## <u>O P I N I O N</u>

Petitioner El Toro Materials Company requests that Minimum Rate Tariff 17-A (MRT 17-A) be amended to provide zone rates for the transportation of rock, sand, and gravel from a new production area operated by petitioner in Orange County to other Orange County zones. A copy of the application was served on three trucking associations some of whose members would be involved in the hauls and on two trade associations in Southern California whose members either extensively use or produce rock products. No protests to the application have been received.

MRT 17-A names minimum rates for the transportation, by dump truck carriers, of certain commodities including rock, sand, and gravel. These rates are principally zone rates which apply from defined production areas to designated delivery zones via a network of routes over most legally traversable highways in Southern California. Shipments from production areas not included in MRT 17-A must be assessed hourly or mileage rates found in another minimum rate tariff. C.9819 Pet.49 ALJ/rr/ec /ks \*

The petition shows that petitioner operates a rock and sand plant at a location in Orange County north of El Toro Road in El Toro. The legal description of the plant site is described in the petition. Petitioner ships substantial quantities of rock and sand from its plant site each month and uses the services of for-hire dump truck carriers to transport these products, which are marketed in Orange County usually within the system of delivery zones. However, zone rates from this location are not available so petitioner is charged either hourly or mileage rates. Petitioner believes that hourly rates require costly supervision and increase the expense of billing customers and paying forhire carriers. Petitioner believes mileage rates for rock and sand are inequitable because they are not economically commensurate with zone rates. Petitioner contends that the establishment of zone rates from its production facility will not cause rate discrimination because producers of the same commodities in the same market area have zone rates to Orange County delivery zones.

A member of the Commission's Transportation Division staff made a field inspection of the plant site and checked the trip report (see Exhibit 1) and generally verified petitioner's factual allegations. The staff determined that the plant site contains approximately 55 acres located off El Toro Road between node numbers 40691 and 40693 in Orange County. The layout of the production area is set forth on a map attached to Exhibit 1. The highway (El Toro Road) giving access and egress from the plant site is being widened and realigned for several hundred feet beyond the plant gate and will have four lanes and flatter grades than the existing road. The staff agrees with petitioner that the establishment of zone rates from petitioner's v production area is justified as products from this location are mostly marketed in zoned areas of Orange County. ## Findings of Fact

1. MRT 17-A names minimum rates for the transportation, by dump truck carriers, of certain commodities including rock, sand, and gravel via a network of routes over most legally traversable highways in Southern California.

2. Petitioner operates a rock and sand plant north of El Toro Road in El Toro, Orange County.

3. Petitioner requests that MRT 17-A be modified by designating its plant as a production area and establishing zone rates from its production area to Orange County zones.

4. Petitioner ships substantial quantities of rock and sand by dump truck carriers from its production area each month to Orange County delivery zones.

5. Currently, petitioner has no zone rates available and must pay hourly or mileage rates.

6. The establishment of zone rates from petitioner's production site as requested will not cause rate discrimination because producers of the same commodities in the same market area have zone rates available to them.

7. The rates provided will result in just, reasonable, and nondiscriminatory minimum rates for the transportation involved.

8. A public hearing is not necessary. Conclusion of Law

The petition should be granted to the extent provided in the following order.

## O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff 17-A (MRT 17-A) (Appendix C to Decision (D.) 80578, as amended) is further amended by incorporating Original Page 5-U, attached, to become effective 39 days after today.

2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are also subject to D.80578, as amended, are directed to establish in their tariffs the rates and routes necessary to conform with the further revisions ordered by this decision.

3. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of this order shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and be made effective not earlier than 39 days after the date hereof on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public.

4. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rates authorized by this order, are authorized to depart from the provisions of Public Utilities Code Section 461.5 to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

5. In all other respects, D.80578, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

6. The Executive Director shall serve a copy of this decision on every common carrier, or such carriers' authorized tariff publishing agents, performing transportation services subject to MRT 17-A.
