

Decision 00-06-032 June 8, 2000

Wanda Williams, an individual, dba Wanda on Wheels for authority to operate as a passenger stage corporation on an "on-call" basis and door-to-door service between points in Oakland, on the one hand, and prison facilities located in Dublin, San Quentin, Tracy, Vacaville, Ione, Crescent City, Susanville, Jamestown, Soledad, San Diego, Blythe, Wasco, Chino, Chowchilla, Coalinga, Stockton, Delano, Imperial, Represa, Lancaster, Corcoran, Norco, San Luis Obispo, Tehachapi, Calipatria, Frontera, and Avenal on the other hand.

O P I N I O N**Summary**

This decision grants the application of Wanda Williams (Applicant), an individual, pursuant to Pub. Util. Code § 1031 et seq., for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a passenger stage corporation (PSC), as defined in Pub. Util. Code § 226.

Discussion

Applicant requests authority to operate as an on-call PSC to transport passengers and their baggage between the City of Oakland, on the one hand, and the prison facilities located in the cities or communities of Dublin, San Quentin, Tracy, Vacaville, Folsom, Ione, Crescent City, Susanville, Jamestown, Soledad, Corona, San Diego, Blythe, Wasco, Chino, Chowchilla, Coalinga, Stockton,

Delano, Imperial, Represa, Lancaster, Corcoran, Norco, San Luis Obispo, Tehachapi, Calipatria, Frontera, Avenal, and Standish, on the other hand.

Applicant will initially utilize a seven-passenger vehicle for the proposed service. She plans to purchase three more vans in the future to meet anticipated demands for the service. The proposed adult round-trip fares, as listed in Exhibit C, range between \$27 (Dublin) and \$218 (Imperial). Exhibit E to the application is the unaudited Balance Sheet as of February 21, 2000, that discloses total assets of \$21,400; total liabilities of \$4,400; and net worth of \$17,000.

Notice of filing of the application appeared in the Commission's Daily Calendar on March 9, 2000. The applicant notified the affected cities and prison facilities.

In Resolution ALJ 176-3035 dated March 21, 2000, the Commission preliminarily categorized this application as ratesetting, and preliminarily determined that hearings were not necessary. No protests have been received. Given this status, public hearing is not necessary, and it is not necessary to alter the preliminary determinations made in Resolution ALJ 176-3035.

This is an uncontested matter in which the decision grants the relief requested. Accordingly, pursuant to Pub. Util. Code § 311(g)(2), the otherwise applicable 30-day period for public review and comment is being waived.

Findings of Fact

1. Applicant requests authority to operate as an on-call PSC to transport passengers and their baggage between the City of Oakland, on the one hand, and the prison facilities located in the cities or communities of Dublin, San Quentin, Tracy, Vacaville, Folsom, Ione, Crescent City, Susanville, Jamestown, Soledad, Corona, San Diego, Blythe, Wasco, Chino, Chowchilla, Coalinga, Stockton,

Delano, Imperial, Represa, Lancaster, Corcoran, Norco, San Luis Obispo, Tehachapi, Calipatria, Frontera, Avenal, and Standish, on the other hand.

2. Public convenience and necessity requires the proposed service.
3. No protests to the application have been filed.
4. A public hearing is not necessary.
5. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment.

Conclusions of Law

1. Public convenience and necessity has been demonstrated and the application should be granted.
2. Since the matter is uncontested, the decision should be effective on the date it is signed.

Only the amount paid to the State for operative rights may be used in rate fixing. The State may grant any number of rights and may cancel or modify the monopoly feature of these rights at any time.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity (CPCN) is granted to Wanda Williams (Applicant), an individual, authorizing her to operate as a passenger stage corporation (PSC), as defined in Pub. Util. Code § 226, to transport persons and their baggage, between the points and over the routes set forth in Appendix PSC-13227 subject to the conditions contained in the following paragraphs.

2. Applicant shall:

- a. File a written acceptance of this certificate within 30 days after this order is effective.
- b. Establish the authorized service and file tariffs and timetables within 120 days after this order is effective.
- c. Tariffs may be filed on or after the effective date of this order. It shall become effective ten days or more after the effective date of this order, provided that the Commission and the public are given not less than ten days' notice.
- d. Comply with General Orders Series 101, 104, and 158, and the California Highway Patrol (CHP) safety rules.
- e. Comply with the controlled substance and alcohol testing certification program pursuant to Pub. Util. Code § 1032.1 and General Order Series 158.
- f. Maintain accounting records in conformity with the Uniform System of Accounts.
- g. Remit to the Commission the Transportation Reimbursement Fee required by Pub. Util. Code § 403 when notified by mail to do so.
- h. Comply with Pub. Util. Code §§ 460.7 and 1043, relating to the Workers' Compensation laws of this state.
- i. Enroll all drivers in the pull notice system as required by Section 1808.1 of the Vehicle Code.

3. Applicant is authorized to begin operations on the date that the Rail Safety and Carriers Division mails a notice to Applicant that her evidence of insurance and other documents required by Ordering Paragraph 2 have been filed with the Commission and that the CHP has approved the use of Applicant's vehicle for service.

4. Before beginning service to any airport, Applicant shall notify the airport's governing body. Applicant shall not operate into or on airport property unless such operations are authorized by the airport's governing body.

5. The CPCN to operate as a PSC-13227, granted herein, expires, unless exercised within 120 days after the effective date of this order.

6. The Application is granted as set forth above.

7. This proceeding is closed.

This order is effective today.

SECTION I. GENERAL AUTHORIZATIONS, RESTRICTIONS, LIMITATIONS,
AND SPECIFICATIONS.

Wanda Williams, an individual, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by the decision noted in the foot of the margin, is authorized to transport passengers and their baggage on an "on-call" basis, between points and places as described in Section IIA and Section IIB, over and along the route described in Section III, subject however, to the authority of this Commission to change or modify this authority at any time and subject to the following provisions:

- a. When a route description is given in one direction, it applies to operation in either direction unless otherwise indicated.
- b. The term "on-call", as used, refers to service which is authorized to be rendered dependent on the demands of passengers. The tariffs and timetables shall show the conditions under which each authorized on-call service will be rendered.
- c. No passengers shall be transported except those having a point of origin or destination as described in Section IIB.
- d. This certificate does not authorize the holder to conduct any operation on the property of any airport unless such operation is authorized by the airport authority involved.

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SECTION II. SERVICE AREA.

- A. Prison facilities in the cities or communities of Dublin, San Quentin, Tracy, Vacaville, Folsom, Ione, Crescent City, Susanville, Jamestown, Soledad, Corona, San Diego, Blythe, Wasco, Chino, Chowchilla, Coalinga, Stockton, Delano, Imperial, Represa, Lancaster, Corcoran, Norco, San Luis Obispo, Tehachapi, Calipatria, Frontera, Avenal, and Standish.
- B. City of Oakland.

SECTION III. ROUTE DESCRIPTION.

Commencing from any point as described in Section IIA, then over the most convenient streets, expressways, and highways to the airports described in Section IIB.
