

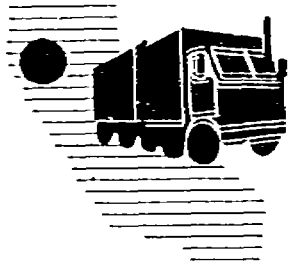

Respectfully shows:

Highway common carriers and express corporations are operating as common carriers pursuant to the authority of the Commission and in accordance with tariffs filed with this Commission; which tariffs are also subject to and governed by the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-N and supplements thereto.

II

An order is requested for the adoption of Supplement 10 to the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-N and to make such provisions applicable to the tariffs of highway common carriers and express corporations, which participate in and are listed in its Classification under authority of power of attorney. It is further requested that such authorization be concurrent with the national effective date of March 23, 1988 on one day's notice; that all common carriers be authorized and directed to establish such changes as may be prescribed in class and commodity rates and charges in connection with the transportation of exempt commodities; that common carriers be authorized to depart from Sections 460 and 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code and appropriate long and short haul provisions of the Constitution of the State of California to the extent necessary to carry into effect such changes; that all such changes be approved and adopted for application with the various tariffs; that any related revisions in numbering, referencing or format in the various tariffs, incidental to such changes, be authorized and established; and for such other and further orders as may be deemed reasonable and proper.

III

The governing classification is periodically revised to correct technical inadvertencies and omissions that have been discovered in the publication of prior supplements and in order to keep the publication responsive to the current conditions and needs of commerce in the transportation of property by highway carriers. The procedures available to shippers and carriers to initiate such revisions and to otherwise protect their interests are known to the Commission and to such parties. Such procedures provide parties with

"...fair and full opportunity for public hearings for determination of changes and revisions as required." (Decision 74310 dated June 25, 1968, and as revised and amended by Decision 87498 dated June 21, 1977). To properly reflect intended results following such processes, the National Motor Freight Traffic Association, Inc., Agent, has authorized revisions which are published in supplemental form set forth in Exhibit A. This supplement is scheduled to take effect March 23, 1988 unless otherwise provided therein, for application to tariffs covering areas other than California. The purpose of this filing is to obtain the authority necessary to make such provisions applicable to tariffs subject to jurisdiction of the California Public Utilities Commission and to promote the national uniformity and standardization in billing and collection practices found appropriate and desirable in the Commission's Decision 74310.



RULES

ITEM 360-B

BILLS OF LADING, FREIGHT BILLS AND STATEMENTS OF CHARGES

Sec. 1. Issuance and Requirements.

Sec. 1 (a). Rates subject to the provisions of this classification are conditioned upon the use of the appropriate bill of lading required by this rule. Articles which are precluded by law from being loaded or transported in the same vehicle must be tendered on separate bills of lading.

Sec. 1 (b). When property is transported subject to the provisions of this classification, the acceptance and use are required respectively, of the bills of lading, domestic or export, Uniform Straight, Straight or Order, as set forth on pages 286 through 293, and page 296, or as amended, of the classification. On international traffic, shipper may elect to use the 'Shipper-Provided Short Form Bill of Lading' set forth on page 294, or as amended, of the classification. This Bill of Lading must be shipper furnished and is for use in international traffic only, not including shipments from Canada, or to and from Mexico or United States of America Territories. The form is for the convenience of the International Shipper and applies only on the Domestic portion of an international movement. The form is not a through Intermodal Bill of Lading.

Sec. 1 (c). The Uniform Straight or Straight Bills of Lading are to be used for any shipment not consigned to the order of any corporation, firm, institution or person.

Sec. 1 (d). The 'Order' Bill of Lading is to be used for any shipment consigned to order of any corporation, firm, institution or person.

Sec. 1 (e). Except as otherwise provided, carriers shall not furnish:

(1) Bill of lading sets that consist of more than an 'Original,' a 'Shipping Order,' and a 'Memorandum' per shipment.

