Respectfully shows:

Highway common carriers and express corporations are operating as common carriers pursuant to the authority of the Commission and in accordance with tariffs filed with this Commission; which tariffs are also subject to and governed by the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-N and supplements thereto.

II

An order is requested for the adoption of Supplement 8 to the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-N and to make such provisions applicable to the tariffs of highway common carriers and express corporations, which participate in and are listed in its Classification under authority of power of attorney. It is further requested that such authorization be concurrent with the national effective date of January 16, 1988 on one day's notice; that all common carriers be authorized and directed to establish such changes as may be prescribed in class and commodity rates and charges in connection with the transportation of exempt commodities; that common carriers be authorized to depart from Sections 460 and 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code and appropriate long and short haul provisions of the Constitution of the State of California to the extent necessary to carry into effect such changes; that all such changes be approved and adopted for application with the various tariffs; that any related revisions in numbering, referencing or format in the various tariffs, incidental to such changes, be authorized and established; and for such other and further orders as may be deemed reasonable and proper.

III

The governing classification is periodically revised to correct technical inadvertencies and omissions that have been discovered in the publication of prior supplements and in order to keep the publication responsive to the current conditions and needs of commerce in the transportation of property by highway carriers. The procedures available to shippers and carriers to initiate such revisions and to otherwise protect their interests are known to the Commission and to such parties. Such procedures provide parties with

"...fair and full opportunity for public hearings for determination of changes and revisions as required." (Decision 74310 dated June 25, 1968, and as revised and amended by Decision 87498 dated June 21, 1977). To properly reflect intended results following such processes, the National Motor Freight Traffic Association, Inc., Agent, has authorized revisions which are published in supplemental form set forth in Exhibit A. This supplement is scheduled to take effect January 16, 1988 unless otherwise provided therein, for application to tariffs covering areas other than California. The purpose of this filing is to obtain the authority necessary to make such provisions applicable to tariffs subject to jurisdiction of the California Public Utilities Commission and to promote the national uniformity and standardization in billing and collection practices found appropriate and desirable in the Commission's Decision 74310.

EXHIBIT B - Summary of changes



implemented by approval of this instant filing, subject to the protection restriction suggested in the aforesaid filing.

In addition, the Commission through its Executive Director, has directed that classification changes be processed under the procedure and format of General Order 109 (see letter dated June 21, 1977). This filing is made in response to such directive.

ITEM 291-A

SPECIFICATIONS FOR FIBRE BARRELS OR DRUMS FOR DRY OR SOLID ARTICLES

Subject to the provisions of Secs. 1(a) and 2 of Item 680 and to the provisions of the Hazardous Materials Tariff, and unless otherwise provided in separate descriptions of articles, when the following requirements and specifications are complied with, classes or rates applying on articles in "barrels," "drums," "pails" or "tubs" will also apply on the same articles in fibre drums, pails or tubs of the styles described in this section, respectively. Fibre barrels or drums and fibre pails and tubs may be used as shipping containers for a single movement of articles that remain dry or solid at 100° Fahrenheit (38° Celsius). After initial shipment they must not be used again for shipment of dry or solid articles after contents have been removed, except when containers and closing devices are in such condition that they will protect contents as efficiently as new containers.

(a) Fibre barrels or drums for dry or solid articles must conform with the following requirements and specifications:

(c) Sidewall must be constructed of more than one ply not spirally wound, no single ply to be less than .012 inch in thickness, in the absence of specific water proof treatment, sized to resist the effect of casual water, and all plies firmly glued together.

OR

Side-Walls may be constructed of fibreboard of single ply meeting the test requirements in paragraph (a) of this rule, with outer face waterproofed and the ends of the fibreboard forming joint or overlap must extend at least two inches beyond beginning of the overlap and must be firmly glued together throughout entire area of overlap and such overlap must be reinforced by metal rivets, staples or stitches not more than six inches apart, or must be fastened by a double row of metal rivets, staples or stitches not more than two inches apart in each row, or secured by a barbed steel strip not less than gauge 22 and not less than one inch wide extending entire length of joint with barbs pressed through fibreboard and clinched on inside.

