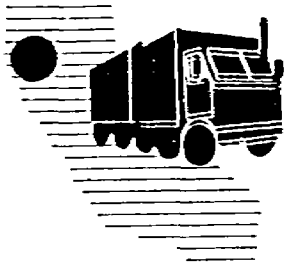

Respectfully shows:

Highway common carriers and express corporations are operating as common carriers pursuant to the authority of the Commission and in accordance with tariffs filed with this Commission; which tariffs are also subject to and governed by the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-0 and supplements thereto.

## II

An order is requested for the adoption of Supplement 3 to the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100- and to make such provisions applicable to the tariffs of highway common carriers and express corporations, which participate in and are listed in its Classification under authority of power of attorney. It is further requested that such authorization be concurrent with the national effective date of June 21, 1988 on one day's notice; that all common carriers be authorized and directed to establish such changes as may be prescribed in class and commodity rates and charges in connection with the transportation of exempt commodities; that common carriers be authorized to depart from Sections 460 and 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code and appropriate long and short haul provisions of the Constitution of the State of California to the extent necessary to carry into effect such changes; that all such changes be approved and adopted for application with the various tariffs; that any related revisions in numbering, referencing or format in the various tariffs, incidental to such changes, be authorized and established; and for such other and further orders as may be deemed reasonable and proper.

## III

The governing classification is periodically revised to correct technical inadvertencies and omissions that have been discovered in the publication of prior supplements and in order to keep the publication responsive to the current conditions and needs of commerce in the transportation of property by highway carriers. The procedures available to shippers and carriers to initiate such revisions and to otherwise protect their interests are known to the Commission and to such parties. Such procedures provide parties with



"...fair and full opportunity for public hearings for determination of changes and revisions as required." (Decision 74310 dated June 25, 1968, and as revised and amended by Decision 87498 dated June 21, 1977). To properly reflect intended results following such processes, the National Motor Freight Traffic Association, Inc., Agent, has authorized revisions which are published in supplemental form set forth in Exhibit A. This supplement is scheduled to take effect June 21, 1988 unless otherwise provided therein, for application to tariffs covering areas other than California. The purpose of this filing is to obtain the authority necessary to make such provisions applicable to tariffs subject to jurisdiction of the California Public Utilities Commission and to promote the national uniformity and standardization in billing and collection practices found appropriate and desirable in the Commission's Decision 74310.



implemented by approval of this instant filing, subject to the protection restriction suggested in the aforesaid filing.

In addition, the Commission through its Executive Director, has directed that classification changes be processed under the procedure and format of General Order 109 (see letter dated June 21, 1977). This filing is made in response to such directive.

## RULES

## ITEM 110-A

DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATION OF TERMS,  
PUNCTUATION AND REFERENCES

The following definitions will apply when such terms are used in this classification or in tariffs governed by this classification. When different definitions are provided for the same terms in connection with rates, classes, rules or other provisions, such definitions will take precedence.

Sec. 1. 'Carrier,' 'Consignee,' 'Consignor' or 'Shipper' includes the authorized representatives or agents of such 'carrier,' 'consignee,' 'consignor' or 'shipper.'

Sec. 2. 'Truck' or 'Vehicle' means any vehicle or vehicles propelled or drawn by a power unit and used on highways in the transportation of property, see Note.

Note— When the vehicles consist of a power unit and two or more trailers or containers, the interior lengths of the separate trailers or containers, when totaled, must not exceed 58 feet measured along the center longitudinal line of each trailer or container floor.

Sec. 3. (a) 'Point' means a particular city, town, village, community or other area which is treated as a unit for the application of rates.

Sec. 3. (b) 'Place' means a particular street address or other designation of a factory, store, warehouse, place of business, private residence, construction camp or the like, at a point.

Sec. 3. (c) 'Site' means a particular platform or specific location for loading or unloading at a place.

Sec. 3. (d) 'Address' means a particular street address (not a U.S. Post Office Box Number) where street address is available and must include the Post Office ZIP Code.

Sec. 4. Explanation of words 'Rate' or 'Class':

Sec. 4. (a) 'Rate' means the figure stated in cents, dollars and cents, or fractions thereof, to be used in computing the charge on property transported.