(2) More than one original freight bill on its own standard form and one duplicate thereof, exclusive of the consignee's memo copy, per shipment.

(3) More than one original and one copy of its statement of transportation charges on its own standard form.

Sec. 1 (f). Except on shipments moving on United States Government bills of lading, if payor of freight or other lawful charges requires or requests, as a prerequisite to payment, any of the following, such material or information will be provided subject to the provisions of applicable carrier tariffs:

(1) the return of any part of bill of lading sets or copies thereof, other than one shipper furnished copy (see Note 1); OR

(2) copies of freight bills or statements of transportation charges in excess of the number specified in Sec. 1 (e); OR

(3) the preparation by the carrier of any forms requiring itemization, listing or description of single or multiple freight bills, for submittal with freight bills or statements of charges; OR

(4) any forms or copies of forms, other than those described in Sec. 1 (f)(1) or Sec. 1 (f)(2), to be submitted with freight bills or statements of charges; OR

(5) that information not shown on the shipping order at time of shipment be shown on freight bills or statements of charges;

OR

(6) that proof of delivery be furnished in any form.

(Continued)

RULES

ITEM 360-B — Concluded

Sec. 1 (g). Carriers are not obligated to furnish bills of lading containing information beyond that shown in the examples set forth on pages 266 through 296, or as amended, of the classification.

Sec. 1 (h). Consignors may elect to furnish their own bills of lading, in which case, all requirements of Sec. 1 (a) through Sec. 1 (d) and Sec. 2 of this item must be observed (see Note 2). These forms may also contain such information as: (1) identification or location of consignor or consignee; (2) commodity descriptions; (3) rates or classes; or (4) other information pertinent to the shipment.

Sec. 1 (i). On bills of lading furnished by carriers, freight bills and statements of charges issued by carriers, the Standard Carrier Alpha Code (SCAC) of the issuing carrier as shown in the Directory of Standard Multi-Modal Carrier and Tariff Agents Codes, ICG NMF 101 (or as amended), must be shown immediately adjacent to the carrier's name on the document heading. The SCAC designation must be printed in upper case boldface type.

Sec. 1 (j). When bar coding is used to designate any information required by Sec. 2 of Item 360 on bills of lading or freight bills, the symbology code '39' must be used. In addition, the code must be in both machine and human readable form and must be in accordance with existing carrier industry standards as defined by the American Trucking Associations' Management Systems Committee.

Note 1— When as a prerequisite to payment, the shipper furnished copy of bill of lading is to be returned, it must be clearly and prominently marked by the shipper with specific instructions directing its return with freight bill.

Note 2— Consignor provided short form bills of lading need not be in any particular format so long as the information requirements of Sections 1 and 2 are observed and the bill of lading is complete when tendered by the shipper to the carrier for signature. When generated by a computer or other than preprinted forms, each such bill of lading must bear the title "Shipper Provided Short Form Bill of Lading — Not Negotiable — Domestic" and must incorporate the terms and conditions of the bill of lading contract with the statement "All parties hereto and their assigns are familiar with, and agree, that this bill of lading is subject to: (1) the contract terms and conditions of the Uniform Domestic Straight Bill of Lading as set forth in the National Motor Freight Classification; and (2) the applicable tariff and classifications in effect as of the date hereon. Shipment information should utilize the full width of the document. The order of appearance of the information listed after the title and statement incorporating the bill of lading terms and conditions should be as follows: Route, carrier name and address, bill of lading reference and number, consignee destination and address, shipper origin and address, statement of conditions or restrictions placed on shipment (where appropriate), including released valuation information, number of pieces and kinds of packages, commodity description, weight, and hazardous material designation as required, including the furnishing of placards to the carrier, COD (where appropriate), including the amount to be collected and the party to pay the COD, freight terms (collect or prepaid). The document must be concluded with a date and the notation "Received in apparent good order — Exceptions Noted" which shall be deemed to be an acceptance of all such terms and conditions as provided in the Uniform Domestic Straight Bill of Lading.