Note 1— Cady or Mullen Testing Method for Fibre Components: Either of the following test methods may be used. When more than a single ply, test shall be determined from the summation of the tests of individual plies, or when test is made on a completed drum, the punctures shall be made from the exterior to the interior surface, in which case the average values for side-wall shall be not less than 80 percent of the values in the above table and the values for fibre tops and bottoms shall be not less than the value in the above table. There shall be a minimum of six tests and the average shall be not less than the prescribed minimum requirements.

Note 2— Top covers must be constructed of injection molded high density polyethylene or polypropylene homopolymer or copolymer and have a minimum thickness of .090 inch. Top covers must have at least two concentric rings of not less than 1/4 inch depth. Closure must be effected by a lever locking ring of 22 gauge metal or by method of covers having the ability of securely snap-lock fitting.

SPECIFICATIONS FOR NUMBERED PACKAGES

Package 1012

(Cancels 'Package 1012' from page 720 of the classification.)

1. Household refrigerators or freezers in three-piece fibreboard box consisting of tube with top and bottom flanges not less than three inches wide, and top and bottom caps having interlocking flanges.

2. Fibreboard of box must meet the following burst tests:

(a) Tube must be made of corrugated fibreboard testing not less than 300 pounds. For gross weights over 480 pounds but not exceeding 595 pounds, fibreboard must test not less than 350 pounds.

(b) For gross weights not exceeding 235 pounds, top and bottom caps must be made of corrugated fibreboard testing not less than 275 pounds.

(c) For gross weights exceeding 235 pounds but not exceeding 595 pounds, top and bottom caps must be made of corrugated fibreboard testing not less than 350 pounds.

3. Wood skids or multi-piece wood base:

(a) For gross weights not exceeding 480 pounds, the article must be mounted on and bolted to wood skids each measuring a minimum of $\frac{1}{2}$ inch x $3\frac{1}{4}$ inches in cross-sectional area.

(b) For gross weights over 480 pounds but not exceeding 595 pounds, the article must be mounted on and secured to a multi-piece wood base made of lumber not less than $\frac{1}{2}$ inch thick.

4. Not less than one inch clearance must be maintained between article and inner walls of box (except that when gross weight does not exceed 235 pounds, clearance between sides and back of article may be maintained at not less than $\frac{1}{2}$ inch) by full height corner posts constructed as follows:

(a) L-shaped corner posts made of scored and folded doublewall corrugated fibreboard testing not less than 275 pounds, OR

(b) Figure 4, corner posts made of doublewall corrugated fibreboard testing not less than 200 pounds, scored and folded to provide not less than three thicknesses of fibreboard along sides of article. Figure 4 corner posts may have die-cut slots to accommodate door handles of article, provided such corner posts are constructed of doublewall corrugated fibreboard testing not less than 350 pounds, and an additional clearance form is positioned between doors on front of article. Slots must not exceed 36 inches in length and must not extend closer than four inches to ends of corner posts.

(c) For gross weights over 480 pounds but not exceeding 595 pounds, the L-shaped and/or figure 4 corner posts shall be made of doublewall corrugated fibreboard testing not less than 350 pounds.

5. Not less than one inch clearance must be maintained between top of article and inner wall of box by:

(a) Top pad, full dimensions of article, made of scored and folded doublewall corrugated fibreboard testing not less than 200 pounds; OR

(b) Top pads consisting of two scored and folded L-shaped pads made of doublewall corrugated fibreboard testing not less than 200 pounds taped in position, having a minimum of three thicknesses on top surface of article, with one thickness extending down sides of article. Pads must extend from front to rear on each side of article, except that when corner post has die-cut slot at door handle of article, top pad adjacent to die-cut corner posts must extend from front to rear of container and must be notched to accept corner post; OR

(c) Top forms consisting of two L-shaped hinged assemblies made of expanded plastic having a minimum density of one pound per cubic foot, except that top section of assembly must be made of expanded plastic having a minimum density of 1.5 pounds per cubic foot. Forms must be taped in position and must extend from front to rear on each side of the article, except that when corner post has die-cut slot at door handle of article, form adjacent to corner post must extend from front to rear of the container and must be notched to accept corner post.

