Respectfully shows:

Highway common carriers and express corporations are operating as common carriers pursuant to the authority of the Commission and in accordance with tariffs filed with this Commission; which tariffs are also subject to and governed by the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-N and supplements thereto.

An order is requested for the adoption of Supplement 5 to the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-N and to make such provisions applicable to the tariffs of highway common carriers and express corporations. which participate in and are listed in its Classification under authority of power of attorney. It is further requested that such authorization be concurrent August 22, 1987 with the national effective date of on one day's notice; that all common carriers be authorized and directed to establish such changes as may be prescribed in class and commodity rates and charges in connection with the transportation of exempt commodities; that common carriers be authorized to depart from Sections 460 and 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code and appropriate long and short haul provisions of the Constitution of the State of California to the extent necessary to carry into effect such changes; that all such changes be approved and adopted for application with the various tariffs; that any related revisions in numbering, referencing or format in the various tariffs, incidental to such changes, be authorized and established; and for such other and further orders as may be deemed reasonable and proper.

III

The governing classification is periodically revised to correct technical inadvertencies and omissions that have been discovered in the publication of prior supplements and in order to keep the publication responsive to the current conditions and needs of commerce in the transportation of property by highway carriers. The procedures available to shippers and carriers to initiate such revisions and to otherwise protect their interests are known to the Commission and to such parties. Such procedures provide parties with

"...fair and full opportunity for public hearings for determination of changes and revisions as required." (Decision 74310 dated June 25, 1968, and as revised and amended by Decision 87498 dated June 21, 1977). To properly reflect intended results following such processes, the National Motor Freight Traffic Association, Inc., Agent, has authorized revisions which are published in supplemental form set forth in Exhibit A. This supplement is scheduled to take effect August 22, 1987 unless otherwise provided therein, for application to tariffs covering areas other than California. The purpose of this filing is to obtain the authority necessary to make such provisions applicable to tariffs subject to jurisdiction of the California Public Utilities Commission and to promote the national uniformity and standardization in billing and collection practices found appropriate and desirable in the Commission's Decision 74310.

Attached hereto and by this reference made a part of this filing are the following exhibits detailing such revisions:

Certain changes in rates, ratings rules, regulations or charges will result from the adoption of Supplement <u>5</u>. A summary of such changes, including an explanation of the reasons for the proposed changes, is set forth in Exhibit B.

In addition to the justification of proposals set forth herein, Applicant refers to the facts and allegations set forth in Petition 401, as though reiterated herein. Said filings set forth the broader purposes and justifications for the program of classification revisions which will be

implemented by approval of this instant filing, subject to the protection restriction suggested in the aforecited filing.

In addition, the Commission through its Executive Director, has directed that classification changes be processed under the procedure and format of General Order 109 (see letter dated June 21, 1977). This filing is made in response to such directive.

#Package 138F

(Add 'Package 188F' to page 847 of the classification.)
SHIPPING CONTAINER:

Article must be positioned in a bottom tray and capped with a top tray (common bottom tray and top cap), with vertical corner posts and pads positioned and maintained with stretch wrap.

Trays—Design style of corrugated fibreboard testing not less than 200 pounds having a depth of not less than four inches. Top and Boltom Pads— Article must rest on and be covered on top by a full dimension pad of honeycomb fabricated fibreboard sheet of one inch in thickness having a 😘 inch cellular atructure. Bottom pad must be outlitted with honeycomb skid runners to facilitate handling by fork lift equipment.

Corner Posts— Full-height L-shaped honeycomb corner posts must be positioned at each vertical corner of article. Corner posts must extend four inches in each direction and be of 1% inches in thickness, having % inch cellular structure.

Center Pads-- Full-height honeycomb pads of four inches in width and 1% inches in thickness having % inch cellular

structure must be vertically positioned on all finished surfaces with apertures not to exceed 16 inches in width.