Sec. 2. Information to be shown on a Bill of Lading.

Sec. 2 (a). The name and address of only one consignor and one consignee and only one destination shall appear on a bill of lading. When a shipment is consigned to a point of which there are two or more of the same name in the same state, the name of the county must be shown.

Sec. 2 (b). An "Order" bill of lading will not be issued unless the name of the corporation, firm, institution or person to whose order the shipment is consigned is plainly shown thereon after the words "Consigned to Order of."

Sec. 2 (c). To insure the assessment of correct freight charges and avoid infractions of federal and state laws, shippers should acquaint themselves with the descriptions of articles in the tariff under which they ship. Commodity word descriptions must be used in bills of lading and shipping orders and must conform to those in the applicable tariff. Appropriate abbreviated descriptions are permitted provided the NMF item number and appropriate Sub number thereof are shown. The kind of package used must be shown. Bills of lading and shipping orders must specify number of articles, packages, or pieces. Except as provided in Item 640, Sec. 3 (mixed packages), for each separate commodity description, the number and type of packages (bags, boxes, bundles, drums, etc.) and the gross weight must be shown.

Sec. 2 (d). Articles indicated as explosives or as dangerous articles in Hazardous Materials Tariff (HMT) must be described on bills of lading and shipping orders as shown in that tariff. Abbreviations must not be used. When HMT descriptions differ from the tariff description in connection with which the applicable class or rate is published, the tariff description must also be shown on bills of lading and shipping orders.

Sec. 2 (e). Unless otherwise provided in carriers' tariffs, shipments requiring protective temperature control may be accepted subject to the availability of suitable equipment as referred to in Item 520 when the bills of lading and shipping orders are clearly and legibly marked in upper case letters in accordance with the following:

(1) Where shipments are subject to damage from freezing, marking must clearly instruct carrier to protect from freezing.

(2) Where shipments require maintenance at or below a specific temperature, or movement within a range of temperatures, marking must indicate the temperature or temperature range required.

Sec. 3. Inspection of Property. When carrier's agent believes it is necessary that the contents of packages be inspected, he shall make or cause such inspection to be made, or require other sufficient evidence to determine the actual character of the property. When found to be incorrectly described, freight charges must be collected according to proper description.

Sec. 4. Delivery of Shipments on Order Bills of Lading:

Sec. 4 (a). The surrender to the carrier of the original Order Bill of Lading, property endorsed is required before the delivery of the property; but, if such bill of lading be lost or delayed, Sec. 4 (b) will govern.

Sec. 4 (b). The property may be delivered in advance of the surrender of the bill of lading upon receipt of a certified check, money order or bank cashier's check (or cash at carrier's option) by the carrier's agent for an amount equal to one hundred and twenty-five percent of the invoice or value of the property, or at carrier's option, upon receipt of a bond, acceptable to the carrier, in an amount twice the invoice or value of the property, or a blanket bond may be accepted when satisfactory to the carrier as surety, amount and form. Amounts of money deposited by certified check, money order, bank cashier's check or in cash shall be refunded in full: immediately upon surrender of bill of lading property endorsed or when the carrier has received a bond, acceptable to the carrier, in an amount twice the invoice or value of the property.

Sec. 5. Insurance Against Marine Risk: The cost of insurance against marine risk will not be assumed by the carrier unless so provided specifically, in its tariffs.

For simplicity the following abbreviations are utilized: LTL (Less Than Truckload); TL (Truckload); MW (Minimum Weight Factor); AQ (Any Quantity); PCF (Pounds Per Cubic Foot).

Item 360, Sec. 1(a) is amended by the addition of a sentence which will require separate bills of lading for articles which are precluded by law from being transported in the same vehicle. For example, a shipper may not tender materials bearing a poison label on the same bill of lading with foodstuffs or feedstuffs for human or animal consumption as, under the Department of Transportation Hazardous Materials Regulations, these articles cannot be transported in the same vehicle.

These changes are the result of Subject 20 of Docket 881.