(d) For gross weights over 480 pounds but not exceeding 595 pounds, two scored and folded 350 pound doublewall fibreboard forms with the corrugation direction from the top of the article to the inside top of the container.

6. Surface of interior corrugated fibreboard forms which come in contact with surfaces of article subject to abrasion must be coated with nonabrasive material.

7. Boxes must be closed with flanges of caps folded over and back under flanges of body tube. Caps must be securely strapped around flanges with metal or plastic straps.

8. All fibreboard must comply with Item 222, Sections 2 and 3.

9. Gross weight must not exceed 595 pounds.

Package 2332

(Cancels 'Package 2332' from page 12 of Supplement 6)

In glass containers with silicone, wax, oil or other surface coatings which have equivalent lubricating and scratch resisting qualities, having vertical sidewalls and a net weight capacity not exceeding 64 ounces, packaged in a single layer in a five panel folder or wrap-around box. Fibreboard must comply with all the requirements of Item 222 except inner containers need not be separated as required by Item 222-2. Fibreboard must test not less than 200 pounds with combined weight of facings not less than 84 pounds per 1,000 square feet. When inner glass containers do not exceed 32 ounces net weight capacity, fibreboard may test 175 pounds. Box must be so designed that when closed, the glass containers do not move when manually agitated. Glass containers may have vertical sidewalls with recessed label panel, provided there is contact with adjacent containers in both shoulder and heel areas. Gross weight not to exceed 45 pounds.

Package 2452

(Add 'Package 2452' to page 317 of the classification.)

SHIPPING CONTAINER: Liquid bulk-bin style regular slotted container (RSC) having a form-fit molded plastic liner, unit secured to a pallet.

Body— Regular slotted container (RSC) of two plies of doublewall corrugated fibreboard having all flaps fully glued. Fibreboard must have a combined bursting test of 900 pounds, combined facing weight of not less than 574 pounds per 1,000 square feet and a minimum thickness of 0.625 inches. Unit must be secured to the pallet base.

Liner— Body must be outfitted with an inner liner of high density polyethylene, blow molded to fit inside dimensions, having a minimum thickness of 60 mils.

Base— Double face wooden pallet of sound construction.

GROSS WEIGHT: Not to exceed 4,000 pounds.

SPECIFICATIONS FOR NUMBERED PACKAGES

§ Package 2453

(Add 'Package 2453' to page 816 of the classification.)

SHIPPING CONTAINER: An octagonal bulk-bin box of double-cover (DC) style.

Tube— One piece, 3 ply corrugated fibreboard, each ply testing 250 pounds, plies laminated together and reinforced within by five girthwise bands of fibreglass tape.

Caps— Common top and bottom flanged caps of corrugated fibreboard testing 200 pounds with flange width not less than six inches.

Liner— Polyethylene bag of 4 mil thickness to contain product.

Banding— Container must be banded with $\frac{1}{2}$ inch steel strapping, girthwise at mid-height and around bottom cap, and once vertically.

Base— 2-way entry wooden pallet. Container must be vertically banded to pallet.

GROSS WEIGHT: Not to exceed 2,600 pounds.

§ Package 2454

(Add 'Package 2454' to page 817 of the classification.)

SHIPPING CONTAINER: Metal aerosol cans may be packed in fibreboard trays, tiered within an outer tube and cap fibreboard shipping container.

Unit Container— Metal aerosol cans.

Tray— Die-cut design style corrugated fibreboard trays testing 200 pounds having a flange height of not less than 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches.

Body— Double cover (DC) tube and cap style container of corrugated fibreboard testing 200 pounds, die-cut top and bottom caps of design style having a flange height of not less than two inches.

Closure— Top and bottom caps must be securely banded forming tube and cap assembly.

Gross Weight— Not to exceed 300 pounds.

United Inches— Not to exceed 100 inches (length, width and depth added).

§ Package 3009S

(Add 'Package 3009S' to page 851 of the classification.)

SHIPPING CONTAINER:

Body— Tube with three inch top and bottom flanges constructed of singlewall corrugated fibreboard testing not less than 275 pounds.