Sec. 4. (b) 'Class' means the numerals or letters, or combinations thereof, assigned to an article or group of articles in this classification or in exceptions thereto, for the purpose of determining the applicable rate.

Sec. 5. Unless otherwise provided in carriers' tariffs, a shipment consists of a lot of freight tendered to a carrier by one consignor at one place at one time for delivery to one consignee at one place on one bill of lading.

Sec. 6. (a) 'Volume' (vol.) rates or classes are those for which a volume minimum weight (Vol. min. wt.) is provided, and charges will be assessed at the volume minimum weight shown in tariffs governed hereby, except that actual weight will apply when in excess of the volume minimum weight.

Sec. 6. (b) 'Truckload' (TL) rates or classes are those for which a truckload minimum weight (indicated by minimum weight factors in this classification, see also Item 997) is provided, and charges will be assessed at the truckload minimum weight shown in this classification or in tariffs governed hereby, except that actual weight will apply when in excess of the truckload minimum weight.

Sec. 6. (c) 'Less than Truckload' (LTL) rates or classes are those applicable to a quantity of freight less than the volume or truckload minimum specified for the same article.

Sec. 6. (d) 'Any Quantity' (AO) rates or classes are those applicable to the articles regardless of the quantity or weight of the shipment.

Sec. 7. Explanation of Words 'and' and 'or' and the use of Parentheses:

Sec. 7. (a) 'And' is used to couple the terms between which it appears.

Sec. 7. (b) 'Or' provides for alternation or use of either or both of the terms between which it appears.

Sec. 7. (c) Except as provided in Sec. 12(g), in the description of articles, the term appearing between parentheses constitutes another description of the identical article immediately preceding the parentheses.

Sec. 7. (d) Brackets embracing numbers in class columns herein identify alternating TL classes, see Item 595.

Sec. 8. 'Density.' Where classes are applicable according to the density of articles as tendered for shipment, the word 'density' means 'pounds per cubic foot.'

Sec. 8. (a) The cubage of loose articles or pieces, or packaged articles of a rectangular, elliptical or square shape on one plane shall be determined by multiplying the greatest straight line dimensions of length, width and depth in inches, including all projections, and dividing the total by 1,728 cubic inches (one cubic foot). The density shall be the result of the division of the weight of the article, piece or package by the ascertained cubic feet.

Sec. 8. (b) To determine the density of a cylindrical shaped article or any article other than a square, elliptical or rectangular-shaped article in a single plane, square the greatest dimension on the cylindrical or other than square, elliptical or rectangular plane (multiply the dimension by itself) and multiply that result by the height or length. If result is in cubic inches, divide by 1,728 cubic inches (one cubic foot). The density shall be the result of the division of the weight of the article by the ascertained cubic feet.

Sec. 9. Indentations: Where any part of the description of an article is found set away from the left margin in a position subordinate to the text preceding it, the description is to be read with its context and particularly with the preceding heading or headings. The effect of its position upon the meaning of a description should be carefully observed. Example: Item 1010, 'Abrasives Group,' controls items 1030 to 2050. Item 1070, 'Crude or Lump,' being further indented, is governed by the description just above it in item 1050.

Sec. 10. Unless otherwise provided, where individual items designate an article as being 'enameled,' the term means porcelain or vitreous enamel.

Sec. 11. Explanation of 'in the rough,' 'rough turned,' 'in the white' and 'finished,' when such terms are used to describe articles constructed of wood. These definitions will only apply to articles constructed of wood whether or not 'wood' or 'wooden' is specifically shown in the applicable item description:

Sec. 11. (a) 'In the rough' or 'rough turned' means that the articles are not further manufactured than sawed, hewn, planed, bent or turned.

Sec. 11. (b) 'In the white' means that the articles are further manufactured than as provided for in Sec. 11(a), but including not more than one coat of priming.

Sec. 11. (c) 'Finished' means that the articles are further manufactured than as provided for in Sec. 11(b).

**ITEM 110-A—Continued**

Sec. 12. Meanings of forms of shipments explained:

Sec. 12. (a) 'SU' (Set Up) means articles in their assembled condition or disassembled, folded or telescoped but not meeting the conditions described in Sec. 12, paragraphs (b) through (f). Where an article does meet the conditions described in Sec. 12, paragraphs (b) through (f), but such provisions are not published in item descriptions, the SU classes will apply.