Item 21280, applying on "Balloons, barrage," is cancelled in the interest of tariff simplification to remove obsolete provisions. Motor carrier density and traffic studies revealed no movement of these commodities.

Cancellation is the result of Docket 881, Subject 17.

Items 23640, "Bird Houses, earthenware or stoneware," 23660, "Bird Houses, NOI," and 67885, "Feeders, bird, aluminum, glass, wood or steel, other than wire," are cancelled with reference to new item 67900. Concurrently, Note, item 67887, is cancelled as having no further application. New item 67900 names "Feeders or Houses, bird, with or without hardware necessary for mounting, in boxes, subject to Item 170 and having a density in pounds per cubic foot of," with sub provisions as follows: (1) "Less than 1," at class 400 AQ; (2) "1 but less than 2," at class 300 AQ; (3) "2 but less than 4," at class 250 AQ; (4) "4 but less than 6," at class 150 LTL, 100 TL and 12 MW; (5) "6 but less than 8," at class 125 LTL, 85 TL and 15 MW; (6) "8 but less than 10," at class 100 LTL, 70 TL and 18 MW; (7) "10 but less than 12," at class 92 1/2 LTL, 65 TL and 20 MW; (8) "12 but less than 15," at class 85 LTL, 55 TL and 26 MW; and (9) "15 or greater," at class 70 LTL, 40 TL and 36 MW. A new Note, item 67901, is also added to allow shipments to be "burped" to the next lower class if such is to the shipper's advantage. The new item is reflective of densities for bird feeders and houses ranging from 2.28 to 22.26 pcf, as well as generally average handling, stowing and liability characteristics.

These changes are the result of action taken on Subject 5 of Docket 881.

Item 28700, applying on "Bottles, miniature beverage, containing water with or without detergents or disinfectant (imitation of beverages)," is cancelled in the interest of tariff clarification. Investigation has revealed that this product is no longer produced and the provisions are obsolete.

Cancellation is the result of Docket 881, Subject 15.

Item 38650, naming "Bumpers, sidewalk, barrel," is cancelled from the Classification in the interest of tariff simplification. The information of record indicates that these products are no longer being manufactured or shipped; therefore, the provisions of item 38650 are obsolete.

This change is the result of Subject 16 of Docket 881.

Item 40100, naming "Popped Corn or Puffed Rice Confectionery, sugar or syrup coated, with or without nuts or coconut," is cancelled with reference to item 72400. Concurrently, item 72400 is amended to read "Chips, Puffs, Sticks or Twists, NOI; Bacon or Pork Rinds or Skins, fried, or Popcorn, popped; flavored or not flavored; or Popcorn or Puffed Rice Confectionery, sugar or syrup coated with or without nuts or coconut; in barrels, boxes or Packages 1000, 1086, 2387 or 2416." The sub provisions have not been affected by the change.

These products are snack-type products, with the most commonly recognized products being Crackerjacks, Fiddle Faddle, etc. They are similar in transportation characteristics to other products currently classified in item 72400. They are packaged in fibreboard boxes for shipment and present no unusual handling or stowability problems. They range in density from 3.3 to 14 pounds per cubic foot. Values of these products range from \$1.00 to \$1.29 per pound. Claims for loss and damage have not been a significant factor.

This is the result of Docket 881, Subject 13.

Item 41042 and accompanying Note, item 41043, were added to the Classification in Supplement 10 with a scheduled effective date of March 23, 1988. These changes, as explained in the Appendix to Supplement 10, should have been published to become effective on June 21, 1988. The publication in this Supplement is to postpone the effective date of the changes from March 23, 1988 to June 21, 1988.

Items 46030, resin compounds, and 57220, dextrin or british gum, have been amended to reference Package 2452 as an authorized shipping container. Package 2452 is a pallet mounted fibreboard box with a rigid plastic liner designed for shipments of liquids in bulk. Resin compounds and dextrins exhibit transportation characteristics that are similar to those of other liquids for which Package 2452 is authorized.