Film Wrap—Article and shipping container components must be girth wrapped with plastic stretch film so as to provide not tess than five plies of film, each ply having a thickness of .9 mit.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Listed below is a summary of changes being proposed in the supplement. The symbol "*" indicates a proposed new item. Following the summary list will be found an explanation of each change or addition together with the National Classification Committee's reasons for the proposed change or addition. For simplicity the following abbreviations are utilized: LTL (Less Than Truckload); TL (Truckload); MW (Minimum Weight Factor); AQ (Any Quantity); PCF (Pounds Per Cubic Foot).

New item 53030 is added to the Classification to provide a specific provision for "Coolers or Refrigerators, plastic, with or without metal lining, thermoelectric type, with power supply cord, without compressors or coils, hand portable, see Note, item 53031, in boxes" at class 110 LTL, 77 1/2 TL and MN 18. In the interest of tariff clarification, a new Note, item 53031, is also added specifying that item 53030 "Applies only on plastic insulated coolers or coolers and heaters combined, which utilize a thermoelectric module to provide refrigeration or heating. Provisions do not apply on portable refrigerators which utilize a compressor and cooling coils."

Information of record provides the following data on the transportation characteristics of these coolers. Their density was found to range from 4.82 to 14.28 pcf, with an average of 8.66 pcf. The coolers are shipped in fibreboard boxes and exhibit no unusual stowability or handling characteristics, although if the packages are not unitized, additional time and labor may be required when loading and unloading as the boxes are generally one to two cubic feet in dimension. No unusual liability or claims problems were indicated. Their value was found to range from \$4.00 to \$4.64 per pound, averaging \$4.43 per pound.

This change is the result of action taken on Subject 3 of Docket 874.

Item 72600, instant coffee or tea, has been amended to reference Package 2375 as an authorized method of shipment. Package 2375 is one of several styles of display packages that are increasingly popular with retailers. This package provides for glass jars not exceeding 48 ounces to have glass to glass contact in a shrink film enclosed corrugated fibreboard tray. The trays may be unitized and secured to a pallet, providing for a retail display unit as well as a shipping container. Package 2375 is used to ship a variety of foodstuffs, including salad dressing, jams and jellies, fruit juice, peanut butter and table sauces, all liquid or semi-liquid by nature. Extending its application to shipments of instant coffee or tea in their dry form was found to be consistent with the NCC's packaging policies.

Action taken is the result of Docket 874, Subject 12.

Item 79000, the generic heading of the Furniture Group, has been amended by referencing a new Note, item 79030, which would be applicable to all furniture packages of the F or S designation when the outside shipping container is constructed of corrugated fibreboard. The note provides that these packages may utilize expanded plastic foam interior corner, edge or flat spacer pads of any desired polymer derivative providing certain conditions are met. The minimum foam thickness must not

be less than 3/4 inch, or when laminated to fibreboard, not less than 5/8 inch in thickness. The foam must meet the "Compression Set" and "Cushioning" tests outlined by ASTM procedures. The expanded polystyrene foam that meets these conditions has been found to be superior to similar conventional foams, since a new method of fusing the granules of polystyrene has been developed. The foam pads meeting the required conditions must state that they meet the requirements of this Note by being marked as, "NMFC, Note, item 79030."

Action taken is the result of Docket 874, Subject 10.

Items 79740, Beds (ends and rails); 80000, Bookcases, sectional, with or without desk; 80020, Bookcases, other than sectional; 80080, Credenzas, buffets; 80120, Chest of drawers, lowboys and highboys, night stands, bureaus, armoires; 80270, Filing cabinets; 80470, Cabinets or Lockers, storage or wardrobe; 81200, Desks, with one or more enclosed pedestals; 81250, Desks, NOI, wooden; 82130, Tables, wooden; and 82270, Wood Furniture, NOI have been amended to reference new Package, 138F, as an authorized shipping container.

The new package consists of top and bottom full-dimension pads of fibreboard honeycomb material 1 1/2 inches in thickness, with a corrugated fibreboard tray placed over the top and bottom of both article and pad. Honeycomb corner posts and flat face pads are held in place by girth-wrapping with 5 plies of plastic stretch film. The package was proven acceptable under Test Shipment Permit T-8612-53, and has been found to offer upgraded protection in comparison with currently acceptable F packages.

