## ORDER MODIFYING AND STAYING DECISION 93377 AND GRANTING LIMITED REHEARING THEREOF

Petitions for rehearing of Decision (D.) 93377 have been filed by Industrial Communication's Systems, Inc. (Industrial) and by Gencom, Incorporated (Gencom). We have considered each and every allegation contained in said petitions and are of the opinion that good cause for granting limited rehearing has been shown. In addition, we shall modify our decision to change those references to the Metro 100 terminal that could be construed as indicating that the terminal is wholly owned by Industrial.

Therefore, IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The last sentence on page 20 of D.93377 is deleted and the following sentence is inserted:

"Industrial contends that the Metro 100 terminal which it manages is fully capable of handling a low band system."

2. The first sentence of the last paragraph on page 22 of D.93377 is deleted and the following sentence is inserted:

"The Metro 100 paging terminal that Industrial manages is fully redundant, with two complete systems and backup power."

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that rehearing of D.93377, limited to the purpose of receiving evidence on the matters described below, relative to Radio Relay's revised transmitter proposal, is granted.

- 1. Technical and economic feasibility (Findings of Fact Nos. 19, 20, 23 and 24);
  - 2. Effect on environment (Finding of Fact No. 49).

Such limited rehearing shall be heard at such time and place and before such Commission or Administrative Law Judge as shall hereafter be determined.

The Executive Director shall serve notice of such hearing upon the parties in accordance with the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Radio Relay shall file with the Commission, within 45 days of the effective date of this order, a Proponent's Environmental Assessment regarding its revised transmitter proposal.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that in light of the circumstances of this case, D.93377 is stayed pending further order of this Commission.

This order is effective today.
