Respectfully shows:

Highway common carriers and express corporations are operating as common carriers pursuant to the authority of the Commission and in accordance with tariffs filed with this Commission; which tariffs are also subject to and governed by the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-0 and supplements thereto.

## II

An order is requested for the adoption of Supplement 6 to the National Motor Freight Classification NMF 100-0 and to make such provisions applicable to the tariffs of highway common carriers and express corporations, which participate in and are listed in its Classification under authority of power of attorney. It is further requested that such authorization be concurrent with the national effective date of October 29, 1988 on one day's notice; that all common carriers be authorized and directed to establish such changes as may be prescribed in class and commodity rates and charges in connection with the transportation of exempt commodities; that common carriers be authorized to depart from Sections 460 and 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code and appropriate long and short haul provisions of the Constitution of the State of California to the extent necessary to carry into effect such changes; that all such changes be approved and adopted for application with the various tariffs; that any related revisions in numbering, referencing or format in the various tariffs, incidental to such changes, be authorized and established; and for such other and further orders as may be deemed reasonable and proper.

## III

The governing classification is periodically revised to correct technical inadvertencies and omissions that have been discovered in the publication of prior supplements and in order to keep the publication responsive to the current conditions and needs of commerce in the transportation of property by highway carriers. The procedures available to shippers and carriers to initiate such revisions and to otherwise protect their interests are known to the Commission and to such parties. Such procedures provide parties with



"...fair and full opportunity for public hearings for determination of changes and revisions as required." (Decision 74310 dated June 25, 1968, and as revised and amended by Decision 87498 dated June 21, 1977). To properly reflect intended results following such processes, the National Motor Freight Traffic Association, Inc., Agent, has authorized revisions which are published in supplemental form set forth in Exhibit A. This supplement is scheduled to take effect October 29, 1988 unless otherwise provided therein, for application to tariffs covering areas other than California. The purpose of this filing is to obtain the authority necessary to make such provisions applicable to tariffs subject to jurisdiction of the California Public Utilities Commission and to promote the national uniformity and standardization in billing and collection practices found appropriate and desirable in the Commission's Decision 74310.



In addition, the Commission through its Executive Director, has directed that classification changes be processed under the procedure and format of General Order 109 (see letter dated June 21, 1977). This filing is made in response to such directive.

## § Package 2465

*(Add 'Package 2465' to page 809 of the classification.)*

**Unit Container**— Chipboard folding carton.

**Shipping Container**— Stretchwrapped palletized unit load of tiered layers of cartons placed in a common bottom tray, with corrugated fibreboard corner posts and top cap.

**Tray and Top Cap**— Common trays of die-cut corrugated fibreboard of 275 pound test with minimum flange height of three inches.

**Corner Posts**— Full-height scored and folded L-shaped corner posts of corrugated fibreboard testing 275 pounds, positioned and held in place within flanges of top cap and bottom tray.

**Film**— Linear low density polyethylene film of 0.9 mil thickness completely covering sides and extending sufficiently high to lock load to top cap and extending sufficiently downward to secure load to pallet.

## § Package 2466

*(Add 'Package 2466' to page 809 of the classification.)*

**Regular slotted containers (RSC)** of corrugated fibreboard having 35 pound test liners and having a minimum edge crush test (ECT) value of 39 pounds per inch.

United inches must not exceed 45 inches.

Gross weight must not exceed 45 pounds.

## § Package 142F

*(Add 'Package 142F' to page 848 of the classification.)*

**Shipping Container:** Article must be positioned in a bottom tray and capped with a top tray with vertical corner posts and pads positioned and maintained with stretch or shrink wrap plastic film.

**Trays**— Design style, common bottom tray and top cap, of corrugated fibreboard testing not less than 275 pounds having a depth of not less than four inches.

**Top and Bottom Pads**— Pads must be of a honeycomb fabricated fibreboard full-dimension sheet one inch in thickness having a  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch cellular structure.

**Corner Posts**— Full-height L-shaped honeycomb corner posts must be positioned at each vertical corner of article. Corner posts must extend four inches in each direction and be of one inch in thickness having a  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch cellular structure.

