Respectfully shows:

Highway common carriers and express corporations are operating as common carriers pursuant to the authority of the Commission and in accordance with tariffs filed with this Commission; which tariffs are also subject to and governed by the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-0 and supplements thereto.

II

An order is requested for the adoption of Supplement 4 to the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-0 and to make such provisions applicable to the tariffs of highway common carriers and express corporations, which participate in and are listed in its Classification under authority of power of attorney. It is further requested that such authorization be concurrent with the national effective date of July 23, 1988 on one day's notice; that all common carriers be authorized and directed to establish such changes as may be prescribed in class and commodity rates and charges in connection with the transportation of exempt commodities; that common carriers be authorized to depart from Sections 460 and 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code and appropriate long and short haul provisions of the Constitution of the State of California to the extent necessary to carry into effect such changes; that all such changes be approved and adopted for application with the various tariffs; that any related revisions in numbering, referencing or format in the various tariffs, incidental to such changes, be authorized and established; and for such other and further orders as may be deemed reasonable and proper.

III

The governing classification is periodically revised to correct technical inadvertencies and omissions that have been discovered in the publication of prior supplements and in order to keep the publication responsive to the current conditions and needs of commerce in the transportation of property by highway carriers. The procedures available to shippers and carriers to initiate such revisions and to otherwise protect their interests are known to the Commission and to such parties. Such procedures provide parties with

"...fair and full opportunity for public hearings for determination of changes and revisions as required." (Decision 74310 dated June 25, 1968, and as revised and amended by Decision 87498 dated June 21, 1977). To properly reflect intended results following such processes, the National Motor Freight Traffic Association, Inc., Agent, has authorized revisions which are published in supplemental form set forth in Exhibit A. This supplement is scheduled to take effect July 23, 1988 unless otherwise provided therein, for application to tariffs covering areas other than California. The purpose of this filing is to obtain the authority necessary to make such provisions applicable to tariffs subject to jurisdiction of the California Public Utilities Commission and to promote the national uniformity and standardization in billing and collection practices found appropriate and desirable in the Commission's Decision 74310.

Attached hereto and by this reference made a part of this filing are the following exhibits detailing such revisions:

EXHIBIT A - Copy of Supplement 4 to National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-N

EXHIBIT B - Summary of changes

Certain changes in rates, ratings rules, regulations or charges will result from the adoption of Supplement 4. A summary of such changes, including an explanation of the reasons for the proposed changes, is set forth in Exhibit B.

In addition to the justification of proposals set forth herein, Applicant refers to the facts and allegations set forth in Petition 401, as though reiterated herein. Said filings set forth the broader purposes and justifications for the program of classification revisions which will be

implemented by approval of this instant filing, subject to the protection restriction suggested in the aforesaid filing.

In addition, the Commission through its Executive Director, has directed that classification changes be processed under the procedure and format of General Order 109 (see letter dated June 21, 1977). This filing is made in response to such directive.

RULES

ITEM 110-B

DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATION OF TERMS,
PUNCTUATION AND REFERENCES

The following definitions will apply when such terms are used in this classification or in tariffs governed by this classification. When different definitions are provided for the same terms in connection with rates, classes, rules or other provisions, such definitions will take precedence.

Sec. 1. 'Carrier,' 'Consignee,' 'Consignor' or 'Shipper' includes the authorized representatives or agents of such 'carrier,' 'consignee,' 'consignor' or 'shipper.'

Sec. 2. 'Truck' or 'Vehicle' means any vehicle or vehicles propelled or drawn by a power unit and used on highways in the transportation of property, see Note.

Note— When the vehicles consist of a power unit and two or more trailers or containers, the interior lengths of the separate trailers or containers, when totaled, must not exceed 58 feet measured along the center longitudinal line of each trailer or container floor.

Sec. 3. (a) 'Point' means a particular city, town, village, community or other area which is treated as a unit for the application of rates.

Sec. 3. (b) 'Place' means a particular street address or other designation of a factory, store, warehouse, place of business, private residence, construction camp or the like, at a point.

Sec. 3. (c) 'Site' means a particular platform or specific location for loading or unloading at a place.

Sec. 3. (d) 'Address' means a particular street address (not a U.S. Post Office Box Number) where street address is available and must include the Post Office ZIP Code.

Sec. 4. Explanation of words 'Rate' or 'Class':

Sec. 4. (a) 'Rate' means the figure stated in cents, dollars and cents, or fractions thereof, to be used in computing the charge on property transported.

Sec. 4. (b) 'Class' means the numerals or letters, or combinations thereof, assigned to an article or group of articles in this classification or in exceptions thereto, for the purpose of determining the applicable rate.

ASec. 5. (a) A 'prepaid shipment' is one on which the charges for transportation service rendered at the request of the consignor, including charges for any accessorial services performed at the request of the consignor, are to be paid by the consignor.

ASec. 5. (b) A 'collect shipment' is one on which the charges for transportation service including accessorial services rendered at the request of the consignee, or requested by the consignor for the consignee, are to be paid for by the consignee.

Sec. 6. (a) 'Volume' (vol.) rates or classes are those for which a volume minimum weight (Vol. min. wt.) is provided, and charges will be assessed at the volume minimum weight shown in tariffs governed hereby, except that actual weight will apply when in excess of the volume minimum weight.

Sec. 6. (b) 'Truckload' (TL) rates or classes are those for which a truckload minimum weight (indicated by minimum weight factors in this classification, see also Item 997) is provided, and charges will be assessed at the truckload minimum weight shown in this classification or in tariffs governed hereby, except that actual weight will apply when in excess of the truckload minimum weight.

