Supplemental Cost Data for the Devers-Valley-Serrano
Project, A.59982, D.84-10-034

By Resolution effective April 17, 1985 the Commission amended ordering paragraphs Nos. 5 and 6 of Decision No. 84-10-034 and granted an extension to January 15, 1986 of certain helicopter construction bids for the Devers-Valley-Serrano Transmission Line.

Edison informed the Commission by letter dated January 6, 1986, that due to changes in construction methods, bids for the crane helicopter construction through the Cleveland National Forest will not be available until February 15, 1986. Accordingly, Edison has asked for an extension to February 15, 1986, to submit the results of the crane helicopter construction bids.

The staff has reviewed Edison's request and the reason for the extension of time to submit the crane helicopter construction bids and recommends approval of the extension.


Pursuant to Rule 43 of the Commission Rules of Practice and Procedure, Edison has requested an extension of the deadline to submit the crane helicopter construction bids.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. Edison granted an extension to February 15, 1986 to submit its results of the crane helicopter construction bids with respect to the Devers-Valley-Serrano Transmission Line.
2. This order is effective today.
