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Summary

ORDER INSTITUTING RULEMAKING

By this order we institute a rulemaking for the purpose of exempting commercial mobile radio service (CMRS) providers from the reporting requirements of General Orders (GOs) 77-K and 104-A. CMRS includes cellular services, personal communications services, wide-area specialized mobile radio services, and two-way radiotelephone services. Parties may file opening comments by April 10, 1998, and reply comments by April 24, 1998. Pending the outcome of this proceeding, we defer the March 31, 1998 filing requirements of GOs 77-K and 104-A for CMRS providers.

Background

GOs 77-K and 104-A require public utilities, including CMRS providers, to submit the following information to the Commission by March 31st of each year:

GO 77-K: (1) The identity of a utility's employees paid a certain level of compensation during the preceding calendar year and the amount of compensation received by each such person, including any expense reimbursements; (2) payments to attorneys employed by a utility or an affiliate; and (3) dues, donations, subscriptions, and contributions paid by a utility.

GO 104-A: (1) income statement; (2) balance sheet; (3) separate schedules for income, expenses, assets, long-term debt, retained earnings and partnership capital; (4) a list of directors, owners, principal officers, and business partners; and (5) a list of significant changes during the preceding year, including the issuance of capital stock or long-term debt, changes in franchise rights, significant changes in plant, and rate changes.

numbers, and contact persons of regulated utilities should be accurate and current. We believe, therefore, that the information mentioned above should be filed by CMRS providers by January 15 of each year, in lieu of the filing requirements of GOs 77-K and 104-A.³

This proceeding shall not consider whether telecommunications carriers other than CMRS providers should also be exempt from GOs 77-K and 104-A.⁴ Pending the outcome of this OIR, we defer the filing requirements of GOs 77-K and 104-A for CMRS providers only; therefore, CMRS providers need not submit on March 31, 1998, information relating to GOs 77-K and 104-A.

Preliminary Scoping Memo

This rulemaking shall be conducted in accordance with Article 2.5 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure.⁵ As required by Rule 6 (c) (2) of Article 2.5, this order incorporates a preliminary scoping memo⁴ as set forth below.

The scope of this rulemaking is to determine whether CMRS providers should be exempt from GOs 77K and 104-A.? This rulemaking shall also address the extent of administrative reporting requirements that should remain in place if CMRS providers are ultimately exempted from these GOs.

material disputed factual issues on which a hearing should be held. In addition, the motion should identify the general nature of the adjudicative evidence the party proposes to introduce at the requested hearing. Any right a party may otherwise have to an evidentiary hearing for the presentation of adjudicative facts will be waived if the party does not submit a timely motion requesting an evidentiary hearing.

Following the receipt of comments and motions requesting an evidentiary hearing, if any, the assigned Commissioner shall issue a ruling that finalizes the category, scope and schedule of this proceeding (Rules 6(c)(2) and 6.3). After the issuance of this ruling, parties may file and serve an appeal to the Commission regarding the assigned Commissioner's ruling on category (Rule 6.4).

Service List for Proceeding

So that interested parties are aware of this proceeding, we shall instruct our Executive Director to mail a copy of this order to the service list for Investigation 93-12-007,¹¹ and to the Telecommunications Division's list of CMRS providers (Attachment D). A copy of this order may also be obtained from the Commission's web site; the Commission's Central Files' Office [(415) 703-2045]; and the Commission's Public Advisor's Office in Los Angeles [(213) 897-3544] or in San Francisco [(415) 703-2074].

Within ten days from the date of this order, any person or representative of an entity¹² interested in monitoring or participating in this rulemaking should send a letter to the Commission's Process Office.¹¹ This letter should ask for placement on the service list for this proceeding, and state whether the person intends to "monitor" the proceeding or "participate" in the proceeding as an active party by filing written

2. Any person or representative of an entity (entity) interested in monitoring this proceeding or participating in this rulemaking as a party must send a letter to the Commission's Process Office within ten (10) days from the date of this order. The letter must ask permission to be placed on the service list for this proceeding, and state whether the person or entity intends to "monitor" or "participate" in the proceeding as an active party by filing written comments or participating in hearings, if held. A service list for this proceeding shall be created within twenty (20) days from the date of this order. Parties may obtain the service list from the Commission's web site at www.cpuc.ca.gov, or by contacting the Commission's Process Office at (415) 703-2021.

3. After the service list is distributed, persons seeking to appear as a party in this proceeding shall first obtain a copy of the service list followed by serving a written request for party status on the assigned Administrative Law judge (AL)) and all the parties on the service list. Persons seeking to monitor this proceeding shall send a written request to the Commission's Process Office asking to be accorded "Information Only" (non-party) status. An updated service list will be available from the Commission's web site and the Process Office.

4. Any party that fails to submit comments shall lose its status as a party and be placed on the "Information Only" portion of the service list.

5. The category of this rulemaking is preliminarily determined to be "quasilegislative" as that term is defined in Rule 5(d) of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (Rule).

6. We preliminarily determine that there is no need for hearings in this rulemaking to receive either "adjudicative facts" or "legislative facts" as these terms are defined in Rules 8(f)(1) and 8(f)(2).

7. Written comments on matters within the scope of this proceeding shall be served on the other parties and shall be filed with the Commission's Docket Office on April 10, 1998. Reply comments shall be served and filed on April 24, 1998. Parties filing comments shall serve their comments on the assigned ALJ and the Director of the Telecommunications Division.

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GENERAL ORDER NO. 77-K (Supersedes General Order No. 77-J)

Public Utilities Commission of the State of California

IN THE MATTER OF THE FILING WITH THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMIS-SION BY PUBLIC UTILITIES OF DATA ON COMPENSATION, DUES, DONA-TIONS, SUBSCRIPTIONS, CONTRIBUTIONS AND LEGAL FEES.

Adopted March 19, 1986 Effective March 19, 1986 Resolution No. F-615

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, That each public utility having gross annual operating revenues of more than \$500,000 but less than \$1 million is directed and required to prepare and file with the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California on or before March 31 of each and every year a statement showing for the preceding calendar year.

- (a) the names titles and duties of all Executive officers and the compensation received by each such Executive Officer; "Executive Officer" includes the President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Vice President in charge of a principal business unit, division or function of the respondent. It also includes any other person who performs policy making functions and is employed by the respondent; and
- (b) the names, titles and duties of all employees other than the officers named above who received compensation at the rate of \$40,000 or more per annum, and the compensation received by each such employee; and
- (c) the amount of the expense account, any contingent fees or other
 - moneys directly or indirectly paid to each such officer and employee named in the statement.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, That each public utility having gross annual operating revenues of \$1 million but less than \$1 billion is directed and required to prepare and file with the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California on or before March 31, of each and every year a statement showing for the preceding calendar year.

(a) the names, titles, and duties of all Executive Officers and the compensation received by each such Executive Officer; "Executive Officer" includes the President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Vice President in charge of a principal business unit, division, or function of the respondent. It also includes any other person who performs policy making functions and is employed by the respondent; and

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(b) the total payments to attorneys, including all attorneys who are on the payroll of the reporting public utility or who are on the payroll of or receiving payment from any corporation affiliated with the reporting public utility; the name of each attorney or legal firm receiving such payment; and the amount of, and account charged, for the total amount paid to each of said attorneys or legal firms; and

(c) utilities conducting more than one type of utility or nonutility operation shall report the information relating to dues, donations, subscriptions, contributions, and payments to attorneys and legal firms on a total company basis, segregated by type of operations.

GENERAL ORDER No. 104-A (Supersades General Order No. 104)

Public Utilities Commission of the State of California

FILING OF ANNUAL REPORTS BY PUBLIC UTILITIES

Adopted April 25, 1967. Effective July 14, 1967. (Decision He. 72330. Case He. 4724 & Case He. 7234)

Sec. 1. Pursuant to the provisions of Sections 581, 582 and 584 of the Public Utilities Code,

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IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that each public utility now subject, or which hereafter may become subject, to the jurisdiction of this Commission shall file with the Commission an annual report of its operations in such form and content and in such number of copies as the Commission may prescribe. The report shall be verified under penalty of perjury and signed by the owner of the public utility, if an individual; by a partner, if a partnership; or, if a corporation, by the president, secretary, or officer having control of the accounting of such corporation. A warehouseman authorized by the Commission to maintain records on a fiscal year basis shall file the report for each fiscal year within 90 days after the close of the fiscal year. Every other utility shall file the report for each calendar year on or before March 31st of the following year, or such other date as the Commission may designate.

Sec. 2. (a) Except as otherwise provided in this General Order, every gas, electric, telephone, telegraph, water or heat utility (all hereinafter in this Section 2 called "the utility"), whose gross annual operating revenues or the aggregate of such revenues and the gross annual operating revenues of the California public utility operations of its affiliated or associated companies, as defined herein, exceed \$50,000, shall include in its annual report a statement of any material financial interest, as hereinafter defined, of the following persons in any transaction involving the purchase of materials and equipment or the contracting, arranging or paying for construction, maintenance work or service of any kind to which the utility has been a party during the year covered by the annual report, or to which the utility proposed, at the conclusion of such year, to become a party:

(1) If the utility is a corporation, any director, nominee for election to director, or officer thereof, and any person or other legal entity being the record owner or known by the utility to be the beneficial owner of securities having ten percent or more of the voting power in the utility;

(2) If the utility is a copartnership, any partner, general or limited, thereof;

(3) If the utility is a sole proprietorship, the proprietor thereof;

(4) Any associated or affiliated company of the utility. An associated or affiliated company means any company or person whether or not engaged in public utility operations that directly or (3) The transaction or series of transactions specified did not, or will not, exceed \$30,000, or ten percent of the utility's total operating expenses for the report year, whichever is less.

(d) If no material financial interest, as required by this General Order to be reported, existed during the report year or if the utility did not propose at the conclusion of the report year to become a party to any transaction involving such material financial interest, such fact shall be stated in the report.

(e) Any corporation, otherwise subject to the requirements of this Section 2, whose capital stock, or that of its parent company:

(1) Is listed on a "national securities exchange," as defined in the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (15 U.S.C. 78(a), et seq.), in lieu of the statements above specified shall submit with its annual report a copy of the latest proxy statement sent to stockholders by it or its parent company, or

(2) Is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) pursuant to the provisions of Section 12(g) of said Securities Exchange Act of 1934, in lieu of the statements above specified shall submit with its annual report a copy of its latest proxy statements sent to stockholders by it or its parent company, containing the information required by the rules of the SEC.

Sec. 3. The failure to file an annual report in accordance with the requirements of this General Order will subject a public utility to the penalties and sanctions provided by the Public Utilities Code.

Sec. 4. The Secretary of the Commission is directed to cause a copy of this General Order to be served upon each public utility subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

This General Order shall become effective on the 14th day of July, 1967.

General Order No. 104 is hereby canceled on the 14th day of July, 1967.