**Center Pads**— Full-height honeycomb pads eight inches in width and one inch in thickness having a  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch cellular structure must be vertically positioned at center of span at front and rear of article.

**Film Wrap**— Article and shipping container components must be girth wrapped with plastic stretch film or covered with plastic shrink film so as to provide not less than 4 mils in total thickness.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Listed below is a summary of changes being proposed in the supplement. The symbol "\*" indicates a proposed new item. Following the summary list will be found an explanation of each change or addition together with the National Classification Committee's reasons for the proposed change or addition. For simplicity the following abbreviations are utilized: LTL (Less Than Truckload); TL (Truckload); MW (Minimum Weight Factor); AQ (Any Quantity); PCF (Pounds Per Cubic Foot).

Item 38409 - See justification for item 39500.

Item 38411 - See justification for item 39500.

Item 39500, having application on "Cabinets or Racks, grain germinating or sprouting," is amended by the addition of the restriction "other than greenhouses" in the interest of tariff clarification. This amendment will avoid a conflict with new items 38409 and 62127 being added to the Classification.

Item 62127 is added to the Classification having application on "Greenhouses, NOI, indoor, portable, with electric heating element or temperature control unit and accessories or other components necessary for operation" to specifically provide for these articles. Classes of 125 LTL, 85 TL and minimum weight 15,000 are assigned reflective of an average density of 7.88 pounds per cubic foot and an average value per pound of \$2.01.

Item 38409 and accompanying Note, item 38411 are added to the Classification to provide a specific description for "Greenhouses, NOI, consisting of aluminum framing and plastic wall panels with formed interior cells, cavities or flutes, disassembled." Classes of 250 AQ are assigned reflective of densities ranging from 2.32 to 3.25 pounds per cubic foot, value ranging from \$2.05 to \$8.48 per pound and rather poor stowability and handling characteristics.

These changes and additions are the result of Docket 886, Subject 1.

Item 40295, naming "Caps or Covers, can, fibreboard with raised or standing plastic rims in boxes," is cancelled from the Classification. There are no known manufacturers or shippers of these commodities at present. The original manufacturer on file advises that it no longer produces or distributes this type of cap or cover. Therefore, item 40295 is cancelled in the interest of tariff simplification.

This action is the result of Subject 5 of Docket 886.

Item 41527, applying on "Cartridges (elements), gaseous fluid filter, etc.," is cancelled in the interest of tariff clarification to avoid conflict with the amended description contained in item 41528 as explained below.

Item 41528 is amended to apply on "Cartridges (elements), gaseous or liquid fluid filter, other than air filter cartridges, and other than for internal combustion engine or air compressor filters." Classes assigned will be dependent on density as packaged for shipment, reflective of a range in density for these products of .99 to 27.08 pounds per cubic foot. The entry will include products formerly embraced by item 41527 which have characteristics similar to products embraced by the present description in item 41528. New Note, item 41529 has also been established outlining the "bumping" provision.

These changes are the result of Docket 886, Subject 6.

Items 42315, Cereals, NOI, and 42410, Cereals, popped or puffed, have been amended to authorize shipment in new Package 2465. Package 2465 describes a stretch wrapped, palletized unit load of tiered layers of chipboard cartons placed in a tray, with corrugated corner posts and a top cap, which becomes an end-of-aisle display at the destination point. Laboratory compression and vibration tests were successfully conducted on this package prior to the issuance of a Test Shipment Permit. Successful shipping experience was obtained while cereals were shipped in Package 2465 under the provisions of Test Shipment Permit T-881-4.

These changes are the result of action taken on Subject 11 of Docket 886.

Items 46510, sodium phosphate, NOI; 72007, Note to the Foodstuffs Group; 89430, grain flour, NOI; and 171140, spices, NOI, have been amended to reference Package 2456 as an authorized package. Package 2456 describes a bag constructed of linear low density polyethylene film measuring not less than 5 inches in thickness. The net weight of products shipped in this bag cannot exceed 56 pounds. The commodities that are being amended to authorize shipment in this package are similar in the transportation environment to products that presently move in the package.

These amendments result from action taken on Docket 886, Subject 13.