Tray (Cap)— Top and bottom trays (caps) constructed of doublewall fibreboard testing not less than 275 pounds, minimum four inches deep.

Interior Forms (Sofas)— Cross-laminated bottom pad consisting of three plies of doublewall fibreboard testing not less than 275 pounds. Corrugations of center ply must be perpendicular to two outer plies.

Interior Forms (Chairs)— Bottom pad full inside dimensions of bottom tray (cap) made of doublewall corrugated fibreboard testing not less than 275 pounds, scored and folded so that not less than three thicknesses of board parallel the long dimensions of tray (cap) full length, and legs, swivel base or casters must rest on three such thicknesses.

Clearance— A minimum of one inch clearance must be maintained between the article and inner walls of container.

Attachment— Article must be positioned on and secured to bottom pad with not less than 4 mil heat shrinkable polyethylene film (see Note 1). Film to completely cover the article and extend down over pad and under bottom of pad not less than three inches. Bottom pad must be securely glued to inside surface of bottom tray (cap).

Closure— Closure and attachment of tube, top and bottom trays (caps) must be effected by securing with one-half inch wide plastic strapping material, minimum tensile strength 400 pounds.

Gross Weight— Not to exceed 300 pounds.

Note 1— Film may be of 3 mil thickness when gross weight does not exceed 125 pounds.

Item 291, Specifications for Fibre Drums for Dry or Solid Articles, has been amended by the addition of a note stating that fibre drums containing dry products may have covers and bottoms constructed of polypropylene when the polypropylene has a minimum thickness of 70 mils. Fibre drums with plastic tops and bottoms have been found to exhibit advantages over those with metal tops and bottoms in shipping some products.

Action taken is the result of Docket 877, Subject 24.

Items 2080, Acids Group; 42600, Chemicals Group; 102000, Insecticides Group; 111400, Liquors; 144600, Oils, other than petroleum; 149500, Paints Group and 154700, Paste Group, have been amended to reference a new Note encompassing the use of Package 2452, established by this action as well. Note, item 72007, referencing the Foodstuffs Group, has also been amended to authorize the use of Package 2452. Items 4620, Adhesives, and 155250, Petroleum Products, have been amended to directly reflect Package 2452 as an authorized shipping container.

Package 2452 serves as a bulk liquid container constructed of an outer fibreboard box outfitted within by a blow molded plastic liner. The palletized unit is capable of containing up to 4000 pounds of product or the equivalent of approximately 300 gallons.

Action was resultant of Docket 877, Subject 18.

Item 16800, applying on "Lunch Sets, consisting of paper or wood veneer cups, dishes or plates; paper, fibre, tin or wooden forks and spoons and paper tablecloth and napkins, each set in individual carton," is cancelled in the interest of tariff simplification to remove obsolete provisions.

Cancellation is the result of Docket 877, Subject 6.

Item 20780, applying on "Bags, Ice Delivery," is cancelled in the interest of tariff simplification to remove obsolete provisions.

Cancellation is the result of Docket 877, Subject 7.

New item 25110 is added to the Boat Group for "Rails, Railings or Pulpits, metal, height of stanchions or mounting supports exceeding 12 inches, in packages." Sub provisions are being established for "SU" with classes of 500 AQ and "SU in sections; or KD" with classes of 200 AQ. These commodities are currently classified according to their material construction.

Information of record indicates that railings shipped SU exhibit densities of 0.13 and 0.44 pcf. Pontoon boat railings shipped SU in sections exhibit a density of 4.6 pcf. Boat railings shipped in bundles may or may not be palletized; others are shipped loose. Their excessive length (up to 26 feet) may cause handling and stowing difficulties. While some railings are wrapped with paper or plastic film to protect finished surfaces, there is a higher than normal potential for damage to the railings themselves or to other freight.

These changes are the result of action taken on Docket 877, Subject 4.

Item 39795, photographic slide trays, has been amended by removing the word "or" from the phrase "... still picture or projector ..." in the interest of tariff clarification. Research revealed that item 39795 was originally intended to read "... still picture projector ...," however, when it was first published, it read "... still picture or projector" This is assumed to have been a printer's error.

