### **BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA**

Application of Pacific Gas and Electric Company, a California corporation, and Fred Ryness and Associates for an Order Authorizing the Former to Sell and Convey to the Latter a Certain Parcel of Land in Shasta County Pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 851. (U 39 M)

### **ORDER ON PETITON FOR MODIFICATION**

#### Summary

Decision (D.) 98-02-035, dated February 4, 1998, is modified to grant Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) an extension of time of six months to complete the sale to Fred Ryness and Associates (Buyer) of a certain parcel of land located in Shasta County.

## **Discussion**

PG&E and Buyer worked diligently to close the sale. However, for reasons set forth in the petition for modification, they were unable to do so within the 12-month period specified in the decision. They expect to complete the sale shortly after February 4, 1999. Accordingly, PG&E requests that the period of 12 months allowed to complete the sale authorized by D.98-02-035 be changed to 18 months.

We agree.

This is an uncontested matter in which the decision grants the relief requested. Accordingly, pursuant to Pub. Util. Code § 311(g)(2), the otherwise applicable 30-day period for public review and comment is being waived.

# **Findings of Fact**

ľ

1. Due to circumstances beyond its control, PG&E was unable to complete the sale of the parcel of land authorized in D.98-02-035 within the 12-month period allowed by the decision.

2. PG&E requests that the period of 12 months allowed to complete the sale be changed to 18 months.

3. No protests were filed opposing PG&E's petition for modification filed on February 4, 1999.

## **Conclusions of Law**

1. It is in the public interest for the extension of time to be granted.

2. D.98-02-035 should be modified accordingly.

IT IS ORDERED that Decision 98-02-035, Ordering Paragraph 5, which reads: "This grant of authority expires if not exercised within one year of the date of this order." is modified to read: "This grant of authority expires if not exercised by August 4, 1999."

This order is effective today.