Action taken is the result of Docket 874, Subject 9.

Item 125110, applying on "Bits, drilling, blast hole, rotary, with cutting heads containing rotating or moving cutter discs, reamers, rollers, cones, or other moving cutting devices," is added to the Classification. Classes of 65 LTL, 40 TL, MN 36 are assigned to bits "with carbide tips" and classes of 60 LTL, 40 TL, MN 36 for bits "Other than with carbide or industrial diamond tips." The classes assigned are reflective of a range in density of 104.5 to 125 pounds per cubic foot, a value of \$6.76 to \$42.85 per pound for carbide tipped bits and \$3.38 to \$4.43 for plain steel bits, with no record of claims for loss or damage.

This addition is the result of Docket 874, Subject 2.

Item 170580, applying on "Siding, clapboard style, plastic," is being amended to reduce the LTL class from 77 1/2 to 70 in recognition of a current average density of 18 pounds per cubic foot and no unusual handling, stowing or liability characteristics exhibited in motor common carrier service.

Note, item 170582, is being amended to clearly indicate that corner posts for installation may be included with shipments of plastic siding when not in excess of 10% of the weight upon which charges are assessed.

Changes result in reductions and reflect handling accorded Subject 7 of Docket 874.

Item 171140, Spices, NOI, has been amended to allow shipment of this product in Package 2093. Package 2093 allows glass containers not exceeding a capacity of 8 ounces to be shipped in fibreboard boxes without partitions separating the containers. This package was initially approved for the shipment of baby food, and is presently authorized for shipments of bouillon and table sauces.

Action taken is the result of Docket 874, Subject 11.

New item 174440, naming "Bowls, mixing or food preparation, in boxes," is established in the "SHEET STEEL ARTICLES" Group with classes reflective of the product's form of shipment as follows: Sub 1, not nested, class 250 AQ; Sub 2, nested, classes of LTL 77 1/2, TL 45, MN 36.

Facts reviewed by the NCC indicated that the existing "NOI" provisions of item 175120 were not appropriate for these products. Densities range from 2.32 to 4.29 pcf, averaging 3.14 pcf for not nested products, and 5.55 to 28.80 pcf, averaging 14.53 pcf for nested products. Remaining transportation characteristics revealed no abnormal or unusual characteristics.

These provisions result from Docket 874, Subject 1.

Item 174540 is amended to read "Sheet Steel Cans, ash, garbage, oiled waste, refuse, NOI, or disposal, with or without bails or covers, in packages" with classes of Less Than Truckload (LTL) 175, Truckload (TL) 100, Minimum Weight (MW) 12,000 pounds. Notes, items 174542 and 174544 are cancelled as they are no longer applicable.

This item applies on the above named sheet steel cans with the most common commodity being the household trash can. The classes published are reflective of the following transportation characteristics. These cans have an average density of 5.45 pounds per cubic foot (PCF) with a range of 2.90 to 13.80 PCF. They are shipped both in nested and not nested form. In handling and stowing, caution may be required so as to avoid damage (denting) by other freight which may be placed around them. These articles are not unusually susceptible to theft or perishability. They are not likely to damage other commodities with which they are transported, nor are they subject to spontaneous combustion or explosion. Value per pound is \$1.74 per lb., with a range of \$.55 to \$3.52 per lb.

This is the result of Docket 874, Subject 6.

New item 174625, naming "Covers or Tops, refuse or waste receptacle, with or without self-closing doors, in boxes," is added to the Sheet Steel Articles Group with

classes of LTL 250, TL 250, MM Any Quantity (AO).

This provision is the result of the NCC's review of the transportation characteristics of these products. Information received indicated a density range of 2.5 to 4.35 pcf, with an average of 3.27 pcf, and an average value per pound of \$2.96. No unusual handling or liability characteristics were indicated. As most of these products are packaged in fibreboard boxes, top loading may be required to avoid crushing.

This results from Subject 4, Docket 874.