Sec. 12. (b) 'SU in sections' or 'In SU Sections' means articles taken apart in sections regardless of bulk or cubage, except that where other forms of shipment are provided in the same item and the meaning for such other forms of shipment as described in Sec. 12, paragraphs (c) through (f) is complied with, the classes for such other forms of shipment will apply.

Sec. 12. (c) 'KO' (Knocked Down) means that an article must be taken apart, folded or telescoped in such a manner as to reduce its bulk at least 33% percent from its normal shipping cubage when set up or assembled.

Sec. 12. (d) 'KO flat' means that an article must be taken apart, folded or telescoped in such a manner as to reduce its bulk at least 66% percent from its normal shipping cubage when set up or assembled.

Sec. 12. (e) Except as otherwise provided in Sec. 12(g), 'folded' means that an article must be folded in such a manner as to reduce its bulk at least 33% percent from its normal shipping cubage when not folded.

Sec. 12. (f) Except as otherwise provided in Sec. 12(g), 'folded flat' means that the article must be folded in such a manner as to reduce its bulk at least 66% percent from its normal shipping cubage when not folded.

Sec. 12. (g) When the terms 'folded' or 'folded flat' are enclosed in parentheses, the restrictions in Sec. 12(e) or Sec. 12(f) do not apply.

Sec. 13. (a) 'Nested' means that three or more different sizes of an article must be placed each smaller within the next larger or that three or more of the same articles must be placed one within the other so that each upper article must not project above the next lower article by more than one-third of its height.

Sec. 13. (b) 'Nested solid' means that three or more of the same articles must be placed one within or upon the other so that the outer side surfaces of the one above will be in contact with the inner surfaces of the one below and so that each upper article will not project above the next lower article by more than 1/4 inch.

Sec. 13. (c) Rates or classes provided for 'nested' articles will not apply when articles of different name or material, whether grouped in one description or shown separately, are nested or placed one within the other.

Sec. 14. 'Iron' as used in the description of an article includes 'Steel' and vice versa, and unless otherwise specified these terms include 'Stainless Steel' or 'Alloy Steels' containing less than 50 percent non ferrous metals.

Sec. 15. Unless otherwise specifically provided:

Sec. 15. (a) The word 'rubber' refers to natural or synthetic rubber or rubber compounds.

Sec. 15. (b) The word 'foam' used in conjunction with 'rubber' or the words 'foam rubber' refers to cellular rubber produced by the introduction of gas or air into latex and vulcanizing.

Sec. 15. (c) The word 'sponge' used in conjunction with 'rubber' or the words 'sponge rubber' refer to cellular rubber produced by the introduction of gas or air into non-liquid rubber and vulcanizing.

Sec. 15. (d) The words 'plastic' or 'plastics' refer to materials consisting of or articles made from synthetic gums or resins, cellulose derivatives, casein solids, coal tar or petroleum resins or rubber hydrochloride, with or without inert fillers, see Note, and whether or not reinforced or laminated with fibers, glass flakes or with macerated or sheet paper or fabric.

Note—The term 'fillers' refers to organic or inorganic materials in finely divided or fibrous form (ground, chopped or pulverized) used to produce desired physical, chemical or electrical properties of finished materials or articles. Examples of fillers are:

Sec. 16. Unless otherwise provided where reference is made to gauge, it means U.S. Standard Gauge shall be used for determining thickness of sheet or plate steel; Brown & Sharpe Gauge shall be used for determining thickness of rods and sheet of aluminum, copper, brass and bronze; and U.S. Steel Wire Gauge shall be used for determining thickness of iron or steel wire. The table at Footnote A sets forth the nominal thicknesses. Where classification provisions are based on gauge, and where only thickness is available, the table in Footnote A must be used to convert thickness to comparable gauge.

Sec. 17. Where in the separate descriptions of articles, the words 'fibreboard,' 'pulpboard,' or 'paperboard' are used, they are interchangeable and whenever any is used all are included.