Action taken is the result of Docket 877, Subject 9.

Items 42600 and 42603 - See justification for item 2080.

Items 50140, defoaming compounds; 50227, water treating compounds; 60000, toilet preparations; 67075, animal feed supplements; 72007, Note to the Foodstuffs Group; 156240, liquid plastic; 176325, colloidal silica; 176520, emulsified petroleum sizing; and 176540, sizing, NOI, have been amended to allow shipment in Package 2440. Package 2440 is an octagonal tube and cap style container constructed of fibreboard, lined with a polyethylene film bag and strapped to a wooden pallet. This package is used only in shipping liquids.

Action taken is the result of Docket 877, Subject 21.

Item 60540, naming "Aerials or Antennas, television receiving, house or dwelling, other than parabolic," is amended by no longer being restricted to only "house or dwelling" aerials or antennas. It is further amended by the establishment of density-based provisions in lieu of the present provisions, which are based on the type of aerial or antenna and the form of shipment.

Removal of "house or dwelling" from the description of item 60540 will enable the item to also apply on mobile TV aerials or antennas. Presently, nonparabolic, mobile TV aerials or antennas are classified per item 61700, naming "Electrical Appliances or Instruments, NOI," at classes 100 LTL and 70 TL, with a minimum weight of 24,000 pounds. Applying different classifications to mobile TV aerials or antennas and to household ones has led to interpretation difficulties; particularly because some models are designed for both mobile and household use. The fact that certain aerials or antennas may be used both indoors and outdoors exacerbates the interpretation difficulties as the present provisions of item 60540 distinguish between aerials or antennas for indoor use and those for outdoor use.

Additionally, facts of record show that the transportation characteristics of the mobile aerials or antennas are similar to those of the household aerials or antennas. Both groups exhibit a wide range in density, with the mobile models ranging from .70 to 25.33 pcf and the household models ranging from 1.60 to 23.55 pcf. (In both cases, there is no meaningful correlation between density and whether the aerial or antenna is shipped set up (SU) or knocked down (KD).) With respect to stowability, handling and liability, no unusual characteristics are indicated for either the mobile or the household models.

As amended, item 60540 will read "Aerials or Antennas, television receiving, other than parabolic, with or without hardware necessary for mounting."

New Note, item 60541, clarifies that item 60540 "Also applies on nonparabolic, television-receiving aerials or antennas when combined with lights or luggage racks."

New Note, item 60542, is the "bumping" provision.

Concurrent with these amendments, item 62325, naming "Kits, house or dwelling television receiving aerial or antennae, consisting of KD aerial or antennae, two piece mounting mast, mounting bracket, lead-in wire and miscellaneous hardware necessary for mounting, in boxes, having a density of 12 pounds or greater per cubic foot," at classes 85 LTL and 55 TL, with a minimum weight of 24,000 pounds, is being cancelled with reference to item 60540. The attendant Note, item 62326, is being cancelled as having no further application. Densities for the aerial or antenna kits range from 12.0 to 12.6 pcf. No unusual stowing, handling or liability characteristics are indicated.

The aforementioned amendments will enable all nonparabolic, television-receiving aerials or antennas to be classified per item 60540 at classes reflective of their transportation characteristics. The present interpretation difficulties would also be eliminated.

Action is resultant of Subject 5 of Docket 877.

Items 72000, 72007 and 72009 - See justification for item 2080.

Items 72040, 72050, 72200, 72240, 72340, 72420, 72480, 72500, 72580, 72720, 72740, 72785, 72787, 72810, 72850, 72852, 72955, 73160, 73162, 73240, 73320, 73350, 73400, 73460, 73500, 73552, 73610, 73730, 73740, 73880, 73920, 73922, 74040, 74110, 74112, 74114, 74130, 74180, 74220, 74240, 74260, 74300, 74304, 74360, 74420, 74520, 74560, 74640, 74680, 74700, 74710, 74820, 74822, 75170, 75260, 75320, 75322, 75360, and 134620 are cancelled with reference to new item 73227 and its companion note items. In addition, item 89150 is amended by removing its application to "popcorn in inner containers other than popping containers." These products will be named in new item 73227. Item 141760 is amended by removing its application to "Edible nuts in syrup or liquor." These products will be named in new item 73227.

