CLARIFYING ORDER

By Decision (D.) 93774, dated November 23, 1981, the Commission in special session ordered the Southern California Gas Company to send a notice to certain applicants for loans under its demonstration solar water heating program regarding modification of that program.

Through inadvertence, the notice appended to $D.9377^{4}$ contains language which describes the options available to a loan applicant in a confusing manner. To clarify $D.9377^{4}$, pursuant to Resolution No. A-4661.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The first sentence of page two of the notice appended to D.93774 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Applicants who currently have applications pending with SoCal Gas for more than four thousand dollars (\$4,000) remain eligible for loans up to \$4.000 in amount. Applicants wishing to proceed on this basis shall advise SoCal Gas in writing. All parties are reminded that no more than 9,500 loans will be granted as part of this demonstration program.

This order is effective today.
