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GENERAL AUTHORIZATIONS, RESTRICTIONS, LIMITATIONS, AND SECTION I. SPECIFICATIONS.

North Shuttle Service, Inc., a corporation, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to transport passengers and their baggage on an "on-call" basis, between the points described in Section IIA, on the one hand, and the airports described in Section IIB, on the other hand, over and along the route described in Section III, subject, however, to the authority of this Commission to change or modify the route at any time and subject to the following provisions:

- When route descriptions are given in one a. direction, they apply to operation in either direction unless otherwise indicated.
 - The term "on-call", as used, refers to service which is authorized to be rendered dependent on the demands of passengers. The tariffs and timetables shall show the . conditions under which each authorized oncall service will be rendered.
- No passengers shall be transported except C. those having either a point of origin or destination at one of the airports described Section IIB.
- This certificate does not authorize the d. holder to conduct any operation on the property of or into any airport unless such operation is authorized by the airport authority involved.

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SECTION II. SERVICE AREAS.

Any point or place within the following counties: Α.

> Santa Clara, San Mateo, Contra Costa, Alameda, Marin, and San Francisco.

San Francisco International Airport В. San Jose International Airport Oakland International Airport

SECTION III. ROUTE DESCRIPTION.

ON -CALL SERVICE Commencing from any point or place in the counties described in Section IIA then over the most convenient streets and highways to any of the airports described in Section IIB.