Sec. 6. (c) 'Less than Truckload' (LTL) rates or classes are those applicable to a quantity of freight less than the volume or truckload minimum specified for the same article.

Sec. 6. (d) 'Any Quantity' (AQ) rates or classes are those applicable to the articles regardless of the quantity or weight of the shipment.

Sec. 7. Explanation of Words 'and' and 'or' and the use of Parentheses:

Sec. 7. (a) 'And' is used to couple the terms between which it appears.

Sec. 7. (b) 'Or' provides for alternation or use of either or both of the terms between which it appears.

Sec. 7. (c) Except as provided in Sec. 12(g), in the description of articles, the term appearing between parentheses constitutes another description of the identical article immediately preceding the parentheses.

Sec. 7. (d) Brackets embracing numbers in class columns herein identify alternating TL classes, see Item 595.

Sec. 8. 'Density.' Where classes are applicable according to the density of articles as tendered for shipment, the word 'density' means 'pounds per cubic foot.'

Sec. 8. (a) The cubage of loose articles or pieces, or packaged articles of a rectangular, elliptical or square shape on one plane shall be determined by multiplying the greatest straight line dimensions of length, width and depth in inches, including all projections, and dividing the total by 1,728 cubic inches (one cubic foot). The density shall be the result of the division of the weight of the article, piece or package by the ascertained cubic feet.

Sec. 8. (b) To determine the density of a cylindrical shaped article or any article other than a square, elliptical or rectangular-shaped article in a single plane, square the greatest dimension on the cylindrical or other than square, elliptical or rectangular plane (multiply the dimension by itself) and multiply that result by the height or length. If result is in cubic inches, divide by 1,728 cubic inches (one cubic foot). The density shall be the result of the division of the weight of the article by the ascertained cubic feet.

Sec. 9. Indentations: Where any part of the description of an article is found set away from the left margin in a position subordinate to the text preceding it, the description is to be read with its context and particularly with the preceding heading or headings. The effect of its position upon the meaning of a description should be carefully observed. Example: Item 1010, 'Abrasives Group,' controls Items 1030 to 2050. Item 1070, 'Crude or Lump,' being further indented, is governed by the description just above it in Item 1050.

Sec. 10. Unless otherwise provided, where individual items designate an article as being 'enameled,' the term means porcelain or vitreous enamel.

Sec. 11. Explanation of 'In the rough,' 'rough turned,' 'In the white' and 'finished,' when such terms are used to describe articles constructed of wood. These definitions will only apply to articles constructed of wood whether or not 'wood' or 'wooden' is specifically shown in the applicable item description:

Sec. 11. (a) 'In the rough' or 'rough turned' means that the articles are not further manufactured than sawed, hewn, planed, bent or turned.

Sec. 11. (b) 'In the white' means that the articles are further manufactured than as provided for in Sec. 11(a), but including not more than one coat of priming.

Sec. 11. (c) 'Finished' means that the articles are further manufactured than as provided for in Sec. 11(b).

ITEM 110-B—Continued

Sec. 12. Meanings of forms of shipments explained:

Sec. 12. (a) 'SU' (Set Up) means articles in their assembled condition or disassembled, folded or telescoped but not meeting the conditions described in Sec. 12, paragraphs (b) through (f). Where an article does meet the conditions described in Sec. 12, paragraphs (b) through (f), but such provisions are not published in item descriptions, the SU classes will apply.

Sec. 12. (b) 'SU in sections' or 'In SU Sections' means articles taken apart in sections regardless of bulk or cubage, except that where other forms of shipment are provided in the same item and the meaning for such forms of shipment as described in Sec. 12, paragraphs (c) through (f) is complied with, the classes for such other forms of shipment will apply.

Sec. 12. (c) 'KD' (Knocked Down) means that an article must be taken apart, folded or telescoped in such a manner as to reduce its bulk at least 33% percent from its normal shipping cubage when set up or assembled.

Sec. 12. (d) 'KD flat' means that an article must be taken apart, folded or telescoped in such a manner as to reduce its bulk at least 66% percent from its normal shipping cubage when set up or assembled.

Sec. 12. (e) Except as otherwise provided in Sec. 12(g), 'folded' means that an article must be folded in such a manner as to reduce its bulk at least 33% percent from its normal shipping cubage when not folded.

Sec. 12. (f) Except as otherwise provided in Sec. 12(g), 'folded flat' means that the article must be folded in such a manner as to reduce its bulk at least 66% percent from its normal shipping cubage when not folded.

Sec. 12. (g) When the terms 'folded' or 'folded flat' are enclosed in parentheses, the restrictions in Sec. 12(e) or Sec. 12(f) do not apply.

Sec. 13. (a) 'Nested' means that three or more different sizes of an article must be placed each smaller within the next larger or that three or more of the same articles must be placed one within the other so that each upper article must not project above the next lower article by more than one-third of its height.

Sec. 13. (b) 'Nested solid' means that three or more of the same articles must be placed one within or upon the other so that the outer side surfaces of the one above will be in contact with the inner surfaces of the one below and so that each upper article will not project above the next lower article by more than 1/4 inch.

Sec. 13. (c) Rates or classes provided for 'nested' articles will not apply when articles of different name or material, whether grouped in one description or shown separately, are nested or placed one within the other.

Sec. 14. 'Iron' as used in the description of an article includes 'Steel' and vice versa, and unless otherwise specified these terms include 'Stainless Steel' or 'Alloy Steels' containing less than 50 percent non ferrous metals.

Sec. 15. Unless otherwise specifically provided:

Sec. 15. (a) The word 'rubber' refers to natural or synthetic rubber or rubber compounds.

Sec. 15. (b) The word 'foam' used in conjunction with 'rubber' or the words 'foam rubber' refers to cellular rubber produced by the introduction of gas or air into latex and vulcanizing.

Sec. 15. (c) The word 'sponge' used in conjunction with 'rubber' or the words 'sponge rubber' refer to cellular rubber produced by the introduction of gas or air into non-liquid rubber and vulcanizing.

Sec. 15. (d) The words 'plastic' or 'plastics' refer to materials consisting of or articles made from synthetic gums or resins, cellulose derivatives, casein solids, coal tar or petroleum resins or rubber hydrochloride, with or without inert fillers, see Note, and whether or not reinforced or laminated with fibers, glass flakes or with macerated or sheet paper or fabric.

Note— The term 'fillers' refers to organic or inorganic materials in finely divided or fibrous form (ground, chopped or pulverized) used to produce desired physical, chemical or electrical properties of finished materials or articles. Examples of fillers are:

Alpha cellulose	Earths	Soy bean meal
Asbestos	Glass fibres	Synthetic fibres
Carbon black	Mica	Vegetable fibres
Cotton flock	Nut shell flour	Wood flour

Sec. 15. (e) The following phrases refer to the product produced by gelatinizing cellulosic paper with a chemical solution. The phrases do not apply nor refer to materials or articles of plastic and fibre construction:

Chemically hardened fibreware	Indurated paper
Chemically hardened paper	Indurated pulpboard
Chemically hardened pulpboard	Vulcanized fibre
Indurated fibre	Vulcanized fibreware

Sec. 16. Unless otherwise provided where reference is made to gauge, it means U.S. Standard Gauge shall be used for determining thickness of sheet or plate steel; Browne & Sharpe Gauge shall be used for determining thickness of rods and sheet of aluminum, copper, brass and bronze; and U.S. Steel Wire Gauge shall be used for determining thickness of iron or steel wire. The table at Footnote A sets forth the nominal thicknesses. Where classification provisions are based on gauge, and where only thickness is available, the table in Footnote A must be used to convert thickness to comparable gauge.

Sec. 17. Where in the separate descriptions of articles, the words 'fibreboard,' 'pulpboard,' or 'paperboard' are used, they are interchangeable and whenever any is used all are included.

Sec. 18. Unless otherwise provided, the word 'interlaced' means that three or more of the same size article must be packed in such a manner as to reduce the package cubage (outside dimensions) at least 33 1/3 percent from the package cubage (outside dimensions) required for the same number of articles not interlaced.

Sec. 19. Explanation of 'blister packed,' 'skin packed,' and 'card mounted.'

Sec. 19. (a) 'Blister Packed' means that the article is contained in a preformed, thermoformed plastic receptacle (blister) which is affixed to a fibreboard or paperboard card backing. The 'blister' may or may not be shaped to the contours of the article.

Sec. 19. (b) 'Skin Packed' means that the article is placed on a fibreboard or paperboard card and is covered by a thin, thermoformed plastic sheet, which is pulled tightly around the article, essentially conforming to the shape of the article and firmly securing the article to the card.

Sec. 19. (c) 'Card Mounted' means that the article is attached to a fibreboard or paperboard card backing by means of staples, tape, wire ties, or other mechanical fastening methods.

Sec. 20. The terms 'Not taken' or 'Not accepted' mean that the described article or articles will not be accepted for shipment nor as premiums accompanying other articles.

ITEM 360-B

BILLS OF LADING, FREIGHT BILLS AND STATEMENTS OF CHARGES

Sec. 1. Issuance and Requirements.

Sec. 1 (a). Rates subject to the provisions of this classification are conditioned upon the use of the appropriate bill of lading required by this rule. Articles which are precluded by law from being loaded or transported in the same vehicle must be tendered on separate bills of lading.

Sec. 1 (b). When property is transported subject to the provisions of this classification, the acceptance and use are required respectively, of the bills of lading, domestic or export, Uniform Straight, Straight or Order, as set forth on pages 278 through 285, and page 288, or as amended, of the classification. On international traffic, shipper may elect to use the 'Shipper-Provided Short Form Bill of Lading' set forth on page 286, or as amended, of the classification. This Bill of Lading must be shipper furnished and is for use in international traffic only, not including shipments from Canada, or to and from Mexico or United States of America Territories. The form is for the convenience of the International Shipper and applies only on the Domestic portion of an International movement. The form is not a through Intermodal Bill of Lading.

Sec. 1 (c). The Uniform Straight or Straight Bills of Lading are to be used for any shipment not consigned to the order of any corporation, firm, institution or person.

Sec. 1 (d). The 'Order' Bill of Lading is to be used for any shipment consigned to order of any corporation, firm, institution or person.

(Continued)

RULES

ITEM 360-B—Continued

Sec. 1 (e). Except as otherwise provided, carriers shall not furnish:

(1) Bill of lading sets that consist of more than an "Original," a "Shipping Order," and a "Memorandum" per shipment.

(2) More than one original freight bill on its own standard form and one duplicate thereof, exclusive of the consignee's memo copy, per shipment.

(3) More than one original and one copy of its statement of transportation charges on its own standard form.

