## <u>OPINION</u>

At our Commission meeting of Friday, February 23, 1996, we issued Decision (D.) 96-02-072 which, in relevant part, granted certificates of public convenience and necessity (CPCN) to several petitioners as Competitive Local Carriers (CLC) authorized to resell local exchange service within the service territories of Pacific Bell and GTE California.

One petitioner, Cable Plus, which filed Petition 29, was previously granted authority as a facilities-based CLC in D.95-12-057 and given corporate identification number U-5547-C. Although Cable Plus also requested resale CLC authority and met all of the qualifications to be granted that authority, it was inadvertently left off of the list of approved resale CLCs contained in Appendix A of D.96-02-072.

The purpose of this decision is to correct that omission and grant authority as a resale CLC to Cable Plus, to the same extent and subject to the same requirements as those granted authority in D.96-02-072.

### Finding of Fact

Although Cable Plus met all of the requirements for issuance of a CPCN as a resale CLC, it was inadvertently omitted from the list of approved resale CLCs contained in Appendix A in D.96-02-072.

#### Conclusion of Law

Cable Plus should be granted a CPCN as a resale CLC.

#### <u>ORDBR</u>

IT IS ORDERED that a certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to Cable Plus, Petitioner 29, U-5547-C, to operate as a Competitive Local Carrier with authority to resell local exchange service within the service territories of Pacific Bell and GTE California, as described in their petition, subject to the the conditions and interim rules established in Decision 96-02-072.

This order is effective today.