All of these items currently cover a wide variety of foodstuffs which are generally subject to an LTL class 60 and TL class 35 with a minimum weight of 36,000 lbs. Item 72500 is currently subject to TL 37 1/2 and MW 36,000. Items 72955 and 74560 are currently subject to TL 35 and MW 40,000 lbs., and items 74130 and 74700 are subject to TL 40 and MW 36,000 lbs. The approved classes are LTL 60, TL 35, MW 40,000 lbs.

The purpose of this change is the consolidation into one item (73227) of products which have very similar transportation characteristics. From this perspective, the consolidation will help simplify the classification of these products.

This is the result of Docket 877, Subject 12.

Items 73720, 73790, 73970, 74730 and 75420 are cancelled with reference to new item 73228. In addition, item 134530 is amended by removing its application on "Vegetable Oil Shortening, liquid, semi-solid or plastic," which will become subject to new item 73228. Item 145100 is amended by eliminating its application on "Cooking or Salad Oil, NOI." These products will also be named in new item 73228. All of the above changes are made in order to consolidate products with similar transportation characteristics into one item. This consolidation will save space on many shippers' bills of lading. The classes to which the new item is subject are LTL 65, TL 40 and Minimum Weight 36,000 lbs.

This change is the result of Docket 877, Subject 13.

New item 79469 is being added to the Classification to specifically provide for "Furniture, one-half scale display replicas, fibreboard building board or wood particleboard with facings of other than wood veneer, with or without components of other materials, SU," at classes 92 1/2 LTL and 55 TL, with a minimum weight of 24,000 pounds. The involved set up replicas are to be used as sales displays or models to show how their full-size counterparts (which are shipped unassembled, per item 79465) will look when assembled by the purchaser. Presently, there is some uncertainty as to which classification provisions apply on these replicas. Because of the nature of the articles and their intended use, various provisions could be considered applicable.

Information of record reveals that the replicas range in density from 4.43 to 21.43 pounds per cubic foot, with an average of 11.06 pounds per cubic foot. They are to be packaged in fibreboard boxes (Package 25F). No unusual stowing characteristics are indicated; although, to avoid crushing, heavy freight should not be stowed on top.

These replicas, as packaged for shipment, range in size from .42 to 6.62 cubic feet and in weight from 6 to 59 pounds. While all boxes can be handled by one person, shipments consisting of the smaller, lightweight packages may require increased labor to load and unload. Also, as with other articles of furniture, a certain degree of care may be necessary in handling these products if damage is to be avoided. With respect to liability, no unusual characteristics are indicated.

In addition to providing classes consistent with the products' transportation characteristics, the establishment of item 79469 will eliminate the aforementioned interpretation problem regarding the proper classification of the involved replicas.

New item 79469 will also make reference to existing Note, item 79467, to clarify that it "Applies only when the wood particleboard or fibreboard building board comprises more than backs, back panels, drawer bottoms or dust stops."

Action is resultant of Subject 15 of Docket 877.

Items 80605, Wooden Chairs; 80610, Chairs, NOI; 80640, Revolving Chairs; 80850, Sofas, dual purpose; and 80869, Sofas, other than dual purpose, have been amended to provide for the use of Package 3009S as a method of shipment. Package 3009S is comprised of a fibreboard tube having top and bottom caps. The article of furniture is secured to a bottom fibreboard pad by heat shrinkable plastic film. Successful shipping experience was obtained under the provisions of Test Shipment Permit T-864-14.

Action was resultant of Docket 877, Subject 16.

Items 86650, crushed, ground or powdered glass, and 87660, glass beads or spheres, have been amended to reference a new package as an authorized shipping container. In addition, a new package describing a tube and cap style fibreboard bulk bin has been established. Laboratory pre-shipment tests were performed on the package with satisfactory results. Additionally, test shipments of these products in the new package were conducted under the provisions of Test Shipment Permit T-876-22.