Sec. 1 (f). Except on shipments moving on United States Government bills of lading, if payor of freight or other lawful charges requires or requests, as a prerequisite to payment, any of the following, such material or information will be provided subject to the provisions of applicable carrier tariffs:

(1) the return of any part of bill of lading sets or copies thereof, other than one shipper furnished copy (see Note 1), OR

(2) copies of freight bills or statements of transportation charges in excess of the number specified in Sec. 1 (e); OR

(3) the preparation by the carrier of any forms requiring itemization, listing or description of single or multiple freight bills, for submittal with freight bills or statements of charges; OR

(4) any forms or copies of forms, other than those described in Sec. 1 (f)(1) or Sec. 1 (f)(2), to be submitted with freight bills or statements of charges; OR

(5) that information not shown on the shipping order at time of shipment be shown on freight bills or statements of charges; OR

(6) that proof of delivery be furnished in any form.

Sec. 1 (g). Carriers are not obligated to furnish bills of lading containing information beyond that shown in the examples set forth on pages 278 through 288, or as amended, of the classification.

Sec. 1 (h). Consignors may elect to furnish their own bills of lading, in which case, all requirements of Sec. 1 (a) through Sec. 1 (d) and Sec. 2 of this item must be observed (see Note 2). These forms may also contain such information as: (1) identification or location of consignor or consignee; (2) commodity descriptions; (3) rates or classes; or (4) other information pertinent to the shipment.

Sec. 1 (i). On bills of lading furnished by carriers, freight bills and statements of charges issued by carriers, the Standard Carrier Alpha Code (SCAC) of the issuing carrier as shown in the Directory of Standard Multi-Modal Carrier and Tariff Agents Codes, IOC NMF 101 (or as amended), must be shown immediately adjacent to the carrier's name on the document heading. The SCAC designation must be printed in upper case boldface type.

Sec. 1 (j). When bar coding is used to designate any information required by Sec. 2 of Item 360 on bills of lading or freight bills, the symbology code "39" must be used. In addition, the code must be in both machine and human readable form and must be in accordance with existing carrier industry standards as defined by the American Trucking Associations' Management Systems Committee.

Note 1— When as a prerequisite to payment, the shipper furnished copy of bill of lading is to be returned, it must be clearly and prominently marked by the shipper with specific instructions directing its return with freight bill.

Note 2— Consignor provided short form bills of lading need not be in any particular format so long as the information requirements of Sections 1 and 2 are observed and the bill of lading is complete when tendered by the shipper to the carrier for signature. When generated by a computer on other than preprinted forms, each such bill of lading must bear the title "Shipper Provided Short Form Bill of Lading — Not Negotiable — Domestic" and must incorporate the terms and conditions of the bill of lading contract with the statement "All parties hereto and their assigns are familiar with, and agree, that this bill of lading is subject to: (1) the contract terms and conditions of the Uniform Domestic Straight Bill of Lading as set forth in the National Motor Freight Classification; and (2) the applicable tariff and classifications in effect as of the date hereon. Shipment information should utilize the full width of the document. The order of appearance of the information listed after the title and statement incorporating the bill of lading terms and conditions should be as follows: Route, carrier name and address, bill of lading reference and number, consignee destination and address, shipper origin and address, statement of conditions or restrictions placed on shipment (where appropriate), including released valuation information, number of pieces and kinds of packages, commodity description, weight, and hazardous material designation as required, including the furnishing of placards to the carrier, COD (where appropriate), including the amount to be collected and the party to pay the COD, freight terms (collect or prepaid). The document must be concluded with a date and the notation "Received in apparent good order — Exceptions Noted" which shall be deemed to be an acceptance of all such terms and conditions as provided in the Uniform Domestic Straight Bill of Lading.

Sec. 2. Information to be shown on a Bill of Lading.

Sec. 2 (a). The name and address of only one consignor and one consignee and only one destination shall appear on a bill of lading. When a shipment is consigned to a point of which there are two or more of the same name in the same state, the name of the county must be shown.

Sec. 2 (b). An "Order" bill of lading will not be issued unless the name of the corporation, firm, institution or person to whose order the shipment is consigned is plainly shown thereon after the words "Consigned to Order of."

Sec. 2 (c). To insure the assessment of correct freight charges and avoid infractions of federal and state laws, shippers should acquaint themselves with the descriptions of articles in the tariff under which they ship. Commodity word descriptions must be used in bills of lading and shipping orders and must conform to those in the applicable tariff. Appropriate abbreviated descriptions are permitted provided the NMFC item number and appropriate Sub number thereof are shown. The kind of package used must be shown. Bills of lading and shipping orders must specify number of articles, packages, or pieces. Except as provided in Item 640, Sec. 3 (mixed packages), for each separate commodity description, the number and type of packages (bags, boxes, bundles, drums, etc.) and the gross weight must be shown.

Sec. 2 (d). Articles indicated as explosives or as dangerous articles in Hazardous Materials Tariff (HMT) must be described on bills of lading and shipping orders as shown in that tariff. Abbreviations must not be used. When HMT descriptions differ from the tariff description in connection with which the applicable class or rate is published, the tariff description must also be shown on bills of lading and shipping orders.

Sec. 2 (e). Unless otherwise provided in carriers' tariffs, shipments requiring protective temperature control may be accepted subject to the availability of suitable equipment when the bills of lading and shipping orders are clearly and legibly marked in upper case letters in accordance with the following:

(1) Where shipments are subject to damage from freezing, marking must clearly instruct carrier to protect from freezing.

(2) Where shipments require maintenance at or below a specific temperature, or movement within a range of temperatures, marking must indicate the temperature or temperature range required.

