorized shall be limited to the transportation of round-trip passengers only.
- (e) All tours shall be conducted on a continuous basis except stops necessary for sightseeing, shopping, entertainment and/or meals.

- (g) Service may be operated for "on-call" basis, subject to the minimum number of passengers shown below:
