#### Abstract

RESOLUTION SR-89. APPORTIONING RAILROAD CROSSING PROTECTION MAINTENANCE COSTS BETWEEN THE RAILROADS AND THE CITIES AND COUNTIES: SSUPPLEMENTAL FOR THE NILES CANYON RAILAAY, UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD COMPANY AND MCCLOUD RAILWAY COMPANY)


## SUMMARY

Public utilities (PU) Code Section 1202.2 requires the Commission to apportion between the railroads and the affected public agencies the cost of maintenance of automatic gradecrossing protection constructed or altered after october 1 , 1965.

## BACKGROUND

PU Code Section 1231.1 requires the Department of Transportation (Caltrans) to set aside in its annual budget a minimum of $\$ 1,000,000$ into the Automatic Grade-Crossing Protection Maintenance Fund for allocation to the public Utilities Comission for the purpose of gaying to railroads the cities' and counties' share of maintaining warning devices. The maximum allocation to this fund is determined annually by the California Transportation Commission. The current allocation for this apportionment is $\$ 4,000,000$.

## DISCUSSION

By Resoluticn SR-88 dated March 18, 1997, the Commission approved crossings for inclusion in this year's Automatic Grade-Crossing Protection Maintenance Fund program. That Resolution reflected all eligible crossings for which proper and correct filings were received by the announced filing deadline. It has been brought to our attention the crossing listed on Appendix A for The Niles Canyon Railway (Pacific Locomotive Association) has been acquired from Southern Pacific Transportation Company. Two crossings on Union Pacific Railroad Company, and also a crossing on Mccloud Ratiway Company were inadvertently missed.

The percent apportionment for the public agency shown on Attachment $A$ will be applied to the maintenance bill submitted by the railroads for those crossings and will be prorated to the amount made available from the Automatic Grade-Crossing Protection Maintenance Fund. This resolution relects the corrected data submitted on behalf of the named railroads and adds the attached crossings to those approved by si-88.

## FINDINGS

We find that the apportionment listed in Attachment $A$ is reasonable.

THERBFORE, IT IS ORDBRBD that $:$
The total maintenance costs for each crossing listed in Attachment $A$ shall be divided between the railroads and the cities/counties as shown in the column headed "Maintenance Apportioned". The lability assigned to cities/counties is limited to funds set aside in the Automatic Grade-Crossing Protection Maintenance Fund for allocation by the Commission pursuant to PU Code Section 1231.1.

This resolution is effective today.