Sec. 3. Inspection of Property. When carrier's agent believes it is necessary that the contents of packages be inspected, he shall make or cause such inspection to be made, or require other sufficient evidence to determine the actual character of the property. When found to be incorrectly described, freight charges must be collected according to proper description.

(Continued)

RULES

ITEM 360-B—Concluded

Sec. 4. Delivery of Shipments on Order Bills of Lading:

Sec. 4 (a). The surrender to the carrier of the original Order Bill of Lading, properly endorsed is required before the delivery of the property; but, if such bill of lading be lost or delayed, Sec. 4 (b) will govern.

Sec. 4 (b). The property may be delivered in advance of the surrender of the bill of lading upon receipt of a certified check, money order or bank cashier's check (or cash at carrier's option) by the carrier's agent for an amount equal to one hundred and twenty-five percent of the invoice or value of the property, or at carrier's option, upon receipt of a bond, acceptable to the carrier, in an amount twice the invoice or value of the property, or a blanket bond may be accepted when satisfactory to the carrier as surety, amount and form. Amounts of money deposited by certified check, money order, bank cashier's check or in cash shall be refunded in full; immediately upon surrender of bill of lading property endorsed or when the carrier has received a bond, acceptable to the carrier, in an amount twice the invoice or value of the property.

Sec. 5. Insurance Against Marine Risk: The cost of insurance against marine risk will not be assumed by the carrier unless so provided specifically, in its tariffs.

ITEM 430-A

COLLECT ON DELIVERY (COD) SHIPMENTS

(Applicable only on Intrastate Traffic where COD provisions have not otherwise been authorized by state law or regulation)

Unless otherwise provided in applicable tariffs, carriers which provide collect on delivery (COD) service will accept such shipments subject to the following provisions:

Sec. 1. Shipments must be tendered on 'Uniform Straight', 'Straight Bill of Lading—Short Form', or 'Straight' bill of lading forms as shown on pages 278 through 280, 284, 285 and 288 of the classification.

The letters 'COD' must be stamped, typed or written on all such bills of lading and shipping orders immediately before name of consignee; OR, 'COD' in red letters at least one (1) inch in height with thickness of stroke $\frac{1}{8}$ inch thick or greater must be stamped or printed across the face of all bills of lading and shipping orders. Only one COD amount may be shown and may not be subject to change dependent upon time or conditions of payment. The name and street and post office address of consignor and consignee must be shown on bill of lading and shipping order. On Straight Bills of Lading—Short Form there must be shown in the space provided for this purpose or in the lower left hand corner of space provided for 'description of articles, special marks and exceptions,' the following information:

Collect on Delivery, \$ _____ and remit to:
 _____ Street
 _____ City
 _____ State _____ Zip
 COD Charge to be paid by:

Shipper Consignee

Sec. 2. Each package must be plainly marked, labeled, or tagged by consignor showing letters COD, and the name and address of consignor and consignee in accordance with Item 580 of the classification.

Sec. 3. COD packages will not be accepted on the same bill of lading with packages other than COD and only packages covered by one COD bill may be tendered on one bill of lading.

Sec. 4. If consignor desires to forward invoice or collection papers, they must be securely attached to the shipping order copy of the bill of lading and the shipping order must show the following information:

'Attached invoice (or invoices) to accompany shipment to destination.'

Sec. 5. COD shipments will not be accepted or receipted for when billed to one firm or person, with instructions to collect charges from another firm or person.

Sec. 6. COD shipments will not be accepted for transportation subject to inspection or trial by consignee, or when bearing instructions to make partial delivery. Carriers are responsible to deliver the shipment in accordance with the bill of lading contract. If, for any reason, upon presentation for delivery, COD payment is refused by the consignee, carriers are responsible for the disposition of the shipment only in accordance with the bill of lading contract and tariff provisions as applicable. Carriers are not responsible, in such circumstances, to seek or remit the COD amount to the consignor or owner of goods.

Sec. 7. Intoxicating beverages may be handled COD only under the provisions provided by State Laws of the State in which the point of destination is located. (See Section 389 of Title 18 of the United States Code Annotated.)

Sec. 8. The amount of COD bills for COD shipments must be collected at the time such shipments are delivered to the consignee.

Sec. 9. Only the following forms of payment will be accepted in payment of COD amounts: (1) cash, up to a maximum of \$250.00, see Note; (2) bank cashier's check; (3) bank certified check; (4) money order; or (5) personal check of the consignee when so authorized in writing or by endorsement on the bill of lading and shipping order by the consignor. All checks and money orders shall be made payable to the consignor, for such other party as may be designated by the consignor as the payee. The carrier will accept checks and money orders only as the agent of the consignor and the carriers' responsibility is limited to the exercise of due care and diligence in forwarding such checks and money orders to consignor, for such other party as may be designated by the consignor as the payee.

Note— Limit on amount of cash that will be accepted does not apply when COD shipments are picked up by consignee, or his agent, at carriers' terminals.

Sec. 10. Any charge as provided for in carriers' tariffs for collecting and remitting the amount of bills for COD shipments will be collected from the consignee, except that such charge may be prepaid by the shipper, providing notation to that effect is made by the shipper on the bill of lading and shipping order. Collection or remitting charges for freight or other lawful charges due the carrier shall be paid to the carrier and must not be included in the checks or money orders made payable to the consignor.

