{ RESOLUTION AMENDING THE HIGHWAY COMMON CARRIER }
{ CERTIFICATE OF SAVAGE BROTHERS, INCORPORATED }

Savage Brothers, Incorporated, a Utah corporation, P. O. Box 39, American Fork, Utah 84003, holds a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier of certain commodities over specified routes, including petroleum products in bulk other than in pressurized or insulated tanks. The certificate was issued June 5, 1986, under Commission file no. T-152146.

Savage Brothers, Incorporated has informed the Commission that it does not intend to transport petroleum and petroleum products in any type of tank vehicles, and wishes to have this authority deleted from its certificate.

The type of transportation service requested to be deleted from this carrier's certificate is readily available from numerous other carriers. In the circumstances the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity no longer require Savage Brothers, Incorporated to perform such service as a highway common carrier and concludes that the certificate granted on June 5, 1986, should be amended to exclude such transportation.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Appendices A and B of the certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier, which was granted to Savage Brothers, Incorporated by the Commission on June 5, 1986, is hereby amended by replacing the Original Page 1's with the First Revised Page 1's (attached).
2. The Executive Director is directed to cause service of a copy of this resolution on Savage Brothers, Incorporated.

This order becomes effective 30 days from today.

SAVAGE BROTHERS, INCORPORATED, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted, is authorized to conduct operations as a highway common carrier as defined in Section 213 of the Public Utilities Code for the transportation of:

- A. Property necessary or incidental to the establishment, maintenance, or dismantling of oil, gas, or water, wells, pipelines, refineries, and cracking or casing head plants, equipment and material used in construction, and equipment used in farming, excluding petroleum and/or petroleum products and waste petroleum and/or waste petroleum products in bulk, in tank vehicles or in vacuum tank vehicles.
- B. Between all points and places on the following routes and all points within 50 miles laterally thereof:
 1. U. S. Highway 101 between the Oregon-California State Line and the City of Los Angeles;
 2. Interstate Highway 5 between the Oregon-California State Line and Sacramento, and between Wheeler Ridge and the International Border with Mexico;
 3. State Highway 86 between Indio and the International Border with Mexico.
 4. State Highway 99 between Red Bluff and Wheeler Ridge;
 5. State Highway 299 between Redding and Alturas;
 6. U. S. Highway 395 between the Oregon-California State Line and the California-Nevada State Line, via Alturas and Johnstonville;
 7. State Highway 36 between its junction with State Highway 99, near Red Bluff, and its junction with U. S. Highway 395, at Johnstonville;
 8. State Highway 20 between Marysville and its junction with Interstate Highway 80;
 9. Interstate Highway 80 between San Francisco and the California-Nevada State Line;
 10. U.S. State Highway 50 between Sacramento and the California-Nevada State Line.
 11. U. S. Highway 395 between the California-Nevada State Line, near Topaz lake, and its junction with Interstate Highway 15, near Hesperia;

SAVAGE BROTHERS, INCORPORATED, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted, is authorized to conduct operations as a highway common carrier as defined in Section 213 of the Public Utilities Code for the transportation of:

- A. Petroleum products, excluding petroleum and/or petroleum products and waste petroleum and/or waste petroleum products in bulk, in tank or vacuum tank vehicles.
- B. Between all points and places on the following routes and all points within 50 miles laterally thereof:
 1. U. S. Highway 101 between San Francisco and the City of Los Angeles;
 2. Interstate Highway 5 between Wheeler Ridge and the International Border with Mexico;
 3. State Highway 86 between Indio and the International Border with Mexico;
 4. State Highway 99 between Sacramento and Wheeler Ridge.
 5. Interstate Highway 80 between San Francisco and California-Nevada State Line;
 6. U. S. Highway 50 between Sacramento and the California-Nevada State Line;
 7. U. S. Highway 395 between the California-Nevada State Line, near Topaz Lake, and its junction with Interstate Highway 15, near Hesperia;
 8. U. S. Highway 66 (Interstate Highway 15), between Barstow and the City of Los Angeles;
 9. Interstate Highway 40 (U. S. Highway 66), between Barstow and Needles, via Amboy and Essex;
 10. Interstate Highway 10 between the City of Los Angeles and the California-Arizona State Line;
 11. Interstate Highway 15 between Barstow and the California-Nevada State Line;
 12. State Highway 127 between Baker and the California-Nevada State Line; and
 13. Interstate Highway 8 between the City of San Diego and the California-Arizona State Line.