Listed below is a summary of changes being proposed in the supplement. The symbol "\*" indicates a proposed new item. Following the summary list will be found an explanation of each change or addition together with the National Classification Committee's reasons for the proposed change or addition. For simplicity the following abbreviations are utilized: LTL (Less Than Truckload); TL (Truckload); MW (Minimum Weight Factor); AQ (Any Quantity); PCF (Pounds Per Cubic Foot).

Item 110, Section 20, is being amended to include a definition of the term "Not Accepted" in the interest of tariff clarification.

This amendment is the result of handling accorded Subject 13 of Docket 883.

Item 12610, naming "Albums or Scrapbooks, paper, pulpboard and plastic combined, with pages, in boxes," is cancelled with reference to item 12600, "Albums or Scrapbooks, paper or pulpboard, in boxes." Both of these items have classes of 70 LTL, 40 TL and 36 MW. Concurrently, item 12600 is amended to read "Albums or Scrapbooks, paper or pulpboard, or paper, pulpboard and plastic combined, in boxes," with no changes to the applicable classes or minimum weight. These changes are made in the interest of tariff simplification as both items embraced essentially the same commodity and had identical classes and minimum weights.

These changes are the result of action taken on Docket 883, Subject 6.

Item 17860, naming "Assemblies, vibration damper, steel tank type, fluid filled," and its accompanying Note, item 17862, is cancelled in the interest of tariff simplification. Information of record indicates that these products are no longer produced and, therefore, the provisions are obsolete.

These changes are the result of action taken on Docket 883, Subject 7.

Item 26450, naming "Heaters, electric (Air Heaters), portable, with or without blowers or fans, in barrels, boxes or crates," with classes of 100 LTL, 70 TL, and 16 MW is cancelled with reference to new item 62220 under the Electrical Equipment Group. Item 62220 names "Heaters, electric, portable, with or without blowers or fans, in boxes or crates, subject to Item 170 and having a density in pounds per cubic foot of:" with Sub 1 specifying "less than 10," at class 150 LTL, 100 TL and 12 MW, and Sub 2 specifying "10 or greater," at class 85 LTL, 55 TL and 24 MW.

Information of record indicates that portable electric heaters were found to have densities ranging from 3.10 to 16.59 pcf, averaging 7.75 pcf. Those heaters with densities less than 10 pcf were found to range from 3.10 to 8.82 pcf, with an average density of 6.39 pcf. Portable electric heaters with densities of 10 pcf or greater were found to range from 10.19 to 16.59 pcf, with an average density of 12.71 pcf. Portable electric heaters were found to exhibit no unusual handling, stowing or liability characteristics although when not palletized, the smaller packages may require extra time when loading and unloading and heavy freight should not be loaded on top of them to avoid crushing. Their value was found to range from \$.69 to \$7.64 per pound, averaging \$3.11 per pound.

These changes are the result of action taken on Docket 882, Subject 6.

Item 29285, SU fibreboard boxes, has been amended by dividing the present 6 but less than 12 pcf density group into three groups - 6 but less than 8 pcf, 8 but less than 10 pcf and 10 but less than 12 pcf. Additionally, the reference to item 29940, an alternating TL class/minimum weight scale has been deleted and individual TL classes and minimum weights have been established for each subprovision. The new provisions for each density group are as follows: less than 1 pcf at class 400 AQ; 1 but less than 2 pcf at class 300 AQ; 2 but less than 4 pcf at class 250 AQ; 4 but less than 6 pcf at class 150 LTL, 100 TL and 12 MW; 6 but less than 8 pcf at class 125 LTL, 85 TL and 15 MW; 8 but less than 10 pcf at class 100 LTL, 70 TL and 18 MW; 10 but less than 12 pcf at class 92 1/2 LTL, 65 TL and 20 MW; 12 but less than 15 pcf at class 85 LTL, 55 TL and 26 MW; and 15 pcf or greater at class 70 LTL, 40 TL and 36 MW.

All of these subprovisions will continue to reference Note, item 29296, the bumping provision. The classes associated with the new, narrower density groups are more reflective of the densities of these products than the present, broader group. Further, because the new density groups each embrace a narrower range of densities, the bumping privilege will have less of a distorting influence than it presently does.

Lastly, paragraph 3 of Note, item 29295 has been amended to specify that the provisions of item 29285 apply on SU fibreboard boxes equipped with plastic inner containers.