(Continued)

RULES

ITEM 430-A—Concluded

Sec. 11. Upon collection of a COD bill, carrier collecting same shall remit each COD collection directly to the consignor or other person designated by the consignor as payee, promptly and within 15 (fifteen) days after delivery of the COD shipment to the consignee. If the COD shipment moved in interline service the delivering carrier shall, at the time of remittance of the COD collection to the consignor or payee, notify the originating carrier of such remittance.

Sec. 12. Charges for collecting and remitting the amount of each COD bill to be collected on shipments consigned COD as provided herein will be assessed as provided in applicable tariff of destination carrier.

Sec. 13. COD shipments of explosives designated as 'Class A and dangerous explosives' or 'Class B less dangerous explosives' referred to in the Hazardous Materials Tariff (HMT) will not be accepted.

Sec. 14. (a) Carrier will, upon written request from the consignor, change the status of a COD shipment (except as prohibited by Sec. 1) by increasing, reducing, or cancelling the amount of the COD, subject to the charges provided in applicable tariffs. The request must be received by the delivering carrier in time to accomplish the change requested prior to effecting delivery of the shipment.

Sec. 14. (b) Carrier will, upon written authorization from consignor, change the form of payment of COD amounts to accept consignee's personal check when such form of payment was not originally authorized, subject to an additional charge as provided in applicable tariffs. If request is received after the shipment has been tendered for delivery and refused by consignee, the shipment will also be assessed the applicable redelivery charge as provided in carrier's tariffs, in addition to the charge for changing the form of acceptable payment. Consignor must guarantee payment of the charge for changing the form of payment and the redelivery charge, if any.

40 ITEM 520-A

EQUIPMENT
(Applicable only on Intrastate Traffic)

Sec. 1. A carrier's obligation to accept articles for shipment shall be subject to the suitability of his equipment and to requirements of ordinances or laws limiting or regulating the transportation of the property or use of equipment.

Item 110 is being amended by the addition of Section 5 (a) defining a "Prepaid Shipment" and Section 5 (b) defining a "collect shipment." These definitions were formerly shown in Item 770. Changes result from handling accorded Subject 16 of Docket 884.

Item 360, Sec. 2 (e) is being amended by deleting the words "as referred to in Item 520." This change is being made in conjunction with revisions to Item 520 as explained below. This change results from action taken on Subject 14 of Docket 884.

Item 430 is being amended to: (1) provide for the remittance of C.O.D. amounts to parties designated by the consignor as the payee; (2) elimination of specific record keeping requirements; (3) providing for payment to the payee within 15 days after delivery; and (4) cancelling the interstate application of the provisions as required by the Interstate Commerce Commission's order in I. & S. Docket No. M-29788.

Changes result from action on Subject 15 of Docket 884.

Item 520 is being amended by adding a new Section embracing wording formerly shown as Section 2 of Item 780 and, further, to cancel the interstate application of the provisions in compliance with the Interstate Commerce Commission's order in I. & S. Docket No. M-29788.

Changes result from action taken on Subject 14 of Docket 884.

Item 770 is being amended by moving Sections 1 and 2, defining "prepaid" and "collect" shipments, to Item 110. The remaining Sections of Item 770 have been renumbered and the provisions are being cancelled for interstate application in compliance with the Interstate Commerce Commission's order in I. & S. Docket No. M-29788.

Changes result from handling accorded Subject 16 of Docket 884.

Item 780 is being amended by cancelling the entire rule for interstate application. Current Section 1 (b) would be retained for intrastate application. The provisions of Section 2 have been reestablished in revised Item 520 for intrastate application as explained above.

Changes result from handling accorded Subject 17 of Docket 884.

New item 13750 is added to the Aluminum Group for "Tape, aluminum foil, adhesive coated, combined or not combined with other materials, in boxes," with classes of 70 LTL, 40 TL and 36 M. These commodities were previously classified by analogy under item 71700, "Aluminum Foil or Foil Wrappers," or, when used for insulating purposes, under item 49680, "Cloth or Tape, insulating, NOI." Aluminum foil tape exhibits a density from 10.2 to 70.9 pcf, with an average of 36.98 pcf. The value per pound ranges from \$1.17 to over \$9.00. It is shipped in fibreboard boxes which may require top or bottom loading, depending on the size and weight of the box.

This addition is the result of action taken on Docket 884, Subject 3.

Note, item 34732 having application on item 34730, "Flooring, elevated, disassembled," is amended to read: "Applies only on flooring consisting of the following components: metal pedestals; metal stringers; metal, wood or particleboard flooring panels, with or without surface covering of same or other materials; and the necessary fittings or fastenings required for installation." This amendment would allow the application of item 34730 to commodities currently moving by analogy under this provision.

These changes are a result of action taken on Docket 884, Subject 12.

Item 40580 - See justification for Package 2440.

Item 49987, applying on "Coins, metal," is amended to make reference to new Note, item 49988, explained below.

Note, item 49988, is being added to clarify the application of item 49987.

Changes result from action taken on Subject 18 of Docket 884.

Item 53120, commercial cooling or freezing rooms, has been amended to establish two subprovisions based on density. Sub 1 provides for those products having a density less than 9 pcf at class 110 AQ and Sub 2 provides for those products having a density 9 pcf or greater at class 100 AQ. The former subprovision based on the form of shipment of these products were not representative of the transportation characteristics of the products, as the density range for units shipped MD flat overlapped the density range for units shipped SU.

This change is the result of action taken on Docket 883, Subject 5.

Item 55140, covering "Currency, other than coins; Bank Bills; or Notes," established to provide for articles formerly prohibited by Section 1 (a) of Item 780. The "O" classes indicates these articles will be subject to the rates and regulations of individual carriers.

