

Respectfully shows:

Highway common carriers and express corporations are operating as common carriers pursuant to the authority of the Commission and in accordance with tariffs filed with this Commission; which tariffs are also subject to and governed by the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-M and supplements thereto.

## II

An order is requested for the adoption of Supplement 9 to the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-M and to make such provisions applicable to the tariffs of highway common carriers and express corporations, which participate in and are listed in its Classification under authority of power of attorney. It is further requested that such authorization be concurrent with the national effective date of March 14, 1987 on one day's notice; that all common carriers be authorized and directed to establish such changes as may be prescribed in class and commodity rates and charges in connection with the transportation of exempt commodities; that common carriers be authorized to depart from Sections 460 and 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code and appropriate long and short haul provisions of the Constitution of the State of California to the extent necessary to carry into effect such changes; that all such changes be approved and adopted for application with the various tariffs; that any related revisions in numbering, referencing or format in the various tariffs, incidental to such changes, be authorized and established; and for such other and further orders as may be deemed reasonable and proper.

## III

The governing classification is periodically revised to correct technical inadvertencies and omissions that have been discovered in the publication of prior supplements and in order to keep the publication responsive to the current conditions and needs of commerce in the transportation of property by highway carriers. The procedures available to shippers and carriers to initiate such revisions and to otherwise protect their interests are known to the Commission and to such parties. Such procedures provide parties with

"...fair and full opportunity for public hearings for determination of changes and revisions as required." (Decision 74310 dated June 25, 1968, and as revised and amended by Decision 87498 dated June 21, 1977). To properly reflect intended results following such processes, the National Motor Freight Traffic Association, Inc., Agent, has authorized revisions which are published in supplemental form set forth in Exhibit A. This supplement is scheduled to take effect March 14, 1987 unless otherwise provided therein, for application to tariffs covering areas other than California. The purpose of this filing is to obtain the authority necessary to make such provisions applicable to tariffs subject to jurisdiction of the California Public Utilities Commission and to promote the national uniformity and standardization in billing and collection practices found appropriate and desirable in the Commission's Decision 74310.

Attached hereto and by this reference made a part of this filing are the following exhibits detailing such revisions:

EXHIBIT A - Copy of Supplement <sup>9</sup> to National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100- H

EXHIBIT B - Summary of changes

Certain changes in rates, ratings rules, regulations or charges will result from the adoption of Supplement <sup>9</sup>. A summary of such changes, including an explanation of the reasons for the proposed changes, is set forth in Exhibit B.

In addition to the justification of proposals set forth herein, Applicant refers to the facts and allegations set forth in Petition 401, as though reiterated herein. Said filings set forth the broader purposes and justifications for the program of classification revisions which will be

implemented by approval of this instant filing, subject to the protection restriction suggested in the aforesaid filing.

In addition, the Commission through its Executive Director, has directed that classification changes be processed under the procedure and format of General Order 109 (see letter dated June 21, 1977). This filing is made in response to such directive.

Clearance of not less than  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch must be maintained between the article and the inner surfaces of the container by full-height L-shaped corner posts made of built-up corrugated fibreboard, the facings and corrugated medium weighing not less than 26 pounds per 1,000 square feet, except when corner posts are reinforced with a laminated ply of wood veneer, facings and corrugated medium may weigh not less than 17 pounds per 1,000 square feet. Clearance is not required between rear of article and inside wall of container for chest type freezers having rear hinges.

Top of article must be protected with a fibreboard tray or a plastic foam pad secured in place top center of article or built-up fibreboard pad to provide not less than  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch clearance between top of article and inner walls of container. Top flaps must be not less than six inches in width. When lengthwise flaps do not meet, a full dimension top cover pad of the same test as container or of doublewall 200 pound test corrugated fibreboard must be placed over the product and the corner posts. Top flaps must be securely closed and anchored to the top pad.

Interior forms which contact or can come in contact with painted surfaces of the article must be coated with nonabrasive coating.

Listed below is a summary of changes being proposed in the supplement. The symbol "\*" indicates a proposed new item. Following the summary list will be found an explanation of each change or addition together with the National Classification Committee's reasons for the proposed change or addition. For simplicity the following abbreviations are utilized: LTL (Less Than Truckload); TL (Truckload); MW (Minimum Weight Factor); AQ (Any Quantity); PCF (Pounds Per Cubic Foot).

Item 49120, naming "Cloth, cotton, fireproofed, oiled or waterproofed, not coated, NOI," with classes of 85 LTL and 55 TL, and a 30,000 pound minimum weight, is being amended to apply on noncoated fire resistant, water resistant or oiled cloth, fabric or piece goods made from synthetic fibres as well as from cotton. The item is being restricted to woven material which is not used in the manufacture of clothing. As amended, item 49120 will read, "Cloth, Fabric or Piece Goods, NOI, other than for the manufacture of clothing; cotton or synthetic fibre, separate or combined, woven, fire resistant, water resistant or oiled, not coated." The classes in the item will be reduced to 65 LTL and 40 TL, while the minimum weight remains at 30,000 pounds.

