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## Decision 95-11-053 November 21, 1995

#### <u>OPINION</u>

Cheryl A. Jensen, an individual (applicant), requests authority pursuant to Public Utilities Code § 1031, et seq., to establish and operate as a passenger stage corporation to transport passengers and their baggage between certain points and places in the Counties of Riverside, Orange, Los Angeles, and San Diego, on the one hand, and Ontario International (ONT), John Wayne (ORG), Los Angeles International (LAX), San Diego International (SAN) Airports, Amtrak stations, Los Angeles, Long Beach and San Diego Harbors, on the other hand.

Applicant proposes to perform on-call service, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Applicant indicates in Exhibit "C", attached to the application, the proposed vehicle to be utilized for this service is a Ford Explorer with a seating capacity of five persons including the driver. The unaudited balance sheet as of May 16, 1995 indicates total assets of \$257,300, liabilities of \$145,250 and net worth of \$109,000. The proposed tariff containing the rules and fares are shown in Exhibit "A", attached to his application. The proposed fares are reasonable.

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Applicant submitted a letter, dated October 16, 1995, to the Safety and Enforcement Division indicating that she only intends to provide service between points in the Temecula/Murrieta area and surrounding cities to LAX, ONT, ORG, and SAN, as listed in Exhibit "A" of the application.

Notice of filing of the application appeared in the Commission's Daily Calendar on June 21, 1995. No protest has been received. The applicant notified the airports and governmental entities. The Safety and Enforcement Division recommends that the application be granted.

#### Findings of Fact

1. Applicant requests authority to establish and operate as a passenger stage corporation, on on-call basis, to transport passengers and their baggage between points in the Temecula/Murrieta area and surrounding cities to LAX, ONT, ORG, and SAN, as listed in Exhibit "A" of the application.

2. Public convenience and necessity require the issuance of a certificate to perform the proposed service.

3. No protests to the application have been filed.

4. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment.

## Conclusions of Law

1. A public hearing is not necessary.

2. Public convenience and necessity have been demonstrated and the application should be granted.

Only the amount paid to the State for operative rights may be used in rate fixing. The State may grant any number of rights and may cancel or modify the monopoly feature of these rights at any time.

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## <u>ORDER</u>

## IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to Cheryl A. Jensen, an individual, (applicant), authorizing her to operate as a passenger stage corporation, as defined in Public Utilities (PU) Code § 226, to transport persons and their baggage, between the points and over the routes set forth in Appendix PSC-9008.

- 2. Applicant shall:
  - a. File a written acceptance of this certificate within 30 days after this order is effective.
  - b. Establish the authorized service and file tariffs and timetables within 120 days after this order is effective.
  - c. State in the tariffs and timetable when service will start; allow at least 10 days' notice to the Commission; and make timetables and tariffs effective 10 or more days after this order is effective.
  - d. Comply with General Orders Series 101, 104, and 158, and the California Highway Patrol safety rules.
  - e. Maintain accounting records in conformity with the Uniform System of Accounts.
  - f. Remit to the Commission the Transportation Reimbursement Fee required by PU § 403 when notified by mail to do so.
  - g. Comply with PU Code §§ 460.7 and 1043, relating to the Workers' Compensation laws of this state.

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3. Before beginning service to any airport, applicant shall notify the airport's governing body. Applicant shall not operate into or on airport property unless such operations are also authorized by the airport's governing body.

4. Applicant is authorized to begin operations on the date that the Executive Director mails a notice to applicant that her evidence of insurance is on file with the Commission and that the California Highway Patrol has approved the use of applicant's vehicles for service.

5. The application is granted as set forth above. This order is effective today.

# SECTION 1. GENERAL AUTHORIZATIONS, RESTRICTIONS, LIMITATIONS, AND SPECIFICATIONS.

Cheryl A. Jensen, an individual, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to transport passengers and their baggage on "on-call" basis, between the points described in Section IIA, on the one hand, and the airports described in Section IIB, on the other hand, over and along the route described in Section III, subject, however, to the authority of this Commission to change or modify the route at any time and subject to the following provisions:

- a. When route descriptions are given in one direction, they apply to operation in either direction unless otherwise indicated.
- b. The term "on-call", as used, refers to service which is authorized to be rendered dependent on the demands of passengers. The tariffs and timetables shall show the conditions under which each authorized oncall service will be rendered.
- c. No passengers shall be transported except those having either a point of origin or destination at the airports named in Section IIB.
- d. This certificate does not authorize the holder to conduct any operation on the property of or into any airport unless such operation is authorized by the airport authority involved.