Changes result from action taken on Subject 18 of Docket 884.

Item 56310 covering "Deeds or Valuable Papers, other than old office records" being added to the description of articles. These commodities were formerly prohibited under Sec. 1 (a) of Item 780 which is being amended as explained elsewhere. The "O" class indicates articles embraced by item 56310 will be subject to the rates and regulations of individual carriers.

Changes result from action taken on Subject 18 of Docket 884.

Item 56710, "Drapes, Sheets, Pillowcases, Gowns, Towels, Washcloths; or Surgical or Obstetrical Procedure Packs," is amended by removing Surgical or Obstetrical Procedure Packs and establishing new item 56834. Additionally, item 56710 is amended by the addition of the verbiage, "patient examination," to the noun Gowns for clarification of original intent.

New item 56834, naming "Surgical or Obstetrical Procedure Packs," is established to remove controversy as to its interpretation when grouped with item 56710.

All classes and minimum weights are retained resulting in no change in existing published classes. These changes result from Subject 2, Docket 884.

Item 59320 - See justification for Package 2440.

Item 59420 - See justification for Package 2440.

Item 60000 - See justification for Package 2440.

Item 153080, "Excelsior, paper (Shredded Paper), in packages," is cancelled with reference to item 63760, "Excelsior, cellulose film," in the interest of tariff clarification and simplification. Concurrently, item 63760 is amended to read, "Excelsior, cellulose film or paper (Shredded Paper), in packages, subject to Item 170 and having a density in pounds per cubic foot of:" with the addition of the following new subprovisions: (1) "Less than 1," at class 400 AQ; (2) "1 but less than 2," at class 300 AQ; (3) "2 but less than 4," at class 250 AQ; (4) "4 but less than 6," at class 150 LTL, 100 TL and 12 MW; (5) "6 but less than 8," at class 125 LTL, 85 TL and 15 MW; (6) "8 but less than 10," at class 100 LTL, 70 TL and 18 MW; (7) "10 but less than 12," at class 92 1/2 LTL, 65 TL and 20 MW; (8) "12 but less than 15," at class 85 LTL, 55 TL and 26 MW and (9) "15 or greater," at class 70 LTL, 40 TL and 36 MW. A new Note, item 63761 is also added to each subprovision to allow shipments to be "bumped" to the next lower class if such is to the shipper's advantage.

These changes are reflective of densities ranging from 2.88 to 19.2 pcf for cellulose film excelsior, and from 2.7 to 22.0 for paper excelsior. The average density for cellulose film excelsior was 9.01 pcf while paper excelsior averaged 11.15 pcf. The changes are also reflective of the average nature of their stowing, handling, and liability characteristics.

These changes are the result of action on Docket 884, Subject 4.

Item 63825, covering "Exhibits, museum, or Articles of Antiquity," is added to provide for articles formerly prohibited under Item 780 which is being amended as explained elsewhere. The "O" class indicates that these articles will be subject to the rates and regulations of individual carriers.

Note, item 63826 is added to clarify the application of Item 63825.
Changes result from handling accorded Subject 18 of Docket 884.

Item 69050, naming "Filters, air (Air Filter Elements), other than compressed air and other than air compressor or internal combustion engine air filtering devices or elements, in boxes or crates" is amended to reference a new note. Concurrently a new note is added to read: "will not apply on commercial laundry lint collectors or filters as named in item 124010." This addition is in the interest of tariff clarification.

These changes are a result of action taken on Docket 884, Subject 7.

Item 74150, applicable to "Mustard, ground, or Mustard Meal" is amended to include "Mustard Flour and Mustard Bran" which are other products of ground mustard seed and have similar transportation characteristics to ground mustard. This change is in the interest of tariff clarification.

Item 173490, applying on "Mustard Seed," is amended to remove the restriction "other than wild" in the interest of tariff clarification due to the cancellation of item 173510 as explained below. The LTL class is changed from 70 to 65 to better reflect a density of 30.2 pounds per cubic foot and a value of 12.5¢ per pound.

Item 173510 applying on "Mustard Seed, wild," is cancelled in the interest of tariff clarification to remove obsolete provisions.

These changes are the result of Docket 884, Subject 11.

Item 79470, applying on coin-operated hair dryers and chairs combined, is cancelled as obsolete. The Note, item 79472, is also cancelled as it has no further application. Information on file indicates that these products are no longer being manufactured or shipped.

These changes are the result of action taken on Docket 884, Subject 5.

Item 107837, covering "Jewelry, other than costume or novelty; or Precious Stones," is added to provide for articles formerly prohibited under Section 1 (a) of Item 780. The "O" classes indicates articles will be subject to the rates and regulations of individual carriers.

Changes result from handling accorded Subject 18 of Docket 884.

Item 111160, covering "Letters, with or without stamps affixed," is added to provide for articles formerly prohibited under Section 1 (a) of Item 780. The "O" classes indicates articles will be subject to the rates and regulations of individual carriers.

New Note, item 111161, is added to clarify the application of item 111160.
Changes result from handling accorded Subject 18 of Docket 884.

Item 146920, covering "Original Works of Art, etc.," is added to provide for articles formerly prohibited under Section 1 (a) of Item 780. The "O" classes indicates that articles will be subject to the rates and regulations of individual carriers.

Changes result from handling accorded Subject 18 of Docket 884.

Item 153080 - See justification for item 63760.

