ORDER CORRECTING ERROR

The applicant has called to the Commission's attention an error in Appendix VCC-80 to Decision (D.) 97-06-112, our interim order temporarily granting a certificate of public convenience and necessity to the applicant for conducting specified vessel services. The appendix erroneously provides that the services in question are to be provided at hourly or per diem rates, rather than at the rates requested by the applicant and authorized in the order,

Under Resolution A-4661, IT IS ORDERED that the following corrections are made to Appendix VCC-80 in D.97-06-112:

1. Paragraph "b." is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following paragraphs "b." and "c.":

- b. Nonscheduled Cruise Ship Tendering Service shall be operated on an "on-call" basis. The term "on-call," as used, refers to service which is authorized to be rendered dependent on the demands of cruise ship operators. The tariffs and timetables shall show the terms and conditions under which Cruise Ship Tendering Services will be rendered.
- c. "On-call" Cruise Ship Tendering Service shall be performed at contract rates determined in negotiations with individual ocean-going shipping clients (including, for example, hourly rates, daily rates, per-passenger rates, or per-manifested passenger rates); in each case such rate shall include the

services of vessel and crew, regardless of the number of passengers or crew transported.

2. Paragraph "c." is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following paragraphs "d." and "e.":

d. Nonscheduled Campsite Charter Service shall be operated on an "on-call" basis. The term "on-call," as used, refers to service which is authorized to be rendered dependent on the demands of campsite operators. The tariff and timetable shall show the terms and conditions under which Campsite Charter Service will be rendered.

e. "On-call" Campsite Charter Service shall be performed at a flat rate which includes the services of vessel and crew, regardless of the number of passengers transported.

3. The reference to "c." in the fourth paragraph (also identified as paragraph "c." is deleted and replaced with "f."

This order is effective today.
