



Respectfully shows:

An order is requested for the adoption of Supplement 8 to the  
National Motor Freight Classification HMF 100-M and to make such provisions  
applicable to the Commission's Transition Tariffs, Minimum Rate Tariffs  
and to the tariffs of highway common carriers and express corporations, which  
participate in and are listed in its Classification under authority of power

of attorney. It is further requested that such authorization be concurrent with the national effective date of February 14, 1987; that it be granted on one day's notice; that all common carriers be authorized and directed to establish such changes as may be prescribed in class and commodity rates and charges in connection with the transportation of exempt commodities; that common carriers be authorized to depart from Sections 460 and 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code and appropriate long and short haul provisions of the Constitution of the State of California to the extent necessary to carry into effect such changes; that all such changes be approved and adopted for application with the various transition tariffs; that any related revisions in numbering, referencing or format in the various tariffs, incidental to such changes, be authorized and established; and for such other and further orders as may be deemed reasonable and proper.

## II

The Commission heretofore has prescribed minimum rates, rules and regulations for the transportation of property over the public highways of this State by highway carriers, which rates, rules and regulations are contained in Transition Tariffs 1-B, 2, 9-B, 11-A, 15 and 19 and Exception Ratings Tariff 1. Said tariffs make reference to the Governing Classification. Such reference is typically designated as follows:

"GOVERNING CLASSIFICATION means  
National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-G."

Highway common carriers and express corporations are operating as common carriers pursuant to the authority of the Commission and in accordance with tariffs filed with this Commission; which tariffs are also subject to and governed by the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-M

and supplements thereto.

### III

The governing classification is periodically revised to correct technical inadvertencies and omissions that have been discovered in the publication of prior supplements and in order to keep the publication responsive to the current conditions and needs of commerce in the transportation of property by highway carriers. The procedures available to shippers and carriers to initiate such revisions and to otherwise protect their interests are known to the Commission and to such parties. Such procedures provide parties with "...fair and full opportunity for public hearings for determination of changes and revisions as required."

(Decision 74310 dated June 25, 1968, and as revised and amended by Decision 87493 dated June 21, 1977). To properly reflect intended results following such processes, the National Motor Freight Traffic Association, Inc., Agent, has authorized revisions which are published in supplemental form set forth in Exhibit A. This supplement is scheduled to take effect February 14, 1987 unless otherwise provided therein, for application to tariffs covering areas other than California. The purpose of this filing is to obtain the authority necessary to make such provisions applicable to the Commission's minimum rate tariffs, and to promote the national uniformity and standardization in billing and collection practices found appropriate and desirable in the Commission's Decision 74310.


EXHIBIT B - Summary of Charges.

Certain changes in rates, ratings rules, regulations or charges will result from the adoption of Supplement<sup>8</sup>. A summary of such changes, including an explanation of the reasons for the proposed changes, is set forth in Exhibit B.

In addition to the justification of proposals set forth herein, Applicant refers to the facts and allegations set forth in Petition 401, as though reiterated herein. Said filings set forth the broader purposes and justifications for the program of classification revisions which will be implemented by approval of this instant filing, subject to the protection restriction suggested in the aforesaid filing.

In addition, the Commission through its Executive Director, has directed that classification changes be processed under the procedure and format of General Order 109 (see letter dated June 21, 1977). This filing is made in response to such directive.

(d) Articles must be suspended on a U-shaped interlocking corrugated fibreboard form testing not less than 200 pounds to maintain not less than 1½ inch clearance for legs. When suspension form tests not less than 275 pounds, not less than ¾ inch clearance must be maintained, OR

**Base—** Design style tray of doublewall corrugated fibreboard testing 275 pounds having a five inch depth. Skid runners constructed of fibreboard honeycomb material must be adhered to bottom of tray base.

Action was taken the result of Docket 868, Subject 18.