Item 161895, covering "Stamps, postage," is added to provide for articles formerly prohibited under Section 1 (a) of Item 780. The "O" classes indicates that the articles will be subject to the rates and regulations of individual carriers.

Changes result from handling accorded Subject 18 of Docket 884.

Item 161897, covering "Stamps, revenue or tax," is added to provide for articles formerly prohibited by Section 1 (a) of item 780. The "O" classes indicates that the articles will be subject to the rates and regulations of individual carriers.

Note, item 161898, is being added to clarify the application of item 161897, explained above.
Changes result from handling accorded Subject 18 of Docket 884.

Item 164160 is amended to read "Racks: Desk Top, letter, document, catalog or book organizing, distributing or sorting, in boxes" with 5 new subs for wire racks.

Sub 2 reads "Wire: SU, not nested nor interlaced" with classes of 200 Any Quantity. These racks are packaged in fibreboard boxes and have no unusual handling or stowability characteristics. The density is 4.32 pounds per cubic foot.

Sub 3 reads "Wire: SU, nested, less than 12 units per nest" with classes of 125 Less Than Truckload (LTL), 100 Truckload (TL), with a Minimum Weight of 12,000 lbs. These racks are packaged in fibreboard boxes and have no unusual handling or stowability characteristics. The density averages 6.07 pcf with a range of 4.38 to 7.43 pcf.

Sub 4 reads "SU, nested, 12 units or more per nest" with classes of 70 LTL, 40 TL, 30,000 MW. These racks are packaged in fibreboard boxes and have no unusual handling or stowability characteristics. The density ranges from 11.76 to 45.17 pcf with an average of 24.30 pcf.

Sub 5 reads "SU, 2 units interlaced" with classes of 85 LTL, 50 TL, 24 MW. These racks are packaged in fibreboard boxes and have no unusual handling or stowability characteristics. The density is 13.38 pcf.

This is the result of Docket 884 Subject 9.

Item 173490 - See justification for item 74150.

Item 173510 - See justification for item 74150.

Item 175880, "Signals, road traffic, light flashing," is amended by the addition of the term "NOI," with no change in the applicable classes. Additionally, Sub 2, naming "KD" is amended to provide the minimum packaging requirement of "in boxes." Concurrently, new item 175885 is established naming "Signals, road traffic, light flashing; trailer mounted, in packages, see Note, item 175886; or plastic, with or without components of other materials, in boxes; subject to Item 170 and having a density in pounds per cubic foot of," with sub provisions as follows: (1) "Less than 1," at class 400 AQ; (2) "1 but less than 2," at class 300 AQ; (3) "2 but less than 4," at class 250 AQ; (4) "4 but less than 6," at class 150 LTL, 100 TL and 12 MW; (5) "6 but less than 8," at class 125 LTL, 85 TL and 15 MW; (6) "8 but less than 10," at class 100 LTL, 70 TL and 18 MW; (7) "10 but less than 12," at class 92 1/2 LTL, 65 TL and 20 MW; (8) "12 but less than 15," at class 85 LTL, 55 TL and 26 MW and (9) "15 or greater," at class 70 LTL, 40 TL and 36 MW. A new Note, item 175887 is also added to each subprovision to allow shipments to be "bumped" to the next lower class if such is to the shipper's advantage.

The new item reflects the wide range of shapes and sizes of these products and their corresponding densities, in addition to densities ranging from 2.85 to 8.18 pcf for trailer mounted signals and 3.12 to 3.61 pcf for plastic signals. The average density for trailer mounted signals was 5.16 pcf while plastic signals averaged 3.31 pcf. The variances in the handling, stowing and liability characteristics are also reflected in the new item.

These changes are the result of action on Docket 884, Subject 1.

Item 181170, having application on fuel tanks, is revised to read "Tanks, Fuel, outboard marine engine or internal combustion engine, other than automobile" in the interest of tariff clarification to better indicate the intent of the application of this item to tanks for outboard marine engines. This change is the result of Docket 884, Subject 8.

Item 182370, having application to "Brick Facing, mounted on expanded plastic, in packages, having a density in pounds per cubic foot of 15 or greater," is added to the Classification to specifically provide for this commodity. Classes of 70 LTL, 40 TL, Minimum Weight 36,000 pounds are assigned, reflective of a density of 16.64 pounds per cubic foot. This addition is the result of Docket 884, Subject 6.

Package 2380, authorized for the shipment of coffee when packed in 1 pound bags, has been amended allow for an alternate method of applying the plastic film as a wrapper to the tray and contents. The Panel's decision was based upon the favorable experience of other film-tray packages which use the same wrapping concept of adhering the film to the tray sidewall.

Action was taken following the Panel's disposition of Docket 884, Subject 19.

The reference to Package 2440 has been removed from item 60000, toilet preparations released by value not exceeding 170 cents per pound, in the interest of tariff clarification. Concurrently, items 48580, cleaning, scouring or washing compounds, NOI, 59320, shampoo or conditioners, hair, and 59420, toilet preparations, NOI, have been amended to reference Package 2440 as an authorized package. Package 2440 describes an octagonal corrugated fibreboard bulk liquid container with a polyethylene film inner liner. The items being amended to reference this package describe commodities that exhibit transportation characteristics that are similar to those of commodities for which the package is already authorized.

This change is the result of action taken on Docket 884, Subject 22.

The packages previously listed on page 2 have been cancelled as obsolete and the package references removed from the involved item descriptions as listed on page 1. These cancellations are in the interest of tariff simplification.

Action taken is the result of Docket 884, Subject 20.