Action taken is the result of Docket 883, Subject 4.

Item 34580, wooden elevator guide or weight posts and item 34600, wooden elevator guides, under the Building Materials, Miscellaneous, Group, are cancelled as obsolete. Concurrently, item 120560, elevator boots or heads, and item 120620, elevator logs, under the Machinery Group, are amended to remove the reference to wooden elevator parts in the interest of tariff clarification. The information of record reveals that these products are no longer being manufactured or shipped.

These changes are the result of Subject 12 of Docket 883.

Item 35140 having application on "Paving Joints, roadway expansion, etc." is cancelled with reference to item 35160. Concurrently, item 35160, having application on "Paving Joints, roadway expansion, etc." is amended to also apply on asphalt or asphalt base products. These changes were proposed in the interest of tariff simplification.

These changes are the result of Docket 883, Subject 8.

New item 37255, naming "Stairs or Staircases, aluminum, NOI, other than stair treads," with classes of 300 AQ (Any Quantity) is added to specifically name these products. These commodities are currently subject to item 35670, "Architectural Building Work, aluminum," with classes of 100 LTL, 70 TL and a 20,000 pound minimum weight. These commodities exhibited a density range of 1.67 to 2.93 pcf, with an average density of 2.53 pcf. They are shipped SU, wrapped in fibreboard and bound by metal strapping. The weight of each package is between 64 and 213 pounds. They are also bulky and excessively long which creates handling and stowability problems. There is no indication of any unusual liability characteristics regarding these products.

This change is the result of Docket 883, Subject 9.

Item 40260, naming "Caps, Covers, Discs, Ends, Bands, Rings or Tops, NOI, plastic, for bottles, cans, cups, collapsible tubes, glasses, jars or jugs, in packages," is cancelled and referenced to item 156600, naming "Plastic Articles, other than expanded, NOI." This item is subject to full-scale density classes.

The products include the familiar plastic caps found on toothpaste tubes, milk bottles and other similar containers. They have the following transportation characteristics. The densities range from 4.4 to 28 pounds per cubic foot (PCF) with an average density 14.81 PCF. They are packaged in fibreboard cartons which present no unusual handling or stowability problems. Values for these products range from \$.70 to \$7.81 per lb.

This is the result of Docket 882, Subject 7.

New item 49795, naming "Aprons, Coveralls, Laboratory Coats, Pants, Shirts or Clothing, NOI, disposable, produced from paper or nonwoven cloth, with or without reinforcement of mesh, yarn, strand or plastic film, in boxes," with classes of LTL 100, TL 85, MW 12 is added to the tariff to avoid interpretation difficulties and establish classes reflective of known transportation characteristics.

The Committee reviewed facts gathered by its own investigation and received additional facts from shippers at its public hearing of March 10, 1988, indicating an average density of approximately 9.0 pcf together with a very low to non-existent claims history. Additionally, products were found to be tendered in rectangular fibreboard boxes and in many instances also shrink-wrapped to pallets. Palletization can cause loading difficulties when flat load bearing surfaces are not attained. Based on these facts the Committee approved the original proposal with modifications.

This new entry is the result of Subject 1, Docket 882.

Item 61260 - See justification for item 63330.

Item 62220 - See justification for item 26450.

New item 63330, naming "Terminals, telephone cable, strand mounting type, with telephone cable attached," is established with classes of 100 LTL, 70 TL, and a MW 24,000. This classification is reflective of an average density of 9.46 pcf, taken from a range of 5.96 to 11.64 pcf. These products are packed in fibreboard boxes, occupying approximately 50 to 75 percent of usable cube; it is believed that damage to cables can be prevented in this manner. While claims do not appear to be of significance, values range from \$5.36 to \$10.48 per pound. The characteristics are within guidelines for the established classes.

This action results from Docket 883, Subject 2.

New item 74170, reading "Noodles, dry, in individual serving cups, with or without vegetables, meats, seasonings or other ingredients, in boxes," is established subject to classes of 125 Less Than Truckload (LTL), 100 Truckload (TL), 12,000 lb. Minimum Weight (MW).

