R E S O L U T I O N

RESOLUTION G-2922. PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY  
REQUESTS AUTHORITY TO REVISE RESIDENTIAL TARIFFS TO  
CONFORM WITH DECISION 90-05-049.

BY ADVICE LETTER 1597-G/1302-E FILED ON JUNE 15, 1990

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SUMMARY

1. Revises additional residential tariffs of Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) to conform with the language in Commission Decision 90-05-041.
2. This Resolution grants the request.

BACKGROUND

1. On May 4, 1990 the Commission issued Decision (D.) 90-05-041 modifying in part D.89-12-057 by Ordering Paragraph 2:  
"2. Pacific Gas and Electric Company is ordered to revise the applicability sections of rate schedule ET to provide the discount to all installed spaces."
2. Subsequent to submitting Advice Letter 1298-E to accomplish the above requirement of D.90-05-041, PG&E advised the Energy Branch that language in additional residential tariffs should be changed, to avoid discrimination between residential customers according to their place or type of residence.
3. The additional Tariff Schedules which needed to be revised are: GS - Multifamily Service, GT - Mobile Home Park Service, GSL - Multifamily Low-Income Service, GTL - Mobile Home Park Low-Income Service, ES - Multifamily Service, ESL - Multifamily Low-Income Service, and ETL - Mobile Home Park Low-Income Service.

4. The revisions either; provide that the available discounts will be for installed unit instead of occupied unit, change language to read that the customer must notify PG&E when there is a change in the number of installed units instead of occupied units, and a one cent increase in the discount available for each installed space in the electrical tariffs. The proposed changes have a similar intent as the revision directed for the ET Tariff Schedule in D.90-05-041.

5. As these tariff revisions are either for less restrictive conditions or for lower charges paid by PG&E's customers they could go into effect upon the regular notice period with no further action by the Commission. However, PG&E has requested they be placed into effect upon less than regular notice which does require Commission approval. Such Short Notice will permit these tariff changes to become effective with the changes in Tariff Schedule ET - Mobile Home Park Service directed in Decision 90-05-041, as previously filed by PG&E.

#### NOTICE

1. Public notification of this filing has been made in the Commission Calendar of June 20, 1990 and by mailing to each of the parties on PG&E's Electric Advice Filing Mailing List.

#### PROTESTS

1. No protests to this Advice Letter have been received.

#### DISCUSSION

1. Changing the applicability language in Tariff Schedule ET - Mobile Home Park Service as directed in Commission Decision 90-05-041 without changing the language in other residential tariffs results in discrimination between residential customers based solely upon their location or type of residence.

2. Public Utilities Code, Sections 453(a), and 532 requires that there be no discrimination between similar customers of a public utility.

#### FINDINGS

1. To avoid discriminatory treatment it is necessary to revise additional residential tariffs of Pacific Gas and Electric Company.

2. To avoid possible discrimination, even for a short time, it is necessary that Advice Letters 1597-G and 1302-E of Pacific Gas and Electric Company be approved on less than the regular notice period.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:


1. Advice Letters 1597-G and 1302-E are accepted on Short Notice for inclusion in the filed tariffs of Pacific Gas and Electric Company.

2. Advice Letters 1597-G and 1302-E are to be stamped as approved by this Resolution.

3. This Resolution is effective today.
