

Investigation on the Commission's own motion into the operations, rates and practices of PRESIDENT MOVING COMPANY, a California Corporation,

Respondent.



ORDER INSTITUTING INVESTIGATION

PRESIDENT MOVING COMPANY (President), a California Corporation, whose mailing address is 1031 Westminster Avenue, Alhambra, California 91803, is engaged in the business of transporting used household goods over the public highways of this state for compensation pursuant to the Household Goods Permit issued on December 19, 1985.

It appears that while providing this service the respondent carrier may have violated Sections 5135 and 5139 of the Public Utilities Code and Items 44, 132, 136 and 470 of Minimum Tariff Rate (MRT) 4C.

Good cause appearing therefore:

IT IS ORDERED that an investigation on the Commission's own motion is instituted into the operations, rates, charges and practices of the respondent, President Moving Company, Inc., for the purpose of determining:

1. Whether President, in transporting used household goods for various shippers, violated Sections 5135 and 5139 of the Public Utilities Code by failing to notify the Commission that the "qualifying" employee (who had passed the required examination on regulatory requirements) had terminated his connection with the company.

2. Whether President violated Item 44 of Minimum Rate Tariff (MRT) 4-C by failing to observe the unit of measurement as required by the tariffs.

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3. Whether President failed to observe the documentation requirements of Item 132 of MRT 4-C, failed to enter declared value on shipping documents as required by Item 136 of MRT 4-C, and failed to provide brochure for information to shippers as required by Item 470 of MRT 4-C.

4. Whether, President's operating authority should be cancelled, revoked, or suspended, or in the alternative, a fine imposed pursuant to Section 5285 of the Public Utilities Code up to \$20,000.

5. Whether Président should be ordered to céase and désist from any unlawful opérations or practices.

6. Whether any other orders that may be appropriate should be entered in the lawful exercise of the Commission's jurisdiction.

7. The scope of the investigation includes, but is not limited to transportation of goods represented by the invoices listed in Appendix A, attached.

This matter will be set for hearing before the Commission at a time and place to be noticed later, at which time all interested parties may appear and be heard.

The Executive Director is directed to cause a certified copy of this OII to be served personally on the respondent carrier.