New item 58890, reading "Kits, contact lens care," is added to the classification with classes of Less Than Truckload (LTL) 70, Truckload (TL) 45 and Minimum Weight (MW) 30,000 pounds. A new descriptive note, item 58891, reading "Applies on kits containing saline solution, cleaning solution, enzymatic cleaning tablets, lens cases or cups, with or without disinfecting solution, electric disinfecting units, lens lubricant or carrying pouches" is also added.

These contact lens care kits were found to have the following transportation characteristics. They are packaged for shipment in fibreboard boxes and have an average density of 16.87 pounds per cubic foot (PCF) with a range of 9.20 to 21.56 PCF. The handling and stowability characteristics were not found to be unusual. They range in value from \$1.36 to \$8.03 per pound with an average value of \$5.02 per pound. There has been no indication of a claims problem as these products have not been unusually susceptible to theft or damage.

This is the result of Docket 886, Subject 2.

New item 59410, naming "Tablets, enzymatic, contact lens cleaning, with or without vials, in boxes" is added. The classes are 250 Any Quantity.

Contact lens cleaning tablets are designed for enzymatic cleaning of soft or extended wear contact lenses. They are currently subject to item 48581, "Cleaning Compounds, NOI," with classes of Less Than Truckload (LTL) 55, Truckload (TL) 35, Minimum Weight 36,000 pounds.

The new item and classes approved for these tablets are a reflection of the following transportation characteristics. These products are packaged in fibreboarded cartons with an average density of 7.14 pounds per cubic foot (PCF) with a range of 3.36 to 15.73 PCF. Care against crushing and contamination must be taken in handling and stowing these products. Values range from \$30.00 to \$76.38 per pound, with an average value of \$50.53 per pound.

This is the result of Docket 886, Subject 2.

Item 62127 - See justification for item 39500.

Item 72007 - See justification for item 46510.

Item 74460, naming "Potatoes, shoestring or stick form, cooked or fried, other than potato chips, other than frozen," is cancelled with reference to item 72400 which reads, "Chips, Puffs, Sticks or Twists, NOI." This item is subject to density based classes.

Shoestring or stick potatoes are a snack item. The cancellation of this item will incorporate them into an item which currently applies on other snack items.

These products have the following transportation characteristics. They are packed in fibreboard boxes or Package 1000 which is a fibreboard tray with stretch wrap around it. The average density is 8.35 pounds per cubic foot with a range of 7.00 to 10.35 pcf. Due to the light weight and fragile nature of the commodity, some care must be taken in handling and stowing the commodity. The commodities are not unusually susceptible to theft and have a value of \$1.27 per pound.

This is the result of Docket 886, Subject 3.

Item 80250, steel filing cabinets, has been amended to allow shipment in new Package 142F. Package 142F describes a honeycomb corner post, top and bottom pad and tray, plastic stretch wrapped shipping container. The package was successfully tested in laboratory drop and vibration tests. Upon the successful completion of these tests, Test Shipment Permit T-878-28 was issued to conduct trial shipments of steel filing cabinets in Package 142F. Based on the favorable shipping experience accumulated while shipping under the provisions of this Test Shipment Permit, Package 142F has been approved for the shipment of steel filing cabinets.

These amendments result from action taken on Docket 886, Subject 10.

Item 89430 - See justification for item 46510.

Item 159494, naming china or earthenware toilet tanks, has been amended to reference new Package 2466 as an authorized method of shipment. Concurrently, new Package 2466 describing a regular slotted container having 35 pound test liners and an edge crush test of 39 pounds per inch, has been established. Based on successful laboratory testing of the proposed package, the proponent applied for and was issued a Test Shipment Permit. 367 shipments consisting of 112,689 units moved under the provisions of Test Shipment Permit T-8711-41, with no reports of damage.

These changes are the result of action taken on Docket 886, Subject 12.

Item 171140 - See justification for item 46510.

A new Note, item 187763, having application on item 187760, is established to clarify that collapsible tubes which are manufactured by laminating metal and plastic or tubes constructed of a combination of plastic and metal are not embraced by the description of item 187760. The tariff user is directed to the provisions of item 156600, Plastic Articles, other than expanded, NOI.

These amendments are the result of action taken on Subject 4 of Docket 886.

Package 2466 - See justification for item 159494.