Action taken is the result of Docket 881, Subject 22.

Items 55220, 55222, 55223, 55224, 55225, 55226, 55227, 55229, 55231 and 55233, applying on various types of cushions, pads or pillows, are cancelled with reference to the density-based provisions of item 149265, naming "Pads or Padding, NOI," and item 157320, naming "Expanded Plastic or Rubber Pads or Padding, NOI." Concurrently, item (generic heading) 149100 is amended to specifically name "Pads, Padding, Cushions or Pillows;" the provisions of item 149265 are amended to name "Pads, Padding, Cushions or Pillows, NOI;" and the provisions of item 157320 are amended to name "Expanded Plastic or Rubber Pads or Padding, NOI, or Cushions or Pillows, NOI."

These changes were made reflective of the transportation characteristics of these products. Information of record reveals a range in density from 0.38 to 17.90 pounds per cubic foot (pcf). These cushions, pads or pillows are primarily shipped in fibreboard boxes and exhibit no unusual handling or stowability characteristics. Likewise, no unusual liability characteristics are indicated.

Concurrent with the aforementioned amendments, the accompanying Note, item 55234, is cancelled with reference to the new Notes, items 149268 and 157347. These Notes clarify that items 149265 and 157320, respectively, do "not apply on electric vibrating or massage pads, padding, cushions or pillows. Classes for those products are provided in item 61820, sub 4, naming "Electric Exercising Apparatus, vibratory, other than chair or lounge type." The Notes, items 55235 and 55238, are cancelled as having no further application.

These changes are the result of Docket 881, Subject 10.

Item 57157, naming "Devices, terminal control, forced air distribution," is amended to provide classes based on density. A new Note, item 57159, is added to allow for assessment at the next lower class. These devices are currently subject to classes of 92 1/2 LTL, 60 TL and 20 HV. There is no change in the Note, item 57158.

Information of record indicates that forced air distribution terminal control devices exhibit a density range from 0.08 to 117.39 pcf, with an average density of 6.29 pcf. Packages containing large or multiple units weigh from 425 to 845 pounds, creating handling and stowing difficulties. Devices shipped loose or in crates may have a higher than normal propensity to damage.

These changes are the result of action taken on Docket 881, Subject 9.

Item 57220 - See justification for item 46030.

Items 67885, 67887, 67900 and 67901 - See justification for item 23640.

Items 68545 and 68546 - See justification for items 175590, 175610, 175630 and 175650.

Item 72007, Note to the Foodstuffs Group, has been corrected to include a reference to Package 2448 as an authorized package. Package 2448 is approved for shipment of products in the Foodstuffs Group; however, the package reference was inadvertently omitted in amendments to item 72007 in Supplements 8 and 9 to NPEC 100-R.

Item 72400 - See justification for item 40100.

Item 72910, flavoring compounds, has been amended to allow shipment in Package 2440. Package 2440 is an octagonal fibreboard tube and cap style container with an inner polyethylene film bag. It is designed to ship liquids in bulk. Flavoring compounds were shipped in Package 2440 under the provisions of Test Shipment Permit T-867-35, with no damage reported.

This change is the result of Docket 881, Subject 23.

Item 74650, common salt, containing food curing, flavoring or preserving ingredients, has been amended to authorize shipment in a new package. Also, a new package (Package 2456) describing a linear low density polyethylene film bag, has been established. Test shipments of salt in this bag were conducted under the provisions of Test Shipment Permit T-869-40.

Action taken is the result of Docket 881, Subject 24.

Sub 2 of item 80020, naming SU metallic or wooden bookcases, has been amended to allow shipment of these products in Package 50F. Package 50F specifies that the container must comply with the requirements of Item 222, except that the dimensions and gross weight may be increased. Test shipments of bookcases in Package 50F were conducted under the provisions of Test Shipment Permit T-8712-44.

This change is the result of Docket 881, Subject 21.