Information of record pertaining to noncoated cotton or synthetic fibre fire resistant or water resistant material reveals densities ranging from 5.10 to 47.33 pcf, with an average of 30.04 pcf. This material is packaged in a variety of ways, including burlap-covered rolls, rolls in fibreboard boxes and flat sheets in fibreboard boxes. There is some palletization. Although no unusual stowing problems are indicated, boxed freight generally provides a better load-bearing surface for other freight than do rolls. Boxed freight may also be more compatible with other freight transported. No unusual handling characteristics are indicated. As to liability, this material is not unusually susceptible to theft, nor is it likely to damage other freight. Generally, this material is not prone to damage, but some, such as certain ceramic cloth or fabric, is reported to be fragile. While a claims problem was not revealed on this record, historical claims data shows that textiles of all types are not claim-free. While values as low as \$1.16 per pound are revealed for the involved fire resistant or water resistant material, carbon or ceramic cloth or fabric exhibits values of \$25.00 to \$200.00 per pound.

A new Note, item 49121, is being added to clarify the application of item 49120.

Item 49210, naming "Cloth or Fabric, other than with pile or loop surfaces; coated with aluminum, plastic, pyroxylin or rubber, or pyroxylin processed other than by coating, NOI," with classes of 65 LTL and 40 TL, and a 30,000 pound minimum weight, is being amended by deleting "or pyroxylin processed other than by coating." The item will, thus, apply only on coated material. The classes and minimum weight in the item will be unchanged.

Action is resultant of Docket 869, Subject 4.

Item 63035, Television Sets, has been amended to reference a new Package as an alternate shipping container. Concurrently, a new Package 979 has been established describing a two piece fibreboard box consisting of a half-slotted body and bottom cap. Package 829 remains referenced in item 63035 and remains as currently published. Package 979 provides for necessary protection required of the larger 45 and 50 inch screen televisions which are being marketed today.

Action was taken resultant of Docket 869, Subject 11.

Note, item 72007 to the Foodstuffs Group and items: 89150, Pop Corn; 141760, Nuts, edible; 141820, Peanuts; 145100, Oil, Cooking or Salad; and 170820, Chili Powder have been amended to reference Package 2330 as an alternate method of shipping. Package 2330 serves as a unitized pallet load for transportation purposes, which at the retailer level, acts as an end-of-aisle display unit. The pallet load consists of fibreboard trays of canned food products unitized by use of stretch or shrink film.

Action was resultant of Docket 869, Subject 6.

Item 82030, Sub 1, describing Surgeons' Tables, has been amended to reference a new Package as an alternate method of shipment. Concurrently, a new Package has been established describing a half-slotted container of doublewall corrugated fibreboard. Package 137F, as assigned, has a wooden base whereby the article is held in position by use of wooden cleats. The solid decking prevents underside damage normally caused by fork lift handling. Field shipments were conducted under the provisions of Test Shipment Permit T-8511-44.

Action was resultant of Docket 869, Subject 7.

Item 89150 - See explanation for Item 72007.

Item 141760 - See explanation for Item 72007.

Item 145100 - See explanation for Item 72007.

Item 149980, Sub 2, Paint and related material, has been amended by referencing Package 2440 as an alternate method of shipment. Package 2440 has served successfully as a shipping container for several products which are liquid in nature. The container is a bulk style fibreboard box having a pallet base capable of containing 4000 pounds and having a capacity of 300 gallons. The container is outfitted with a heavy duty plastic film bladder which contains the liquid. Field testing was accomplished under the issuance of Test Shipment Permit T-8610-46.

Action taken was resultant of Docket 869, Subject 8.

Item 170820 - See explanation for Item 72007.

Item 199230, describing Pencil Slats, has been amended to reference a new Package as an alternate form of shipment. Concurrently, a new Package has been established describing a fibreboard box of lighter weight construction, namely Package 2447. The fibreboard box which functions primarily as a method of unitization only and not for purposes of cushioning, puncture resistance, compression strength, etc., was successfully tested under the provisions of Test Shipment Permit T-867-33.

Action was resultant of Docket 869, Subject 10.

Package 979 - See explanation for Item 63035.

Package 1019 has been amended to allow for the fibreboard top cap to be constructed of 275 pound test. Previous action amended Package 1019 allowing for tube and cap style construction, however, the interpretation problem involving the bursting strength of the top cap was not addressed. This follow-up action clarifies the earlier intent. Package 1019 is used exclusively for the shipment of household appliances. Action was resultant of Docket 869, Subject 9.
