Highway common carriers and express corporations are operating as common carriers pursuant to the authority of the Commission and in accordance with tariffs filed with this Commission; which tariffs are also subject to and governed by the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-N and supplements thereto.

## II

An order is requested for the adoption of Supplement 2 to the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-N and to make such provisions applicable to the tariffs of highway common carriers and express corporations, which participate in and are listed in its Classification under authority of power of attorney. It is further requested that such authorization be concurrent with the national effective date of May 23, 1987 on one day's notice; that all common carriers be authorized and directed to establish such changes as may be prescribed in class and commodity rates and charges in connection with the transportation of exempt commodities; that common carriers be authorized to depart from Sections 460 and 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code and appropriate long and short haul provisions of the Constitution of the State of California to the extent necessary to carry into effect such changes; that all such changes be approved and adopted for application with the various tariffs; that any related revisions in numbering, referencing or format in the various tariffs, incidental to such changes, be authorized and established; and for such other and further orders as may be deemed reasonable and proper.

## III

The governing classification is periodically revised to correct technical inadvertencies and omissions that have been discovered in the publication of prior supplements and in order to keep the publication responsive to the current conditions and needs of commerce in the transportation of property by highway carriers. The procedures available to shippers and carriers to initiate such revisions and to otherwise protect their interests are known to the Commission and to such parties. Such procedures provide parties with

"...fair and full opportunity for public hearings for determination of changes and revisions as required." (Decision 74310 dated June 25, 1968, and as revised and amended by Decision 87498 dated June 21, 1977). To properly reflect intended results following such processes, the National Motor Freight Traffic Association, Inc., Agent, has authorized revisions which are published in supplemental form set forth in Exhibit A. This supplement is scheduled to take effect May 23, 1987 unless otherwise provided therein, for application to tariffs covering areas other than California. The purpose of this filing is to obtain the authority necessary to make such provisions applicable to tariffs subject to jurisdiction of the California Public Utilities Commission and to promote the national uniformity and standardization in billing and collection practices found appropriate and desirable in the Commission's Decision 74310.

Attached hereto and by this reference made a part of this filing are the following exhibits detailing such revisions:

EXHIBIT A - Copy of Supplement 2 to National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-N

EXHIBIT B - Summary of changes

Certain changes in rates, ratings rules, regulations or charges will result from the adoption of Supplement 2. A summary of such changes, including an explanation of the reasons for the proposed changes, is set forth in Exhibit B.



Ladies and Gentlemen:

Listed below is a summary of changes being proposed in the supplement. The symbol "\*" indicates a proposed new item. Following the summary list will be found an explanation of each change or addition together with the National Classification Committee's reasons for the proposed change or addition. For simplicity the following abbreviations are utilized: LTL (Less Than Truckload); TL (Truckload); MW (Minimum Weight Factor); AQ (Any Quantity); PCF (Pounds Per Cubic Foot).

New item 13491 is added to the Classification to provide a specific provision for "Grids, waffle baking, cast, unfinished, in boxes" at class 85 LTL and 45 TL, with a minimum weight of 30,000 pounds. These articles were previously subject to the provisions of item 13120, "Aluminum Articles, NOI" with classes of 100 LTL, 77 1/2 TL and 14 MW.

This amendment is reflective of the following transportation characteristics: the density of these articles was found to be 11.72 pcf; the articles are packaged in a fibreboard container which is banded to a skid. The weight of each package is 750 pounds, indicating that mechanical equipment is required for loading and unloading; indications are that due to the dimensions of this package, optimum use of the trailer cube cannot be achieved, except in newer equipment; and, no unusual liability characteristics exist.

This change is the result of Docket 872, Subject 5.

Item 17480, naming "Tables, table tennis, KD, with or without tops," is being amended to remove the obsolete terminology "with or without tops." Additionally, new sub provisions are being established for KD tables with classes of LTL 200, TL 100 and MW 12. These products currently move subject to classes of LTL 85, TL 55 and MW 24. There is no change in the currently applicable classes for KD flat tables. } change in class

Information of record indicates that table tennis tables no longer move without tops. KD tables range in density from 2.94 to 5.20 pcf, with an average density of 3.99 pcf. KD flat tables range in density from 16.33 to 21.43 pcf, with an average density of 18.2 pcf. All tables are shipped in boxes measuring 4 to 5 feet in two dimensions, which may necessitate the use of mechanical equipment or extra carrier personnell when loading or unloading. There is no indication of unusual stowability or liability characteristics for these commodities. One claim of \$800 was reported, based on values ranging from \$1.97 to \$2.90 per pound, with an average value of \$2.44 per pound.

These changes are the result of Docket 872, Subject 10.

Item 22000 naming "Barricades, street or highway, rubber, metal reinforced, KD," is amended through the addition of a new Note, providing "Does not apply on highway maintenance vehicle protection cushions or devices." The note is added for clarification purposes only, in light of indications that these highway maintenance vehicle protection cushions, which absorb the impact of errant vehicles, were being classified per item 22000. These devices are designed to attach to a highway maintenance vehicle to protect work crews when the vehicle is used as a barricade. The cushion is intended to absorb the impact of an errant vehicle, thereby protecting the maintenance vehicle which serves as the barricade. Their density was found to be 4.89 pcf.

This is the result of Docket 872, Subject 8.

