R E S O L U T I O N

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING DESIGNATED EMPLOYEES IN THE  
TRANSPORTATION DIVISION TO EXERCISE POWERS OF ARREST  
OF A PEACE OFFICER TO ENFORCE MISDEMEANOR OFFENSES  
UNDER THE PUBLIC UTILITIES CODE.

WHEREAS: A.B. 414, Chap. 462, Stats. 1985, authorizes employees in the Transportation Division designated by the Director of Transportation to exercise powers of arrest of a peace officer, limited to the enforcement of the misdemeanor provisions of the Public Utilities (P.U.) Code upon completion of training prescribed by Section 832 of the Penal Code and upon approval of the Commission.

WHEREAS: A total of 25 employees in the Compliance and Enforcement Branch, Transportation Division, who attended the Northern California Criminal Justice Training and Education System, Sacramento Center, during the period December 9-20, 1985, have successfully completed the training course prescribed by the Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training.

WHEREAS: The following departmental policy shall be adhered to by designated members in the Transportation Division in carrying out their new authority during the course and within the scope of their employment:

1. The powers of arrest of a peace officer shall be limited to issuance of Notice to Appear citations for specified misdemeanor violations under the P.U. Code.
2. Designated employees shall not physically take offenders into custody but will refer such action to a uniformed peace officer, if one is available.

3. Designated employees shall not carry firearms, handcuffs or similar restraining devices, or stop any motor vehicle operating on the public streets and roads.
4. Designated employees shall not serve warrants of arrest unless a uniformed peace officer is available to provide transportation for booking.

WHEREAS: The issuance of Notice to Appear citations shall be limited to the following category of misdemeanor offenses under the P.U. Code.

1. Operation as a highway carrier, household goods carrier, charter-party carrier of passengers, or motor transportation broker activity without the requisite authority from the Commission.
2. Transportation of passengers or property in interstate or foreign commerce without first registering such operations with the Commission.
3. Advertising as a household goods carrier or as a charter-party carrier of passengers without a valid and active permit, license, or certificate from the Commission.
4. Failure of an authorized household goods carrier or authorized charter-party carriers of passengers to disclose its PUC identification number in its advertisements.
5. Failure of regulatees to identify their operating equipment with assigned PUC identification number.
6. Failure by for-hire vessel operators and commercial air carriers to procure liability insurance protection.


THEREFORE: IT IS ORDERED that:

The employees listed in Appendix A are hereby authorized to exercise the powers of arrest of a peace officer to the extent provided herein to enforce the misdemeanor provisions of the P. U. Code.