Item 20360, naming "Backpacks, Backpack Baby Carriers, Haversacks, Knapsacks or Pack Carriers, NOI, cotton, canvas, duck, nylon or synthetic fabric, with or without hardware attached," is amended by restricting Sub 1 to apply only on such products "without frames, folded flat" for LTL Class 85, TL Class 55, MW 24. Such amendment will cause the density based provisions of Subs 3 and 4 to apply to products not so prepared. Products whose density is less than 6 pounds per cubic foot will be afforded classes of LTL 200, TL 125, MW 10; while products whose density is 6 or greater per cubic foot will be afforded classes of LTL 125, TL 77, MW 18.

The Committee became aware of such commodities without frames, which are stuffed with paper, plastic or other materials to retain their shape for display purposes with densities ranging from 2.17 to 4.58 pcf, averaging 3.06 pcf which are not within NCC guidelines for LTL class 85. Consequently, the Committee voted to subject such products to classes based on density.

These changes result from Subject 5, Docket 868.

Item 22260 - see justification for Item 79500.

Item 36090, naming "Chimney Caps or Cowls, iron or steel, sheet or sheet and cast combined, other than rotating," with classes 125 LTL and 85 TL, and a minimum weight of 12,000 pounds, is being amended by providing different class levels for products having densities of less than 10 pcf and those having densities of 10 or greater pcf. Caps or cowls having densities of less than 10 pcf will be classed at 175 LTL and 100 TL, with a 12,000 pound minimum weight, while those having densities of 10 or greater pcf will be classed at 77½ LTL and 45 TL, with a 30,000 pound minimum weight.

The amendments to item 36090 are reflective of the following transportation characteristics. Those chimney caps or cowls with densities of less than 10 pcf range in density from 3.02 to 9.36 pcf, averaging 5.18 pcf, and those with densities of 10 or greater pcf range in density from 12.37 to 15.22 pcf, averaging 13.67 pcf. The subject chimney caps or cowls are individually packaged in fibreboard boxes with at least some being unitized on pallets or in master cartons. Stowability and handling are comparable to those of other similarly packaged general freight. No unusual liability characteristics are indicated.

Action is resultant of Docket 868, Subject 6.

Item 56150 naming "Leaves, magnolia, natural, other than fresh, in boxes" is cancelled and referenced to item 56040 naming "Flowers; Foliage; Grasses; Leaves, NOI; or Plants, Bushes, Trees, other than Christmas trees, Vines or Branches, NOI; natural, other than fresh; or artificial; including arrangements, designs, sprays or wreaths." The item is subject to a full scale of density ratings.

Item 56040 was established in July 1986. The docket which established this item combined the provisions of various flower arrangements, flowers, leaves, grasses, trees, bushes, etc. used for decorative purposes into one density item. When the change was made the item applying on magnolia leaves was inadvertently omitted from the consolidation. Since from a transportation standpoint magnolia leaves have the same transportation characteristics as other types of decorative plant leaves, the change is being made.

This is the result of Docket 868 Subject 13.

Item 56290 and new Note, item 56292 - See justification for item 68700.

Item 63472, television picture tubes, has been amended to provide for use of a new shipping container, Package 2446, as an alternate method of shipment. Package 2446 is a unitized load made up of molded plastic trays which form-fit to the configuration of the TV picture tubes. The palletized unit load is secured by use of plastic stretch film or a fibreboard shroud handed in place.

Action was taken resultant of Docket 868, Subject 14.

Items 68700, 68720, 68740, 68760, 68780, 68800 and 68840, which apply on "Figures, Images or Ornaments" made of various materials, and item 172600, applying on "Sculpture or Statuary," are being cancelled with reference to the density-based provisions of item 56290, naming "Decorations, Notions or Novelties, NOI." Concurrently, the Notes, items 172602 and 172603, are being cancelled, and a new Note, item 56292, is being added to clarify that item 56290 "[a]lso applies on Figures, Images, Ornaments, Sculpture or Statuary, other than original works of art or works of art reproduced from an original in limited quantities and so authenticated by the artist."

