ORDER MODIFYING DECISION 99-02-027

The parties in this proceeding, the Commission Consumer Services

Division (CSD) and respondent, Mike Amos Galam, request modification of

Decision (D.) 99-02-027 to prevent the unintended extension of the recommended
probation for respondent. The parties previously agreed upon a probation
period of two years. However, due to the parties' adherence to the settlement
agreement from the date signed, respondent had completed 8 months of his
probation when the order approving the settlement was signed. Thus,
inadvertently, the probation period was extended an additional 8 months.

Parties request changes to the settlement agreement to eliminate this effect.

The parties request to modify the decision in this proceeding is reasonable and will prevent an inadvertent extension of the agreed two-year period of probation. Therefore, there is good cause to approve the revision in the settlement agreement and approve the revised settlement agreement.

Comments on Draft Decision

This is an uncontested matter in which the decision grants the relief requested. Accordingly, pursuant to Pub. Util. Code Section 311(g)(2), the

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The Settlement Agreement in this proceeding, at page 2, Paragraph A is modified to read as:

"Respondent agrees to a two-year period of probation, which shall begin on June 8, 1998, the date this SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT is submitted by motion for adoption by order of the Commission, during which Respondent shall be subject to the following terms and conditions:..."

2. The revised Settlement Agreement is approved.