Action taken is the result of Docket 877, Subject 17.

Item 134620 - See justification for item 72040.

Item 138540, "Mottoes, framed, in boxes," has been cancelled with reference to item 56290, "Decorations, Notions or Novelties," in the interest of tariff simplification. Research revealed no recent movement of commodities under item 138540 by motor common carrier; however, any framed mottoes that may move by motor common carrier will be provided for in item 56290.

This change is the result of action taken on Docket 877, Subject 8.

Item 138940, applying on "Music Boxes or Music Box Movements," is amended to provide a separate provision for those articles having an "Actual value not exceeding \$2.00 each," with classes of 85 LTL, 55 TL, Min. Wt. 24,000 pounds. This new provision is established to reflect an average density of 29.4 pounds per cubic foot, a value per pound of \$6.75 and absence of claims for loss or damage to such articles. The present classes of 125 LTL, 85 TL, Min. Wt. 12,000 pounds remain applicable to articles with actual value exceeding \$2.00 each.

Concurrently, new Note, item 138941, is added in connection with item 138940 to require certification of value to ensure the proper application of the entry. These changes are the result of Docket 877, Subject 14.

Item 141760 - See justification for item 73227.

Items 144600 and 144603 - See justification for item 2080.

Item 145100 - See justification for item 73228.

Items 149500, 149502, 154700 and 154702 - See justification for item 2080.

Item 155250, applicable to lubricating oil, has been amended to reference a new package as an authorized shipping container. Concurrently, a new package describing an end-of-aisle display is established. In the new package, metal aerosol cans are placed in fibreboard trays which are tiered and covered with a fibreboard outer sleeve and top and bottom caps, forming a tube and cap assembly.

Action taken is the result of Docket 877, Subject 20.

Item 156240 - See justification for item 50140.

New item 158980, naming "Safety Showers or Eye Wash Fixtures, separate or combined," is added to the PLUMBERS' GOODS GROUP of the Classification. Two subs are added, with sub 1 applying on those products which have a density of less than 8 pounds per cubic foot. The applicable classes are LTL 125, TL 100 and MW 12,000 lbs. Sub 2 will apply on commodities having a density of 8 PCF or greater. The applicable classes are LTL 85, TL 45, MW 24,000 lbs.

These commodities are intended for use in industrial areas where workers may be exposed to toxic substances. They are designed to flush out or wash off hazardous substances from a person's body as quickly and efficiently as possible. The classes approved for products named in sub 1 are reflective of the following transportation characteristics. They are packaged in boxes or crates and have an average density of 4.41 PCF with a range of 2.39 to 5.34 PCF. They do not present any unusual handling or stowing problems. Values range from \$4.22 to \$14.50 per lb. Claims have not been shown to be a problem. The Sub 2 provisions are reflective of the following transportation characteristics. These commodities are packaged in boxes or crates and have an average density of 16.08 PCF with a range of 8.93 to 28.85 PCF. They do not present any unusual handling or stowing problems. Values range from \$4.22 to \$14.50 per lb. Claims have not been shown to be a problem.

This change is the result of Docket 877, Subject 10.

Item 176325 - See justification for item 50140.

Item 176520 - See justification for item 50140.

Item 176540 - See justification for item 50140.

Package 1012, used for the shipment of household refrigerators, has been amended to provide for upgraded container components for the protection of refrigerators weighing 480 pounds but not exceeding 595 pounds. Upgraded components included the fibreboard container body, the fibreboard top and bottom caps, the inner corner posts and the wooden base.

Action was resultant of Docket 877, Subject 22.

Package 2332 has been amended to allow the use of fibreboard testing 175 pounds when the inner containers do not exceed 32 ounces in capacity. Fibreboard testing 200 pounds is still required for inner containers exceeding 32 ounces in capacity. Test shipments of these products in package 2332 were conducted under the provisions of Test Shipment Permit T-848-30.

Concurrently, new item 73227, applying on Foodstuffs, other than frozen, which now names salad dressing and mayonnaise, is amended to allow shipment in Package 2332.

These changes are the result of action taken on Docket 877, Subject 19.