The involved commodities are noodles with or without other ingredients, mostly dried meats and vegetables in plastic styrofoam cups. They are single serving type items. The approved classes are reflective of the following transportation characteristics. Densities range from 4.41 to 7.6 pounds per cubic foot with an average density of 6.19 PCF. The products are packaged in small boxes measuring approximately 1/2 cubic foot and weighing 3 lbs. Movements from production facilities are palletized while movements beyond such locations may be on a single carton basis. The lightweight boxes in which the commodities are shipped can be easily crushed by heavier freight and, as such, would be considered to be "Top load" freight. Value of the commodities was found to range from \$1.38 to \$2.02 per lb.

Concurrently, pertinent sections of item 73227 are amended by the addition of an "NOI" provision which will clarify the application of the new item.

This is the result of Docket 882 Subject 2.

Item 75894 having application on "Forms, concrete construction, aluminum," is added to the Classification to specifically provide for these products. Classes of 92 1/2 LTL, 60 TL, MW 24 are assigned those forms "with wood facings," reflective of a density of 10.78 pounds per cubic foot, a value of \$1.39 per pound and the heavy nature of some shipments. Classes of 70 LTL, 40 TL, MW 36, are assigned the all aluminum or "NOI" provision reflective of a density of 23.95 pounds per cubic foot, a value of \$2.53 per pound and the heavy nature of some shipments requiring mechanical equipment for handling.

This addition is the result of Docket 883, Subject 1.

Item 80520, naming "Barber, Dental or Surgeons' Chair Tables, NOI, see Note, item 80521," is being amended to read "Chairs, adjustable, with hydraulic or power-operated bases, viz., see Note, item 80521; Barber; Beauty; Dental; Medical Examination; Ophthalmic Examination, see Note, item A-NEW;" with no change in applicable classes. These changes have been effected to more clearly identify the commodities item 80520 was intended to embrace and to avoid future analogy rulings involving ophthalmic examination chairs.

There is no change to the Note, item 80521. The new Note, Item A-NEW, reads: "Ophthalmic examination chairs may be shipped with instrument stands or tables including base plate, podostat, instrument arms, lamp or instrument console. Provisions do not apply on chairs or units equipped with instruments."

The subgeneric heading, item 80500, naming "Chairs, Chair Tables or Stools," is being amended to read "Chairs or Stools." Provisions for chair tables are being moved to item 82030 under the subgeneric heading, item 81900, "Tables."

Item 80680, naming "Surgeons' Chair Tables, cabinet type," is being cancelled with reference to item 82030. Item 82030, naming "Tables: Surgeons' Autopsy, Examining or Operating," is being amended to read: "Tables: Medical Autopsy, Examining or Operating, including Medical Chair Tables, NOI, see Note, item B-NEW," with no change in the applicable classes. Additionally, Package 130F, which applies on "Surgeons' examining tables," is amended to apply on "Medical examining tables or chair tables." These changes include updating the terminology "surgeons'" to "medical" or "medical examination," adding "NOI" to the description of item 82030 for tariff clarification, cancelling item 80680 and amending item 82030 to apply on medical chair tables for tariff clarification and simplification.

The new Note, item 80231, reads: "Liquid must be removed from hydraulic bases or be in liquid-tight sealed bases." This change recognizes that some of the tables and chair tables classified under item 82030 may have hydraulic bases.

These changes are the result of action taken on Docket 883, Subject 10.

Item 120560 - See justification for item 34580.

Item 120620 - See justification for item 34580.

Item 156600, Plastic Articles, NOI, has been amended to provide for the use of a new shipping container. Package 2459, authorized for the shipment of vinyl swimming pool liners only, is doublewall fibreboard box of a full telescopic design allowing for a maximum of 275 pounds gross weight.

Action taken was the result of Docket 883, Subject 15.

Item 172280, safes with solid walls 1 inch or more in thickness, has been amended to allow shipment in a new package (No. 2460). Concurrently, a new package has been established that allows safes to be stretch wrapped and banded to a skid, provided that a top cap and corner posts of 275 pound test corrugated fibreboard are used. Test shipments of safes in this package were conducted under the provisions of Test Shipment Permit T-8712-43 with satisfactory results.

These changes are the result of action taken on Docket 883, Subject 14.