The subject figures, images, ornaments, sculpture or statuary exhibit an overall density range of 1.22 to 46.0 pcf. Facts of record show no meaningful correlation between the densities of these products and the materials from which they are made. Rather, the densities exhibited are a function of several factors, including the particular design or configuration and the size of the article, as well as the materials from which the article is made.

These products are shipped in fibreboard boxes which can be tiered for shipment and loaded so as to achieve maximum utilization of vehicle cube. To avoid crushing, extremely heavy freight should not be stowed on these products. While specific handling problems are not indicated, some of these products may be fragile. Handling and liability characteristics can be expected to vary with the material construction, the design and configuration, the size and weight of the particular article.

In addition to providing ratings reflective of the aforementioned transportation characteristics, the application of item 56290 to all of these products will eliminate interpretation problems which presently exist with respect to certain figures, images, ornaments, sculpture or statuary.

Action is resultant of Docket 868, Subject 7.

Item 72602 a note provision for item 72600 having application on instant tea or coffee is amended to read. "Does not apply when combined with sugar or artificial sweeteners. In such cases, apply the provisions of item 74490 naming "Beverage Preparations, NOI." Provisions will apply when inner packages contain not to exceed one envelope of dehydrated cream, one envelope of sugar and one spoon for each envelope of coffee."

The amendment to item 72602 is made for clarification purposes only. It indicates that when the product is combined with sugar or artificial sweeteners the provisions for item 74490 "Beverage Preparations, NOI" will have application. This will clarify the application of these two items.

This the the result of Docket 868 Subject 11.

Item 79500 naming "Hampers, clothes, aluminum, fibre, reed, steel or wood, separate or combined, or combined with fibreboard or plastic, NOI" is cancelled and referenced to item 22260 which will read "Baskets, Hampers or Jardinieres, NOI, bamboo, grass, rattan, reed, straw, twisted paper fibre, willow, wood or other vegetable or wood fibre, or Hampers, clothes, aluminum, or steel, separate or combined, or combined with fibreboard or plastic NOI."

Item 22260 currently applies on various types of hampers made of the named materials. The amendment will incorporate clothes hampers into item 22260 since their transportation characteristics would be similar. The clothes hampers were found to have densities of 1.17 to 8.16 pounds per cubic foot (PCF) with an average of 3.47 PCF. There are no unusual handling problems and the products can be stowed in a manner similar to other boxed freight. However, the products are light weight and heavier freight should not be placed on top of the packages. The products were not found to be unusually susceptible to theft and/or damage.

This change is the result of Docket 868 Subject 4.

Items 103090 and 103092 having application to "Insulating Material Cellular Vitreous" are cancelled with reference to item 103300 "Insulating Material, NOI" and will establish classes dependent on the density of the product rather than the presently applicable single level of classes. This change is to better reflect the density characteristics of the commodity which can range from 1 to 8.2 pounds per cubic foot, as well as to reflect that the lighter density products are much more subject to breakage in transit. This change is the result of Docket 868, Subject 12.

Item 172600, and the Notes, items 172602 and 172603 - See justification for item 68700.

Package 64F has been amended to provide for the use of an alternate style of shipping container construction. Where previously only a container of regular slotted construction was authorized, new or half-slotted container having a bottom tray is permitted. Package 64F is used for the movement of swivel chairs.

Action was resultant of Docket 868, Subject 15.

Package 133F has been amended to decrease the height of the fibreboard tray used as the base of the shipping container, from 6 inches to 5 inches. It has been concluded that the performance of the container will not be adversely affected. Package 133F is used for the transportation of wooden office furniture.

Action was resultant of Docket 868, Subject 16.

Package 2406 has been amended to reduce the required inner clearance between the article's side and the inside wall of the container from 1 inch to 3/4 inch. A foam plastic inner form has been added for sidewall protection to compensate for the clearance reduction. The proposal was supported by successful laboratory testing and field shipments conducted under the provisions of Test Shipment Permit T-861-3.

Action was resultant of Docket 868, Subject 17.