Item 70260, naming "Floats, net, seine or lifeline," is amended to provide two separate sub provisions for plastic floats. Sub 4 provides for noninflatable plastic floats and inflatable plastic floats shipped inflated at the currently applicable class 150 LTL, 100 TL and 10 MW. Sub 5 provides for inflatable plastic floats shipped deflated at class 85 LTL, 55 TL and 24 MW.

The amendments to item 70260 are reflective of the following transportation characteristics for deflated plastic floats: density ranges from 8.5 to 20.8 pcf, with an average of 13.8 pcf; the articles are packaged in fibreboard cartons ranging in size from 1.8 to 35.2 cubic feet and in weight from 26.5 to 113.5 pounds, neither of which present handling problems in motor carrier service; the articles are packaged in regularly shaped cartons, allowing for near maximum utilization of equipment cube; and, no unusual liability characteristics are indicated.

Action is resultant of Docket 872, Subject 4.

Item 73740, Macaroni, Noodles, Spaghetti or Varnicelli, cooked has been amended to authorize the use of Package 2375 as an alternate shipping container. Package 2375 is a fibreboard tray with a plastic film overwrap containing glass inner containers. Test shipping experience was conducted under the provisions of Test Shipment Permit T-871-1.

Action was resultant of Docket 872, Subject 12.

Item 75320, Canned Vegetables, has been amended to allow for the use of a new method of packaging, a unitized pallet load of cans tiered in layers on a wooden pallet and secured by stretch wrapping with plastic film. Designated as Package 2450, the concept has been authorized for TL only. Testing was completed under Test Shipment Permit T-8610-49.

Action resulted from Docket 872, Subject 13.

Item 79505, naming "Hampers, clothes, with steel sides, ends and bottom and wooden joining members, with or without fibreboard or plastic components," has been cancelled as it is obsolete. A survey of Continuing Traffic Studies revealed no movement of these commodities, and the one known manufacturer indicated that it no longer manufactures this type of clothes hamper.

This change is the result of Docket 872, Subject 9.

Item 108065 is a new item which provides a specific description for "Kits, craft, NOI," with classes reflective of the density of the particular Kits as prepared for shipment. Classes of 400 AQ are assigned to articles having a density of "less than 1"; Classes of 300 AQ when density is "1 but less than 2"; Classes of 250 AQ when density is "2 but less than 4"; Classes of 150 LTL, 200 TL, MW 12,000 lbs. when density is 4 but less than 6"; Classes of 125 LTL, 85 TL, MW 15,000 lbs. when density is "6 but less than 8"; Classes of 100 LTL, 70 TL, MW 18,000 lbs. when density is "8 but less than 10"; Classes of 92 1/2 LTL, 65 TL, MW 20,000 lbs. when density is "10 but less than 12"; Classes of 85 LTL, 55 TL, MW 26,000 lbs. when density is "12 but less than 15"; and Classes of 70 LTL, 40 TL, MW 36,000 lbs. when density is "15 or greater." Density based classes are assigned to reflect a range in density of 3.9 to 38.7 pounds per cubic foot. Also, the contents of any particular shipment will vary depending on the mixture of Kits ordered.

Concurrently, Note, item 108066, is added to allow shipments to be "bumped" to the next lower class if such is to the shipper's advantage.

These additions are the result of Docket 871, Subject 17.

Note, item 156602, has been amended to allow a departure from the packaging requirements of item 156600, "Plastic Articles, other than expanded, NOI," for certain flexible plastic fencing or mesh. The amendment to the Note states that "flexible plastic fencing or mesh, produced by a stretching and extruding process, may be shipped in bundles or rolls."

The involved fencing and mesh, based on their material construction and intended uses, are durable, and these forms of packaging should provide adequate protection during shipment. The products should not present any unusual stowing or handling problems.

Action taken is the result of Docket 871, Subject 27.

Item 190240, naming "Chairs, rolling or invalid, motor propelled," is being amended by the addition of a new sub provision, designated as Sub 4, to embrace these chairs "with batteries," with classes of LTL 100, TL 70 and 16 MW. Presently, these chairs when shipped without batteries are specifically provided for in item 190240. However, when shipped with batteries, these chairs are classified, by analogy per item 190230, "Cars, electric, NOI," with classes of LTL 100, TL 70 and MW 16.

Information of record for motor propelled wheelchairs with batteries reveals densities ranging from 7.76 pcf to 15.69 pcf, with an average density of 11.3 pcf. No unusual handling or stowing characteristics were indicated. As to liability, these chairs are not unusually susceptible to theft, prone to damage, likely to damage other commodities with which transported or perishable. While these chairs, when shipped with batteries, are not prone to spontaneous combustion or explosion, care must be exercised due to the battery and its contents. There is no indication of a claims problem and the value was found to range from \$7.64 to \$18.81 per pound, with an average of \$11.85 per pound.

This change is the result of Docket 872, Subject 11.

Package 2257 has been amended to allow for inner containers of other than metal or glass construction to also be permitted. Package 2257 was previously restricted to metal or glass inner containers. Fibre cans or molded plastic containers were not authorized. This action helped to update the Classification in that fibre composite and plastic containers have long been recognized as allowable inner containers for similar shipping containers as well as tray/film packages.

Action was resultant of Docket 872, Subject 14.