New item 82990 is added to the Classification to provide a specific description for "Doors, cabinet, in the white, without hardware, banded to pallets, platforms or skids," with applicable classes of 70 LTL, 40 TL, Minimum Weight 40,000 pounds. The classes assigned are reflective of a range in density of 15 to 60 pounds per cubic foot, as well as average handling and stowing characteristics.

This addition is the result of Docket 881, Subject 19.

Items 149100, 149265 and 149268 - See justification for item 55220.

Item 156300, naming "Plastic Sheet or Plate NOI, self-supporting (rigid)," and the accompanying Note, item 156302, are amended to restrict application to commodities other than with formed interior cells, cavities or flutes. Plastic sheet or plate with formed interior cells, cavities or flutes becomes subject to the density-based classes of item 156600, "Plastic Articles, NOI." The Note, item 156602, is also amended to allow for the packaging of these commodities strapped on pallets or skids.

Information of record indicates that all types of plastic sheet or plate classified under item 156300 exhibit a density range from 2.90 to 66.67 pcf, with an average density of 39.31 pcf. Plastic sheet or plate with formed interior cells, cavities or flutes ranges in density from 4.76 to 16.15 pcf, with an average density of 9.73 pcf. Some plastic sheet or plate may be excessive in length, causing handling or stowing difficulties. The value of plastic sheet or plate ranges from \$1.00 to \$9.23 per pound, with an average value of \$3.01 per pound.

These changes are the result of action taken on Docket 881, Subject 11.

Items 157320 and 157347 - See justification for item 55220.

Items 175590, 175610, 175630 and 175650, applying on various types of shoddy (garnetted fibres), are being cancelled with reference to new item 68545 under the "Fibres" generic heading. The new item, naming "Shoddy (Garnetted Fibres)," provides classes based on density.

"Shoddy" is defined in The Modern Textile and Apparel Dictionary, by George E. Linton, as "reworked fibers" originating from one of two sources: "Fibers recovered from new rags or tailor clippings which were never part of a worn garment (or) fibers recovered from old rags which were part of worn garments."

In either case, reprocessing tends to weaken the fibers." "Cometting" is defined as "the process of recovering the fibers from hard twisted thread wastes, rags, clippings, especially of wool. The object is to thoroughly break up the material and return it to a fluffy fibrous condition so it can be used blends, or in some cases, alone."

Information of record shows shoddy to range in density from 3.20 to 21.67 pounds per cubic foot. Stowability and handling will vary somewhat depending on the type of packaging used, but no unusual problems are indicated. With respect to liability, shoddy is not shown to be susceptible to theft, unusually prone to damage or likely to damage other freight. Value per pound ranges from \$.08 to \$.57 with an average of \$.26. The provisions of item 68545 are established reflective of these transportation characteristics. New Note, item 68546, is the "bumping" provision. Action is resultant of Subject 6 of Docket 881.

Item 180090, naming "Tables, wooden, finished, KD, with integral Radio Sets or Phonographs," is cancelled from the Classification in the interest of tariff simplification. The information of record indicates that these products are no longer being manufactured or shipped; therefore, the provisions of item 180090 are obsolete.

This change is the result of Subject 14 of Docket 881.

Item 188230 is added to the Classification to apply on "Urn-Vaults, for human ashes, cultured marble (cast stone)," with applicable classes of 70 LTL, 35 TL, MW 40,000 pounds. The classes assigned are reflective of a density of 37.4 to 38.7 pounds per cubic foot, a value range of \$2.55 to \$3.00 per pound and the requirement that the articles be handled carefully to prevent breakage as the units are hollow.

This addition is the result of Docket 881, Subject 8.

Packages 2399, 2440, 2445 and 2452 have been amended to require the outside of the container to have a label stating that the contents are liquid. In addition, Packages 2399 and 2440 have been amended to state that they are restricted to single trip use. These packages are all plastic lined fibreboard boxes used to ship liquids in bulk.

These changes are the result of Docket 881, Subject 25.

Package 2456 - See justification for item 74660.
